A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION

ON THE BLESSINGS, JOYS, AND HEARTACHES OF THE MATERNAL VOCATION

On this Mother's Day weekend, I would like to extend my thanks, prayers, and blessings to all the women of our parish. Please note I

didn't say in that last sentence, "... to all the *moms* of the parish," but, "... to all the *women* of the parish." That was intentional. As Pope St. John Paul II beautifully taught, *every* woman has a **fundamentally maternal vocation and identity**. At every moment of their lives, women are called to this maternal vocation in some form, though the way this maternal vocation is lived out varies greatly depending upon their states in life.

To all the mothers of our parish, I pray for you as you live out your motherhood in the course of family life, and I thank you for the beautiful witness you bring to us and to the whole world. While both fathers and mothers make great sacrifices in the course of their vocations and their responsibilities in family life, there is something inherently sacrificial about the vocation of motherhood that has no parallel. From the first moment of conception, a mother's body is already sacrificing for the sake of the child within her. This sacrifice, lived initially as a purely physical phenomenon over the course of those first nine months of life, is then lived out in so many other ways over the course of the many years and decades to follow. Is there any vocation in the world other than being a mother that is so filled with joy while so linked to the cross? So whether you are a new mom celebrating Mother's Day for the first time, an "empty nester" whose children are long grown and out of the house, or anything in between, I wish you a very happy and blessed Mother's Day!

But today is not only about the "moms." I also pray today for women who are unmarried or divorced or widowed and without children, who share their maternal gifts with the rest of us in the Church through their compassion, service, and prayer. You enrich all our lives by bringing to our church community your charisms and your "feminine genius" (to use another favorite phrase from St. John Paul II). For those who are single and yet deeply desire the vocation of marriage and motherhood, I pray that the Lord might shower you with the gift of his peace as you await the further unveiling of his calling in your life.

And of course on this Mother's Day, I cannot forget the nuns and sisters of the Church, especially our dear Dominican sisters who serve in our parish school, living a unique vocation to consecrated spiritual motherhood that greatly enriches all of us in the Church. You who most perfectly represent the Church as the Bride of Christ witness to the joy that comes from drawing close to Jesus as the perfect Bridegroom and the greatest Love the world has ever known.

Finally, I extend perhaps my most powerful promise of prayers

to those who find today to be an especially difficult, trying, or even heartbreaking day. I pray for those moms who have lost babies from miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth, or early infant/child loss. I pray for those married women longing to be mothers but who have not yet been given the gift of a pregnancy. I pray for those who have recently lost their own mothers and are grieving that loss. I pray for those who grew up in difficult family situations who never got to know their own mothers, or whose memories of their mothers are anything but positive. For all those whose hearts are heavy this day for whatever reason, be assured we are aware of your heartache and are praying for you.

May our Blessed Mother Mary shower her special graces upon *all* her daughters, inspire you to further share your maternal gifts, and most of all, may she lead you all closer to her Divine Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our sixth graders spent the day at Woodland Lakes learning about and practicing being better Christian friends by supporting each other through various challenges and praying with and for each other.





MOTHERS AND MOTHERHOOD IN THE BIBLE

There is a joke about the creation of the first human beings that circulates in some European feminist gatherings. It goes like this: God created the man. He looked at him and was not impressed. So God said

to himself, "I think I can do better," and he created the woman. A joke, mildly funny, but one that has a deep biblical foundation. There are three stages of womanhood—virgin, wife, and mother—that are highly praised in Scripture. Because it is Mother's Day, I will briefly touch on a few aspects of motherhood, usually neglected because of the technical or linguistic knowledge they require. Also, I will limit my brief investigation to the motherly dimensions in God and the Virgin Mary.

Motherhood Dimension in God

One of the words that most describes God is *mercy*. The Hebrew Old Testament used it 39 times (plus one, in Aramaic, in Daniel). It is one of those irregular words that, while plural, denotes a singular meaning. It's almost always applied to God. Such is the case of the Book of Psalms that uses it seven times, often in dramatic ways: Let your mercy reach me, then I will live (Ps 119:77). What does this have to do with our topic of motherhood? The answer is that the word mercy refers to the womb. It is a Hebrew word, rehamim, in plural form whose singular form, reham, is usually translated to womb. To be exact, the translation of this word to "womb" is approximate. Its exact meaning is not "womb" (we have a particular word for that) but the part of the womb where the fetus is formed. The exact translation, avoided for its inconvenience, is "uterus." Why is it that this part of woman's anatomy applies to God? The answer is that human beings wanted to describe God's love for the men and women he created. The difficulty is that human words are inadequate to describe God. No limited means, which is the human language, can describe God who is unlimited. To resolve the problem, the Bible (and Semitic) mentality asked another question: What is the highest and most intense feeling between two human beings? The answer is the link between a mother and the child that is formed in her. That is how the genius Semitic mentality ended up using the word "uterus" to speak of God's mercy and love for us.

Motherly care of the Virgin Mary

Virgin, wife, and mother are three stages of womanhood that are highly praised in the Bible. Yet, it is the "mother" that is the most praised in Scripture. The first woman called mother in the Bible is no other than Eve, the mother of the living (Gen 3:20). There is a play on words in the original Hebrew text of Genesis, between the name Eve (heva), living (hai) life (haym) that translations to non-Semitic languages, such as English, are unable to render. Indeed, the biblical

word mother hints to the gift of life (while the word father originally refers to the individual capacity to decide and command). Eve, according to Genesis, is the mother of the living because she is the first woman, the first mother. The Christian churches, at least churches before the reformation, establish a parallel between Eve and the Virgin Mary. The first is the mother of the



first creation. The second is the mother of the new creation. This fact that Mary is the mother of those redeemed by her son is a title she received from her son when, on the cross, he told her to be the mother of his beloved disciple: "Woman, there is your son" (Jn 19:26). The new motherhood of Mary and the comparison with Eve can be confirmed by a dogma, modern and controversial at its promulgation: The Immaculate Conception. It is a fundamental truth in the history of salvation. Mary is the first beneficiary of the redemption brought by the sacrifice of her son who is the first risen from the dead (Col 1:18). Like Eve is the mother of all because all came from her, and after her, Mary, conceived without sin, is the Mother of all those who will be freed from original sin. Like Eve, having no ancestor, shows that she is the absolute beginning in the order of creation; Mary, having no one before her that is freed from original sin, becomes the Mother of all who will be freed from original sin, the Mother of the New creation.







