FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



THE "MAY CROWNING" EACH OF US CAN OFFER

As I am sure everyone has noticed by now, we have moved the statue of Our Lady of Fatima from its usual place on the wall above the confessionals to a more prominent location in the main sanctuary, where it will remain for the month of May. Very early in

the month, the school children crowned the statue of Our Lady. This venerable custom of doing a May crowning of a statue of the Blessed Mother during the month of May, a month specially dedicated to Our Lady, is a beautiful manifestation of the love, trust, and devotion we hold in our hearts for Mary.

In light of that, I wanted to offer a few suggestions to everyone about various ways we might, as individuals or families, "crown" Mary in our own lives, especially during this month of May.

The first and most obvious would be to crown a statue of Our Lady in your own home. If you don't have an actual crown, you can easily make one by weaving small flowers or even a little greenery together in the shape of a crown. Or, if you do not have a statue but do have some sort of image hanging on a wall or displayed on a shelf, you could place a rose or some other flower on the top of the image, or a small flower arrangement in front of it. It might not look exactly like a crown, per se, but in the larger sense, it is providing extra ornamentation to the image in order to honor the one depicted. Small children might be given a picture of Mary to color and asked to draw a crown on the top of her head.

There is an even better way each of us can "crown" our Blessed Mother, and that is to do so spiritually. For we truly adorn her, honor her, "crown" her by entrusting ourselves to her as our mother and our queen, and placing ourselves under her as her servants and handmaids. By aiming to serve her well, we honor her with our deeds and proclaim by our actions that we know her to be the Queen of Heaven and Earth, to whom even the armies of angels joyfully vow their fidelity.

We crown her by entrusting our needs and intentions to her, asking her to bring them before her heavenly Son, the King of kings and Lord of lords. In doing so, we profess our understanding of the unique and irreplaceable role she continues to play in the work of salvation. As Mother of the Afflicted, Help of Christians, and by so many similar titles, we do her honor by entrusting our needs to her as her loving children.

Finally, as the old saying goes, "imitation is the highest form of flattery." In the context of faith, I would slightly correct that saying: imitation is the highest form of honor. We show Mary incredible honor when we aim to imitate in our lives all of the wonderful virtues that so beautifully adorned her own. Every time we imitate one of her virtues (and especially if we do so intentionally desiring to honor her), it is like a beautiful flower being placed in the crown atop her head.

So as we move through this very special month in honor of Our Lady, may each of our lives be a living "May crowning" in honor of Mary—she who is our life, our sweetness, and our hope. God bless,

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT:

MR. TOM WOEBKENBERG

This week, St. Gertrude Bulletin chatted with St. Gertrude School alumni Mr. Tom Woebkenberg. Mr. Woebkenberg graduated from SGS in 1974 and is a partner at Wood & Lamping and the father of SGS graduates Sarah, Matthew, Katie, and Maddie (our school administrative assistant).

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What is a favorite memory of your time at St. Gertrude School?

Mr. Woebkenberg: I don't know that I have one specific favorite memory, but I have many memories of spending time with friends in class and in school activities and just enjoying it all. Our classes were so close and the environment was so supportive. My memories of my years at St. Gertrude are all positive memories.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Did you have a favorite teacher? Why was he or she special?

Mr. Woebkenberg: I absolutely do: Doug Postler. Doug was an enormous influence in my life, starting with having him as a teacher at St. Gertrude and later as my boss at the Camargo Club. Doug went above and beyond just teaching us. He kept us in line, but not in a negative way. He knew what each student needed—some needed a figurative kick in the pants, others just needed encouragement. He even organized study sessions during a school break to teach the boys in our class math that we hadn't had yet but he knew would be on the upcoming high school entrance tests. He did this on his own time. Later, Doug hired several of us to work at the Camargo Club where he served as general manager. He was a tremendous influence at a key stage in my life, and I've always been grateful that I had the good fortune to have had Doug in my life.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: How did your St. Gertrude School education prepare you for higher studies, your career, and ultimately for life?

Mr. Woebkenberg: First off, I felt all of our teachers prepared us very well for high school. The teachers took very seriously their roles as educators of each student, as opposed to just being sure they finished the textbook by the end of the year. More importantly, we learned about our faith and had many opportunities to practice what we learned. We learned that there are things that are right and wrong, good and bad, and those lessons have remained with me throughout my life. Finally, we always had parents who volunteered for field trips, coaching, and similar activities. That example stuck with me. As our family grew and the kids attended St. Gertrude, I felt it was my turn to return the favor and to volunteer for various roles at SGS. I got far more out of those opportunities to give back than my kids or the kids on the teams I worked with did.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What is your wish for today's St. Gertrude School students?

Mr. Woebkenberg: I wish they could enjoy their classmates and teachers and retain the innocence of their youth as long as possible. St. Gertrude is perhaps one of the best places anywhere to do so. The significant number of religious involved in the daily lives of the students plays a huge role in helping the kids to stay kids as long as possible, which is a blessing for those kids.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What is one piece of advice you have for today's St. Gertrude School students?

Mr. Woebkenberg: Do your best each day at both work and play. There is plenty of time for both, and this principle will apply throughout your life. And, don't be in a hurry to grow up. You have the rest of your life to be a grown-up. Don't be in such a hurry to get there. I know that's more than one piece of advice, but I think they're both important.

EVANGELIZATION AND FAITH FORMATION



ENCOUNTERING JESUS THROUGH ALPHA: A JOURNEY OF FRIENDSHIP AND PRAYER

The essence of evangelization is fostering a friendship with Jesus and inviting others to do the same. This is only made possible by loving God through Jesus Christ.

Therefore, evangelization is incarnational, as God took on human form and tasked us with sharing his love with the world (Matthew 28:19-20 RSV). By reflecting on the sacrificial love of Jesus and his followers, we comprehend God's generosity and learn to emulate his goodness in our own lives. This prepares us to become effective evangelizers, sharing Christ's love and friendship with others (*Deus Caritas Est*, 12). I am thrilled that St. Gertrude Parish will introduce Alpha as a method of sharing the Gospel with those seeking deeper meaning in their lives. In today's world, marked by divisiveness, many are seeking purpose and a genuine encounter with Jesus, the ultimate **peacemaker**. St. Gertrude Parish recognizes this need and is responding by introducing a course—a method designed to foster conversations about Jesus and the Church in a welcoming environment. Alpha offers participants the chance to build genuine friendships and have a life-changing encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ.

Is Alpha just another program?

Alpha is more than a program; it's a unique approach to evangelization that provides a place for people to explore their faith and meet Jesus. Alpha encourages open and respectful dialogue where participants can freely share their thoughts, ideas, and opinions without fear of judgment. This atmosphere allows **the Holy Spirit**, **the true evangelizer**, to work in the lives of participants, planting the seeds of the Gospel and fostering spiritual growth. The beauty is that participants can have authentic encounters with others and, more importantly, with Jesus Christ. Alpha is not a mere tactic or strategy, but a sacred space where the Holy Spirit can move freely and touch open hearts.

One of Alpha's most impactful aspects is its emphasis on prayer. Like the great saints who evangelized through their interior life of prayer, (such as Therese of Lisieux, Elizabeth of the Trinity, Catherine of Siena, and Elisabeth Leseur), Alpha recognizes the importance of **prayer** in sharing the Gospel. Prayer is fundamental, fostering genuine encounters with Jesus. In my journey of evangelization, prayer has been central, allowing me to grow deeper in my relationship with Jesus and the Church, and witness its transformative power in others' lives. Many of us may feel inadequate when evangelizing, thinking we lack the knowledge or skills to articulate Church teachings. This feeling is common, especially in a Dominican parish where we are surrounded

by trained theologians adept at making sound apologetic arguments (not to mention their deep familiarity with the teachings of St. Thomas Aquinas). However, sharing the Gospel does not require such training and mastery.

Evangelization is about **building relationships and sharing our faith journeys** in a personal and relatable way. Alpha eases the fear of evangelization by emphasizing the importance of friendship in sharing Jesus with others. We learn to form genuine friendships with those seeking deeper purpose and meaning, accompanying them on their spiritual journeys, just as Jesus did with his disciples. This approach allows us to walk alongside others, offering support and encouragement, rather than focusing on presenting complex theological arguments.

Participating in this type of evangelization offers an opportunity to encounter Christ on a personal level. For many, it may be the first time they truly meet Jesus and start fostering a relationship with him. Through friendship and accompaniment, participants witness the transformative power of authentic relationships rooted in faith. It's a reason for celebration and gratitude to God for the gift of friendship and the opportunity to journey with others as they discover the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

Alpha promotes genuine encounters with Jesus through friendship and prayer. By creating a place for honest conversation, emphasizing the importance of prayer, and encouraging evangelization through friendship, one can experience a friendship with Christ. Thanks be to God. I invite you to take part in Alpha, invite others to it, and experience the joy of sharing the Gospel through friendship and prayer.



Since its publication in 1843, St. Louis de Montfort's book *True Devotion to Mary* has inspired Catholics to grow closer to Christ through his Blessed Mother. Anne Collins, a parishioner at St. Gertrude Church in Madeira, encountered the book in the 90s after learning about Pope St. John Paul II's motto, "*Totus Tuus*" (Totally Yours), which comes from de Montfort's book. It had such a profound effect on her life that she made her first total consecration to Jesus through Mary in 1996.

For 10 years, she reread the book each Lent, renewing her consecration privately. While participating in a women's group focused on Pope St. John Paul II, the topic turned to Mary. "I was really quiet at first [in the group]," Collins said. "They always say, 'She was so quiet. She didn't say anything. She just sat there.' Then we got to the Marian year and I wouldn't shut up. I just had so much to share about the book and [the other members] were just blown away."

The women's group asked Collins to prepare a study guide and lead them on the topic of Marian Consecration. "It started out [with just] 12 or 15 women in somebody's home," Collins said. "We went around the circle reading the book line by line. ... From there, each year it got a little bigger."

Collins' efforts received a boost when she received access to the notes of Montfort Missionaries Father Patrick Gaffney, SMM, who was editor for the Montfort Fathers' magazine for many years. His notes were a significant help.

Educated at St. Mary's College in South Bend, IN, Collins' major was not in theology. "Even a math major can do this," she said of the consecration and her promotion efforts. "I am a shy person, but Mary and Jesus have helped me to step out."

For the next 10 years, Collins led the preparation for others'

consecrations. After initially hosting the program in homes, she moved to St. Gertrude's library then to the church itself as the crowd grew. She ended up giving talks on the topic at various parishes. In her final year of leading preparations live, she estimated 300 people attended at three locations.

For the last 10 years, Collins has used prerecorded videos of her presentations. In St. Louis de Montfort's book, the consecration is suggested as a 33-day process. In Collins' program, there are 17 two-hour videos, one viewed each week at St. Gertrude. She stays to answer questions after the videos.

While incalculable people around the world have made this and other consecrations to Mary, Collins shares a common objection: People believe it's only for the very holy. She insists it is for everyone, as Christ gave Mary to be a mother for all of us when she stood at the foot of the cross.

"I tell people this is not about doing anything," Collins said. "This is just about asking the mother who's already your mother to just draw a little closer and basically to comfort you. Who doesn't need comfort, you know? She's so gentle, and she helps everyone, and she meets you where you are. So, it doesn't matter where you are in your spiritual life. ... It's not about doing anything. It's about knowing that you're loved and it's about believing God's promises are true. As you do it and you grow, you're just going to hear your guardian angel better." Now, almost 30 years since her first consecration, Collins plans to continue her program, with no immediate end in sight.

"I'll keep doing it as long as Mary asks me to do it," Collins said.




