


The rosary will begin at 7 p.m. in the church, followed by Matt's talk and refreshments in the Parish Center.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN, INDEED!

On this Easter day, the entire Church rejoices in the victory of Christ over sin and death; we rejoice that he has reconciled us to his Father who is also our Father. The future for us is hopeful; the future for us promises new life in the grace of the Holy Spirit; the future for us is the gift of eternal

life in communion with God. All sadness associated with human life and sin is overcome with the power of the Lord's Resurrection. As St. Paul says in a powerful and important way: "Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as [being] dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:11). Examine your thoughts. Examine your manner of living. Ask God to help you live in the grace of the Resurrection.

So wonderful is the grace of the Resurrection and the new life we have in Christ that it demands to be shared. Knowing this, St. Paul writes: "But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach? And how can people preach unless they are sent?" (Romans 10:14-15). The liturgical readings and celebrations of the Easter season are a clear reminder that we belong to a Church that is continually on mission to bring people into a personal encounter with Jesus risen from the dead. All who come to repentance and faith, who ask for the sacrament of Baptism, have their sins forgiven and are born again into new life in the Holy Spirit. All who are baptized become an adopted son or daughter of the heavenly Father and members of the body of Christ—the Church. Lives are radically transformed and set on the narrow way of discipleship in Jesus that leads to eternal life. We who live this life know that there is no better way of living. The love of God impels us to share it with others.

Please join me in welcoming the following newly-initiated Catholics of our parish (Confirmation names are in bold). Those baptized and fully initiated are Alejandra Maria Magdalena Medina and Kayla Marie Teresa Minton. 
Through our prayers, words, and actions, we show that God

(TRYING TO) LIVE THE MISSION: DEEPER COMMUNION

I love to plan and host parties, so last fall, I proposed to a few friends that we meet on the first and third Tuesdays of the month to enjoy

snacks and drink tea while watching *The Chosen* (a crowd-funded multi-season series about the life of Christ). It was an open invitation, so those friends also invited some new acquaintances.

For Lent, this same group of friends and I decided to visit a different fish fry every Friday. Through this, we made even more acquaintances and had new opportunities to witness. We also had new opportunities to pray together as we attended Stations of the Cross. On the Friday in the fourth week of Lent, we grabbed fish dinners from a drive-through near my sister's house and dined with her family that evening. Since it was the feast of the Annunciation, we closed the night by singing "Immaculate Mary." My friends' witness greatly affected my sister and her family, refreshed by our shared meal and time of prayer and song together.

And to think that all of this started with just snacks and tea at my house, and then progressed into full fish fry meals with the greater parish community, then praying the Stations of the Cross in the church, then visiting seven churches on Holy Thursday to pray together in adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. How did we get here?! A simple invitation to a few friends to eat and drink together—and a simple invitation to our Lord to be in our midst.

We've become more than a watch party; we've become more than just acquaintances, more than just friends. We've become close friends in Christ. We have shared prayer intentions, sung together, prayed over one another, and celebrated engagements and birthdays. We have shared life. It's no accident that the same people "God chose, in advance to preach to the people and testify that [Jesus] is the one appointed by God" are the same people "who ate and drank with him after he rose" (Acts 10:40-42).

This didn't all happen overnight. It was a matter of making time every other week for us to gather and share in light refreshments, which opened us up to the possibility for more. We extended invitations to new friends and entered into new conversations. The Lord knows . . . it isn't ever just about food. It's about communion, which is something more than just being together. It's a unity that is deeper than community alone. It's a shared life that starts and ends with the source of life itself—our Lord.

This is just one story of how he has invited some friends and me into that deeper communion. How is he inviting you?



ASK A PRIEST— SUPPORTING NEW CATHOLICS

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: I'm happy that with everything happening in the world, people are still undergoing the RCIA process and joining the Catholic Church. What can I do to support our new members?

A: It's certainly a joy for the entire Church every time a child or adult is baptized, a non-Catholic Christian is received into "full communion," or a lifelong Catholic returns to the practice of the sacraments! We see our numbers increase, we imagine the potential that these candidates bring to our community, and we believe that with them our everlasting joy in God will be multiplied. Furthermore, many of us realize how important it is to support this "new growth" on the "vine" that is Christ's Mystical Body.

What can we do for our new brothers and sisters? What is important for us who have been Catholic for a while to do vis-à-vis those joining the family of faith that is St. Gertrude Catholic Church?

- **Pray**. We've been praying especially during Lent for all the catechumens and candidates preparing for entry into the Church. During Easter time, now our prayers of petition might become prayers of thanksgiving for the gift of each person's Christian calling and prayers of supplication for continued graces. Let's be marked by a spirit of gratitude and brotherly solicitude—because we're all branches on the vine, called to bear fruit (see Jn 15:1-10). This marks us as a true family of faith: As Jesus takes joy in each one of his friends, we can be joyful in them, too.
- Offer a personal greeting. At the Easter Vigil and again at the noon Easter Mass, we'll have the opportunity to pray

- alongside our newest brothers and sisters in the faith. Some parishioners have prepared greeting cards and little gifts for our new Catholics (if you still have these, please leave them at the sacristy door or parish office with a note to Fr. John Mark). Take the opportunity to extend a personal welcome to these men and women when you see them next. Ask them about their journey into the Church, and share something about your own love for God, the Catholic faith, and your parish.
- Continue to invite. This is the hard part; not because you're all shy, but because it takes intentionality (don't we all run short here sometimes)! If you perceive something in common with one of our new Catholics, or a need they might have, don't be afraid to approach them and strike up a conversation! This is a big step for each one of them, and they can't do it alone. Our eighth graders have been joyfully accompanying Kayla, our youngest catechumen, throughout this school year. We should all try to sense when the Lord is asking us to go the extra mile for a brother or sister. Our own faith in Jesus will probably grow in this exercise of fraternal charity.

St. Paul says this about all baptized members of the Church: "We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might have newness of life" (Rom 6:4). New life is beautiful. It is also delicate and dependent. We've all been "new" at life, including the Christian life. We simply shouldn't take our brothers and sisters, especially the "youngest," for granted. This Easter, let's remember that faith in Christ is never simply a private thing. Our new life is a family way of life marked by fraternal love. A strong St. Gertrude Church welcome to our new Catholics!


