ST. GERTRUDE CHURCH AND SCHOOL STRATEGIC PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

As St. Gertrude Church and School continue to assess the present and plan for the future, we are pleased to announce that we are entering into a strategic planning process over the next eight

months. Working with us will be the Institute of School and Parish Development (ISPD), a national Catholic consulting firm that works with Catholic churches, schools and (arch)dioceses throughout the country in strategic planning, parish assessment, enrollment management, and resource development. They have worked with St. Gertrude in the past, facilitating past planning efforts as well as capital campaigns.

As church and school leaders and ISPD begin the process in 2022-2023, there are key steps that have been and will be taken.

- 1. An executive committee, made up of church and school leaders, is already in place. This EC will be responsible for making final decisions and assuring the steps in the process are communicated.
- ISPD has conducted an initial assessment. Through the gathering of materials, getting binder questions answered, and conducting personal interviews, ISPD has identified those areas of our church and school that are impressive, those areas that need improvement, and those areas that we can begin to immediately work to improve.
- 3. ISPD facilitated a church- and school-wide survey that everyone was invited to take. Along with the ISPD assessment, results of the survey will help in identifying areas of commendation and recommendation.
- A communication process is being put in place to make sure that church and school families are kept informed and notified as to how they may become involved.
- A core team of 15 to 18 representative leaders will be formed to serve as the "steering wheel" of the process.
- 6. Educational sessions will be conducted with church and school leaders in regard to overall church and school development and collaboration opportunities. These educational sessions will be based upon the textbooks and workbooks that ISPD has written for Catholic schools and churches.
- Based upon the ISPD initial assessment, the online survey, and discussions with the executive committee and core team, 8 to 10 challenges will be created in the areas of church and school operational vitality.
- A development advisory committee of 60 to 80 people will be formed in order to solve the challenges that have been created. They will work together over three to four workshops.

- 9. A church- and school-wide convocation will be held, in which all parishioners and all school families will be invited in order to offer their solutions to the challenges that surface in the planning
- 10. Based upon the input, ISPD and the executive committee will create the Church and School Strategic Plan of Action for St. Gertrude.
- 11. Communication of the results and priorities of the strategic plan will be presented to the church and school.
- 12. Implementation will begin immediately after the final plan is presented with—hopefully—much involvement from parishioners, parents, staff, school alumni, and friends.

The focus of this process will be built around the theme of personally inviting and engaging people every step of the way. We invite all

staff, parishioners, parents, and friends to pray for the success of this effort.

We look forward to an exciting process—one that will advance St. Gertrude Church and School, build our community, and bring all of us closer as we continue to build God's kingdom.

Since 2004, St. Gertrude Church has offered an Advent wreath making event on the first Sunday of Advent. This has become a cherished tradition for many families, like the Cordier family. For 16 years, the Cordiers have come to St. Gertrude together to make their Advent wreath. St. Gertrude Bulletin chatted with Ann Cordier about her family's experience and how the Advent wreath helps them prepare for Christmas.



St. Gertrude Bulletin: Why did you decide to attend the Advent wreath making event the first time, and what keeps you going back each year?

Ann Cordier: In 2005, a friend invited us to attend the Advent wreath making event. At the time, our children were seven, five, three, and one (and one who

wasn't born yet). All six of us, Andy (my husband) included, came to the event and created the wreath together. Everyone was allowed to give input on the design. We really enjoyed the time together as a family and the fellowship with other parishioners. This has become a treasured tradition.

SGB: Once you get the Advent wreath home, how does it help you prepare for Christmas?

Ann: Since the Advent wreath is the only Christmassy item in the house until the third or fourth week of Advent, the anticipation of Christmas is embodied in the wreath. The aroma of the fresh greens fill the house, further enhancing this period of preparation. Every evening during Advent, we light the appropriate candles and pray together. On Christmas Eve, we place a red pillar candle in the center of the Advent wreath and light it in anticipation of Christ's birth. Christmas Eve is the last time we light the purple and pink Advent candles. On Christmas Day and after, we light the red pillar candle.



SGB: That's beautiful! Tell us more about why you don't put up any Christmas decorations until the third or fourth week of Advent. Ann: We wait to put out Christmas decorations, including the tree, because it seems to us that our society celebrates Christmas beginning at Thanksgiving and that the season of Advent is ignored. We think it's important to wait to celebrate Christmas until Christmas actually arrives. Andy and I wanted to teach our kids that Advent is a season separate from Christmas, and we decided that waiting to decorate was a tangible way to illustrate this.

When the kids were little, we also had one more decoration for Advent: an Advent paper chain. On the links of the chain, we wrote good deeds, sacrifices, or prayers for the children to do each day. The links of the chain became the "straw" for baby Jesus' crib on Christmas morning. We also usually have just one candle burning in the window as a sign of expectation during Advent.

SGB: Will you all be at the event this year, making it 17 years in a row?

Ann: Yes! Our kids are now 24, 22, 20, 18, and 15, and we will all be there! We are very much looking forward to it.

ASK A PRIEST -SACRED IMAGES

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P.

Q: Why do we have pictures of Jesus? **A:** As Catholics, we have pictures of Jesus to aid us in our worship. The beauty of the pictures lifts up our minds and hearts. Pictures teach us about Christ, help us think about him, and remind us to pray

to him. The Church has used pictures in this way from the very beginning. In fact, if you visit the Yale Art Gallery in New Haven, Connecticut, you can find Christian paintings from the 200s AD. The paintings are from the Dura-Europos house church, the oldest surviving house church we know of. The paintings include the Good Shepherd, healing of the paralytic, and Peter walking on water.

Sometimes people misunderstand our use of pictures of Jesus and the saints. They might think it breaks the First Commandment, which forbids idolatry. It is important to note, therefore, that we do not worship the religious images themselves. Rather, we use the artwork to help us call to mind the person it represents.

In the eighth and ninth centuries AD, there was a heresy known as Iconoclasm. It thrived in the eastern portion of the Church based in Constantinople and outlawed the use of all images of Christ and the saints. When it came to Christ in particular, the iconodules, as they were known, said that an icon or painting of Christ could not adequately depict the two distinct natures of Christ and therefore would inevitably corrupt the faith of the people. Foremost amongst the defenders of icons was St. John Damascene. He helped make known the distinction between worship, which is given to God alone, and veneration, which is a lesser form of honor given to other persons. A small portion of his defense of sacred images follows:

In the old days, the incorporeal and infinite God was never depicted. Now, however, when God has been seen clothed in flesh, and talking with mortals [Baruch 3:37], I make an image of the God whom I see. I do not worship matter, I worship the God of matter, who became matter for my sake, and deigned to inhabit matter, who worked out my salvation through matter. I will not cease from honoring that matter which works my salvation. I venerate it, though not as God. How could God be born out of lifeless things? And if God's body is God by its union with him, it is changeless. The nature of God remains the same as before, the flesh created in time is brought to life by a logical and reasoning soul.

I honor all matter, and venerate it. Through it, filled, as it were, with a divine power and grace, my salvation has come to me. Was the three-times happy and blessed wood of the Cross not matter? Was the sacred and holy mountain of Calvary not matter?... And before all these things, is not the body and blood of our Lord matter? Either stop venerating all these things, or submit to the tradition of the Church in the venerating of images, honoring God and his

friends, and following in this the grace of the Holy Spirit. Do not despise matter, for it is not despicable. Nothing that God has made is. Only that which does not come from God is despicable — our own invention, the spontaneous decision to disregard the law of human nature, i.e., sin.

If you dishonor and reject images because they are produced by matter, consider what the Scripture says: "The Lord said to Moses, 'I have called Bezelel of Judah, and filled him with the Spirit of God, with wisdom, understanding and knowledge of many crafts, to make artifacts from gold, silver, brass, marble, precious stones, and various kinds wood" [Ex 31:1-5]. . . . Israel of old did not see God, but we see the Lord's glory face to face [2 Cor 3:18]. God ordered twelve stones to be taken out of the River Jordan, and explained why. "When your son asks you the meaning of these stones, tell him how the water left the Jordan by God's command, and how the ark of the covenant was saved along with all the people" [Jos 4:21-22]. So how can we not record in images the saving pains and miracles of Christ our Lord, so that when my child asks me, "What is this?" I may say, "That God the Word became man, and that for His sake not Israel alone passed through the Jordan, but the whole human race regained their original happiness. Through him human nature rose from the lowest depths of the earth higher than the skies, and in his Person sat down on the throne his Father had prepared for him."


