
PENITENTIAL ACT

All strike their breast three times



LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I Daniel 7:9–10, 13–14

As I watched: thrones were set up and the Ancient One took his throne. Make our archdiocese, parishes, homes, and hearts fruitful ground for your gift of vocations.


May our young people respond to your call with courage and zeal.




It is right and just.

And so, with the Powers of heaven, we worship you constantly on earth, and before your majesty without end we acclaim:





THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER


All kneel

Amen.


