FINANCIAL REPORT

Today, I am pleased to present a summary financial report for the last fiscal year ending June 30, 2021. The first words must be that of gratitude. Thank you to all the parishioners and friends of the parish who financially supported the parish and school through a most uncertain

year. Such generosity clearly indicates trust in God and love for the parish. There is a commitment to the life and mission of the parish that motivates consistent and sacrificial giving. Thank you, again, for your personal stewardship of the financial blessings God has given you and supporting the parish.

A significant factor of influence on the parish budget and financial report is the pandemic. While this is a wearying theme, it is a reality. Some factors include:

- limits on Mass attendance, which impacted regular offertory
- the withdrawal of 50+ students from the school that reduced tuition income,
- canceled or modified in-person programming in evangelization that reduced both income and expenses,
- changes in parish and school staffing that reduced expenses,
- the pandemic relief fundraising effort for the school that raised over \$200,000,
- the Giving Tuesday "Crush the COVID Deficit" effort that raised over \$130,000, and
- the extraordinary, unexpected, non-offertory giving of some parishioners in excess of \$375,000.

Additionally, government programs and grants helped to offset school expenses related to the pandemic response.

The budget for the new, current fiscal year reflects conservative goals for offerings and modest increases in expenses guided by our mission. The parish continues to revitalize its life and mission to have a direct impact on personal and family life. The parish school is an important apostolate of the parish, and ongoing improvements in instruction, supporting staff, and learning tools deserve support. Buildings and grounds need attention to support and sustain the wide range of programming the parish offers. Special efforts will be forthcoming to enhance and improve programming beyond the budgeted forecast.

Members of the parish Finance Council meet quarterly and review the financial statements of the parish. They offer their expertise so that the parish can make good and proper use of the financial resources entrusted to it. I am grateful to them for their wisdom and care for the viability of the parish.

The current fiscal year is off to a good start. Together, we can continue to live and grow as a parish that God has summoned together to pray and worship, grow in faith, form in truth, and serve in love. Thank you for your support and participation in the mission of the parish.



MEET OUR VOLUNTEERS: JANA WIDMEYER

For the next several months, the St. Gertrude bulletin will feature an interview with one of our dedicated volunteers. This month, we're highlighting Jana Widmeyer, one of our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd catechists.

Could you explain how you became involved with Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)? Why were you drawn to this ministry?

I became acquainted with the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd when my children started preschool at Queen of Angels Montessori (now The Good Shepherd Catholic Montessori). I still remember my three-year-old son coming home from school and saying, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." (That Scripture is presented to the children during Advent.) When training for Level 1 of CGS was offered, I signed up and fell in love with the faith all over again. After that, I continued to receive certification in all three levels of CGS.

What is the role of the catechist during a CGS session in the atrium?

The role of the catechist is to present a lesson and then let the Holy Spirit take over. The goal is to help the child experience the love that God has for them and how he shows that love through the gifts he gives us, culminating in the gift of his son, Jesus.

Can you share any specific experiences or memories of children coming to know Christ and experiencing his love through CGS?

In the twelve years I've been in the atrium, I've seen children grow in their understanding of the Eucharist and even lead their parents to a deeper relationship with Jesus. During the Easter Season, we focus on the Resurrection accounts and one of the Scriptures about Thomas. In the account of Thomas, Jesus says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." When I ask the children who Jesus could be talking about, they always joyfully answer, "us!"

Please tell us a little bit about your family and what you enjoy doing in your free time.

My husband, Mike, and I were married at St. Gertrude Church twenty-two years ago and have been blessed with two children. Mike actually grew up in this parish, and he and his seven siblings attended St. Gertrude School. We live in Madeira and can walk to church. It doesn't get better than that!



FROM THE DIARY OF ST. MARIA FAUSTINA KOWALSKA



I saw my Guardian Angel, who ordered me to follow him. In a moment I was in a misty place full of fire in which there was a great crowd of suffering souls. They were praying fervently, but to no avail, for themselves; only we can come to their aid... I asked these souls what their greatest suffering was. They answered me in one

voice that their greatest torment was longing for God. I saw Our Lady visiting the souls in Purgatory. The souls call her "The Star of the Sea." She brings them refreshment... I heard an interior voice which said, **My mercy does not want this, but justice demands it.** Since that time, I am in closer communion with the suffering souls. (*Diary, #20*)



ASK A PRIEST— INDULGENCES AND PRAYING FOR THE DEAD

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO

Q: I heard your homily about indulgences and praying at cemeteries last weekend. Would you please lay out once more the basic rationale and guidelines?

A: Each year at St. Gertrude, in union with Catholics throughout the world, we devote November to the offering of prayers for the dead. It's one of those works of mercy that makes us more like our heavenly Father. We do this by praying for the deceased during Mass, offering prayers such as the rosary throughout the week, and visiting cemeteries. These practices have roots in the earliest days of the Church, and they certainly have their basis in both Scripture and Tradition. Praying for the dead is also connected with the practice of indulgences, so it's appropriate that we consider them side by side.

Our custom of offering prayers for the dead at Mass goes back to the first centuries of Christianity. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (313-386) explained the practice that we continue today when mentioning our deceased brothers and sisters during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass: "[We pray] then also for our deceased holy fathers and bishops and collectively for all who lived their lives among us. For we believe that this will be of great help to those souls for whom we pray while the holy and majestic victim lies in our presence." The victim here is Jesus, represented in an unbloody, sacramental way at each Mass. Jesus has made expiation for all the sins of mankind, and he wishes to share the fruits of his saving death and resurrection with all the members of his Church. He then empowered the Church to share God's forgiveness and healing with every human being who is impacted by sin and its effects.²

Pope St. Paul VI's teaching on indulgences can help us understand how praying for the dead is an expression of our faith in Jesus' work of redemption and the spiritual gifts he shares with his Church. The pope explained that "indulgence' is the name proper to . . . remission of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven as to their culpable element." Christ not only gained for us the possibility of forgiveness from the guilt due to sin but also left a treasury of graces that help us heal from sin's effects. Individuals and societies are "stained" by sin and have to deal with sin's consequences over time. It is no different for the members of the Church, living or deceased: the "merits" of Christ and his saints are meant to benefit all who join the Church through Baptism. Here we find forgiveness and purification. Even after being forgiven, the "blemishes" of sin are gradually erased as we

submit to the fire of God's healing love. Purgatory is available and necessary for all the faithful who have died without full purification from past, already forgiven, sins.

So which indulgences are especially recommended during the month of November? *The Handbook of Indulgences* lists visiting a cemetery especially between November 1-8 to pray for the dead. **This year, the Church has once again extended a plenary indulgence to all the faithful who do this on any day during the month of November**. The conditions, as usual, include personal detachment from all sin, sacramental Communion and confession, and prayers for the intentions of the pope.⁴ Here, the Church is rewarding Catholics for taking up a practice that, by its nature, helps us to grow in love of God and neighbor. Alongside the Mass and sacraments, this is a concrete opportunity to be further purified by the blood of Christ and the prayers of the saints—for ourselves and for the faithful departed for whom we intend to pray.


