PARISH UPDATES PART II

Over the past couple of weeks, I shared about the upcoming Called & Gifted Workshop this spring, where we are at in the sound system project, and a recap of the Gala proceeds and what work would be happening with those funds. This week, there are two other important updates I would like to share with our parish community.

PARISH GROWTH

Earlier this week, I looked at two metrics of parish growthnamely new parish registrations and total Sunday Mass attendanceand crunched the numbers going back the last year and a half. During the 18-month period from July 1, 2022, to December 31, 2023, our parish registered 176 new households, totaling 518 new parishioners! In an era where most Catholic parishes across the country are shrinking and often merging with other parishes due to declining numbers, our numbers here at St. Gertrude Parish are quite extraordinary. The other metric I looked at is a very basic one: How many people are in the pews each Sunday? I am pretty sure that, anecdotally based on how full the pews (and parking lot) have been, most would guess our numbers are up. And the data backs that up. Back in July 2022, Sunday Mass attendance averaged around 1,575 people. By December of this past year, that number had jumped to an average of 1,850 people ... a growth of roughly 17 percent. This period of parish growth we are in is a blessing from God. It is also a reason for us to discern together what God might be asking of us in the future; "to whom much has been given, much will be expected" (cf. Luke 12:48). Let us also be sure to welcome our newest parish members with open arms and do our best to get to know each and every one of them.

STRATEGIC PLAN

One weekend this past fall at all of the parish Masses, Sister Mary Agnes and I spoke about our plans for the year ahead. We had recently received the full report that resulted from our strategic planning process. At the time we shared that, we had the parish centennial in November and many events in the fall leading up to it, so we planned to put the strategic planning process "on hold" for the fall semester and return to it in the first part of 2024. We also shared that, though there would be nothing "visible" happening regarding the plan during the fall, we would be doing some work on the backside (so to speak) helping to prepare for what was ahead.

When we first looked at the strategic planning report, one thing that was immediately obvious was that there were a *lot* of ideas contained in it. Quite literally dozens and dozens of suggestions for addressing the various needs of our parish . . . far too many to implement all of them or even a majority of them. So in such a situation, how does one decide which of all of these good ideas are the highest priority to implement? The natural answer to that needs to be based on the needs that are the most critical and on another component: the needs that are most central to the mission of our parish and the vision of what we want to be in the future. So over the last several months, our parish leadership team (known as our "Family Leadership Team" through the Beacons of Light process) has been working to craft, from the ground up, a renewed parish mission statement as well as a vision statement about where we are going. It has taken months of work and, during the process, we incorporated feedback from various groups, including the parish pastoral council. We are confident that focusing on our mission and vision will help us to make good decisions about the implementation of aspects of the strategic plan. In the weeks ahead, we plan to share the mission and vision statements with the parish as a whole, as we will use these to guide not only the strategic plan but also every aspect of our parish life and ministry. We are super excited about this and can't wait to share this with the entire parish population in the weeks ahead.

Lent is around the corner. I hope to see everyone with "dirty foreheads" this coming Wednesday! God bless,

ASK A PRIEST— CAN A SOUL IN HELL ENTER HEAVEN?

FATHER DAVID ENDRES, PROFESSOR AT MOUNT ST. MARY'S SEMINARY & SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

Q: The Catechism defines hell as "eternal separation from God" (1035). However, it

says that at the last judgment "before [Jesus] will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate them one from another. . . And [some] will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life" (1038). If one dies before the second coming and is in hell, will he or she be re-judged when Christ returns? Is there a possibility of going to heaven at that time?

A: The permanency of heaven and hell and the impossibility of passing between them is witnessed to in Scripture. In the parable of Lazarus and the rich man in the Gospel of Luke, Lazarus is brought into heaven and the rich man is sent to the "netherworld." From his place of suffering he begs the patriarch Abraham to send Lazarus to help him. Abraham responds: "Between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours" (Luke 16: 26).

To appreciate this permanence, one must understand that there are two judgments: the particular judgment and the universal judgment. The universal judgment will occur at the end of time what is also called the second coming" or the Parousia (from the Greek for "coming" or "arrival"). Those who die prior to the universal judgment will be judged at the time of their deaths (particular judgment). The soul that is judged will either be taken into God's presence (heaven), removed from the divine presence (hell), or will experience a temporary state of purification (purgatory).

At the time of the second coming, those who are alive will also be judged. For those already judged, the general judgment will serve as a confirmation of the particular judgment. However, there is one significant difference between the two. Whereas at the particular judgment, only the soul comes before God, at the general judgment, soul and body will be reunited and judged. This "resurrection of the flesh" is difficult to understand and has been intensely debated by theologians. It is professed in the Apostles' and Nicene-Constantinopolitan creeds. In the Apostles' Creed, we affirm, "I believe in . . . the resurrection of the body." In the Nicene Creed, we say, "We look for the resurrection of the dead." In both cases, our belief in the union of soul and body is in reference to the general judgment.

While in this world, before we die, we have the opportunity for second chances and can rely on the mercy of God. At the time of our judgments, God's perfect justice will separate those souls that will experience life eternal with God and those that will not. For those already judged, a new verdict will not be possible at the general judgment. At Christ's second coming, the time of purification of souls (purgatory) will be concluded and souls will experience either union with or separation from the divine.

As we live out our Christian lives, we should not focus on whether Christ's second coming is near and which judgment we will

experience, but instead seek God in such a way as to be prepared to meet Him face to face whenever we are called into His presence. We can pray along with the early Church, "Maranatha!" (Come, Lord Jesus!), awaiting the end of the Church's pilgrimage on earth and our hoped for entry into eternal life.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

According to the United States **Conference of Catholic Bishops** (USCCB), Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
