PUBLIC WORSHIP AT ST. GERTRUDE CHURCH IN TIME OF PANDEMIC

Updated October 4, 2020

The Archbishop dispenses the faithful from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Please do not come if you feel sick. Those who are vulnerable may consider coming to a less crowded weekday Mass.

HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES

- Keep a prudent distance inside the church. Ushers will help ensure safe seating on Sundays.
- We ask that the faithful wear cloth masks for the sake of the common good. People with breathing difficulties and young children should not wear masks.
- Only friars, sisters, novices, and some staff members will be in the sanctuary and sacristy. Lectors, acolytes, and extraordinary ministers will not serve for the time being.
- Volunteers will help wipe down high-touch surfaces between Sunday Masses.

HOLY COMMUNION

- You are not obliged to receive Holy Communion at every Mass you attend. Consider making a spiritual communion, or receiving at a weekday Mass.
- The faithful who choose to receive Holy Communion will come up to the altar rail, where one or two priests will distribute the sacred host. Keep space in line, and only remove your mask at the rail.
- You may receive in the hand or on the tongue, kneeling or standing. Note: the rail is a high-contact surface.

LOVE MOTIVATES US

The Gospel reading for today refreshes our memory of the greatest commandments – love of God and love of neighbor. These commandments are the hallmark of Christian discipleship and living. Their challenge draws us out of ourselves and engages our minds, hearts, and behavior toward another. Love motivates us to be faithful and obedient to God as Father. As St. John writes, “Loving God means keeping his commandments”(1 Jn 5:3). Love motivates us to serve our neighbor through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

We need not go far to practice the works of mercy. We can begin in our own homes and in our parish. These locations of opportunity come to mind as we live through the Coronavirus pandemic. I have received messages from fellow parishioners who themselves are at a higher risk for infection. They, like the many people who are attending Mass here at St. Gertrude, have a great hunger for the Eucharist. Yet, they feel unsafe to return to Mass because of the lack of compliance for facial covering and social distancing. They are urging me to enforce the mandates currently in place for Hamilton County – mandates which the Archbishop also asks every parish to follow.

My brothers and sisters, this situation puts me in a difficult position as shepherd for every person in the parish. I am not going to engage in any debate of science or politics. Rather, my appeal once again is for everyone to practice the virtue of charity. Can we please be compliant with the current protocols so that our brothers and sisters will feel welcome to participate in the Mass with the rest of the community? In this time, we have the opportunity to embrace the higher calling of living in charity. The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament of charity which every Catholic is invited to receive. May the grace of this sacrament imbue the heart of every parishioner with that charity that seeks the good of one's neighbor – one's brother or sister in Christ.

Looking ahead to November, the parish will continue its practice of praying for the deceased in a special way throughout the month. This practice is a great act of charity. As we learn from the Catechism, “From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God”(CCC 1032). In our parish church, a special place of remembrance will be established near the Rosary altar. Large candles will be available for purchase upon which may be written the name(s) of the deceased. These candles may be purchased through the parish office or at the sacristy door (if someone is available). There will also be a Book

of Remembrance into which may be written the names of the deceased. Our parish patroness, St. Gertrude the Great, had a particular practice of praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Here is the prayer:

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

GARDEN CLUB UPDATE

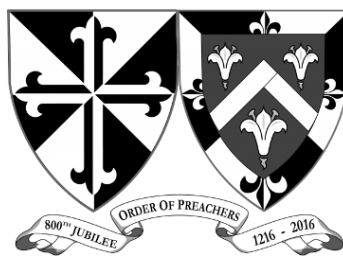

The following are especially needed during this time:

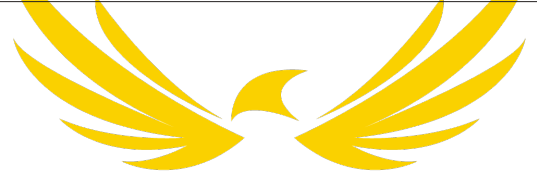

PRIORITIES AT THE POLLS

As Catholics approach the polls, we are asked to weigh many important issues. The U.S. bishops have reaffirmed that “the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.”¹ While they did warn us not to “dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty, and the death penalty,” they did give priority to upholding and defending our brothers’ and sisters’ most basic right – to live.

Abortion tragically ends someone’s life when he or she is most vulnerable and most in need of loving protection. Abortion is an intrinsic evil, meaning that it is never permitted or morally justified, regardless of individual circumstances or intentions. The personal and societal consequences of attacks against human life, whether at its earliest stages or at its final stages, are all the more serious because most often they are “carried out in the very heart of and with the complicity of the family—the family which by its nature is called to be the ‘sanctuary of life.’”² This is the place where a person should be *most* loved, cherished, and protected.



Catholics are called to defend human life wherever it is threatened and stand up for human dignity wherever it is violated. The enormous number of human lives destroyed by abortion is one factor that elevates its

importance. The most recent available data indicates over 2,000 children per day die from abortion in the United States. Since abortion was legalized in 1973, over 61 million children have been killed – and untold numbers of women and men suffer in the aftermath.

The tragedy of abortion is also distinct in that it is currently legal to directly and intentionally take the life of an innocent human being. Current laws in our country fail to protect the lives of unborn children. Our highest Court does not recognize children in their mothers’ wombs as persons and claims that abortion is a constitutional right. Further, many political leaders work actively to increase access to abortion. Some falsely describe it as health care and even as a basic human right.

People of good will must boldly stand up against this intrinsic evil, especially when it is occurring on a massive scale, implemented in law and funded, in some instances, by the government. As believers and citizens inspired by the Gospel and guided by the shepherds of our Church, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that unborn children are fully recognized and protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in embracing life.
