#### **EASTER NOTES**

As we progress through the Lenten season, it is time to look ahead to the schedule for Holy Week and Easter. The ongoing pandemic and the protocols to be followed require that we prepare with adequate time. The guidance provided

from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati includes some special permissions for this year only (and is subject to clarification or revision should any specific guidance for 2021 be received from the USCCB or Rome). Permission is granted this year for a second Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday; and a second Celebration of the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday. These permissions are granted for the legitimate pastoral need of providing seating capacity while maintaining social distancing.

Additionally, some of the Masses and liturgies will be celebrated in accord with optional rubrics provided by the Church in the Roman Missal. Most notable will be the Adoration of the Cross on Good Friday when the entire assembly will adore the Cross in silence while remaining in place. Other options will be followed that provide for a safe celebration for everyone. Please note, again, that these options are provided by the Church as worthy and legitimate in any year, not just in a time of public health concern.

We have the blessing here at St. Gertrude that many people have returned to church for Mass and the Sacraments. Our Masses are well-attended, and we have been able to accommodate everyone with an "overflow" Mass in the gym. The experience of previous years is a reminder that even more people participate in the Masses and liturgies of Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday. Following recommendations from the Archdiocese, there will be an advance reservation requirement for all these Masses and liturgies to gauge and regulate capacity. Overall, the reservation system worked very well at Christmas; and we can take that experience as guidance and use the system for Easter. We plan to use this system only when necessary, i.e. Holy Thursday, Good Friday (afternoon services only), the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday. The reservation system will be available on March 15, starting at 12:00 noon and will remain open through 11:59 p.m. on March 24. Masses on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday will follow the regular Sunday schedule with overflow Masses in the gym as needed. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 5:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be celebrated at 12:00 noon and 3:00 p.m, and outdoor Stations of the Cross at 7:30 p.m. The Easter Vigil will begin at 9:00 p.m.

Please note that no additional times are scheduled for sacramental Confession, except during the St. Joseph Triduum (March 17-19). We will maintain the regular Confession schedule through Wednesday of Holy Week. No Confessions during the Sacred Triduum and Easter Sunday. The regular schedule will resume on Easter Monday.

In the midst of options and reservations, we are celebrating moments of grace. These liturgies are the memorial of the events of our redemption and salvation. Trusting in the Lord's presence and action, these celebrations can fill us with joy, hope, and gratitude for the new life, freedom, and peace that we have in Jesus Christ.

## MEET THE TEAM: MICHELLE ROBERTS

Each month, the St. Gertrude Bulletin will feature an interview with a member of the Evangelization Team at the church. This month, we're highlighting Michelle Roberts, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd assistant.

## St. Gertrude Bulletin: Can you explain a bit about what you do at St. Gertrude?

Michelle: As the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Assistant, I am blessed to work with both the Church and School children from ages 3-9 years old. Here in the atrium, we continue to discover the many ways that God reveals Himself to us. I present various works such as The Kingdom of God parables and Infancy Narratives to the children. After these presentations, they have the opportunity to work silently and prayerfully. Also, loving music as much as I do, we also sing in the Atrium, hand motions are a must!

#### SGB: Had you always planned on doing ministry?

Michelle: I grew up in the church. I was a member of The Legion of Mary, faithfully attended Youth Group, World Youth Days, and led Music Ministry groups in college. Now that I think about it, ministry runs through my veins. After graduating from Franciscan University, my first "grown-up" job was as a Youth Minister at a parish in Lancaster, PA. From there I went on to Campus Ministry in Fort Worth, TX and then to Royal Oak, MI. I enjoyed working with teens on retreats, prayer services and liturgies. It was always such a great experience to see the youth encounter Christ. And here I am now, working with children who have a deep love for Jesus.

## SGB: How did you come to know about Catechesis of the Good Shepherd?

Michelle: My own children attend St. Gertrude School and I signed up to volunteer during their atrium time when my youngest was in the 1st grade. After some prayer, discernment (and some gentle prodding from Cindy Wurzelbacher) I completed The United States Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Formation Course. I am certified to teach both Levels 1 and 2.

# SGB: Let's switch gears and move from professional responsibilities to personal life. Were you born and raised in Cincinnati?

Michelle: I was born in 1974 in Trinidad and Tobago in the Caribbean. We moved to Mississauga, Ontario, Canada in January of 1982. ## ASK A PRIEST -EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

**Q**: Many people in the parish talk about Eucharistic Adoration. Do I have to participate in order to be a good Catholic?

A: Catholics learn to love the Eucharist. Everyone, from the Pope to the youngest child at St. Gertrude, began by learning to genuflect as a sign of adoration before the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. It is a "first step" before making one's first Holy Communion. Most Catholic Churches enjoy the privilege of housing the consecrated Host in a Tabernacle so that the Eucharistic Lord may be brought to the sick for Holy Communion or adored by the faithful outside of Mass. Substantially, this is the same Jesus Christ present under the appearances of the consecrated bread and wine who was adored by the three Magi (see Mt 2:11) and the women at the tomb (see Mt 28:8) two thousand years ago! Like the disciples who recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread on the road to Emmaus, our hearts can also burn with love and gratitude when we welcome "under our roofs" the Lord who fulfills faith's expectations (see Lk 24:13-35). Which of us would not want to experience their insight and joy through such an extraordinary

Adoration or worship of the Eucharist happens first of all at every Mass, which the Catechism calls "the center of the Church's life." Jesus designed this Memorial of His Passion and commanded His apostles to repeat it, as the Church requires of Catholics to this day. 1 Jesus' powerful words, "This is my Body...this cup...is the new covenant in my blood" (Lk 22:19) are the reason we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer and Communion Rite at Mass. It is the reason for our noble altar rail and all the other adornments in the church and sanctuary that make us feel like we have entered a great King's court. The proclamation of the "Mystery of Faith" after the consecration of the Mass cues us into the truth that the same Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who came to save the world by His death and Resurrection two thousand years ago, still lowers Himself to come to our altar several times a day so that we can experience the grace of salvation in our own bodies. What's (or who's) not to love and adore!

Eucharistic Adoration is highly encouraged outside of Mass as well, whether in the quiet of the Church before the flickering sanctuary lamp (signifying that the Tabernacle is occupied) or in a chapel dedicated to adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Shortly following the Second Vatican Council, the Sacred Congregation of Rites published an Instruction called *Eucharisticum Mysterium* that contains a profound defense of Eucharistic Adoration and how it can help Catholics better participate in the Mass. Paragraph 50 is worth close consideration:

"When the faithful adore Christ present in the sacrament, they should remember that this presence derives from the sacrifice [of the Mass] and is directed toward both sacramental and spiritual Communion.

In consequence, the devotion which leads the faithful to visit the Blessed Sacrament draws them into an ever deeper participation in the Paschal Mystery. It leads them to respond gratefully to the gift of Him who through His humanity constantly pours divine life into the members of His body. Dwelling with Christ our Lord, they enjoy His intimate friendship and pour out their hearts before Him for themselves and their dear ones, and pray for the peace and salvation of the world. They offer their entire lives with Christ to the Father in the Holy Spirit, and receive in this wonderful exchange an increase of faith, hope and charity. Thus, they nourish those right dispositions which enable them with all due devotion to celebrate the memorial of the Lord and receive frequently the bread given us by the Father."

The faithful should therefore strive to worship Christ our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, in harmony with their way of life. Pastors should exhort them to this, and set them a good example."



Eucharistic Adoration, inside as well as outside of Mass, is a foundational practice for all who wish to know and love Jesus more deeply. It will happen at

different times and intervals depending on our responsibilities and mobility. For all, it has a way of making the many aspects of one's Catholic life "click" together. It will lead to our hearts being "set on fire" with the gift Jesus came to give.

When, for serious reasons, the faithful are not able to attend Mass, the Church asks them to "devote themselves to prayer for a suitable time alone, as a family, or, as the occasion permits, in groups of families." See Code of Canon Law 1247, para 2.
