THE PRICE OF ITINERANCY: HAVING TO SAY GOODBYE (FOR US, TO TWO OF OUR SISTERS)

For roughly the first millennium of Christianity, there was essentially only one form of common religious life in the Church: monasticism. And one of the defining characteristics of the vocation of monks and monastic nuns was a fourth vow they took. Besides the standard vows (also called evangelical

counsels) of poverty, chastity, and obedience, they also professed a vow of "stability." In other words, a monk or nun would enter a monastery and remain at that monastery *for life.*

In the early part of the second Christian millennium, a new form of religious life emerged: that of the friars. Probably the two most famous orders in this new movement were the Dominicans and the Franciscans. Unlike the monks, who took a vow of stability, St. Francis and St. Dominic wished the exact opposite for their friars: they wanted them to be **itinerant**; that is, *not* rooted to one particular location, but free to be sent to various locations at a moment's notice as the needs of the apostolate demanded. For both Dominican friars and Dominican active sisters, this itinerancy is still a central aspect of our religious vocations today. Being moved from one location to another is something we all realized would happen when we "signed on the dotted line" and became Dominicans. Part of this itinerancy is that, sadly, we find ourselves frequently having to say "goodbye." And in the same way, the faithful whom we serve are often in the position of frequently having to say goodbye to us as well.

A few weeks ago, I shared in the bulletin that Father John Mark and Father Michael would soon be leaving St. Gertrude for new assignments. This week, I have to share the bittersweet news that two of the four sisters who served in our school this year recently learned that they, too, will be moving on to new assignments. So very soon we will say goodbye to Sister Emma and Sister Maria Christi. Though Sister Emma has only been with us one year, her gentle nature and deep faith have made such a wonderful impact on our school community, especially upon her fourth graders and the girls of the St. Anne's Guild who have been graced by her presence so regularly this year.

We will also be saying goodbye to our principal, Sister Maria Christi. She has served the school so faithfully for many years and bravely led the school through the extraordinarily difficult period of the COVID shutdown and helped navigate the school through the post-COVID period of incredibly difficult restriction, safety precautions, and limitations. I can say without hesitation that St. Gertrude School would not be in the position it is today, having emerged from the chaos of the pandemic, without the strong and resolute leadership of Sister Maria Christi. She will be sorely missed.

Because this Sunday is the final Sunday that Sister Maria Christi will be with us, I invite everyone in the parish to attend a reception to wish her and Sister Emma well, which will be held in the gym after the 10 a.m. Mass this weekend. Please join me in thanking both of these sisters for their contributions to our school and parish community.

We look forward to welcoming the two new sisters who will be filling Sister Emma's and Sister Maria Christi's roles. But this weekend isn't about them; it's about saying our "goodbyes" to our two departing sisters. I am so grateful for all they

have given to our parish and our school. Please join me on Sunday in expressing that gratitude. God bless,

ASK A PRIEST— DOMINICAN COMINGS AND GOINGS

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Why do Dominican priests and sisters seem to move so frequently?

A: The Dominicans were founded as an *itinerant* Order. This means that, as opposed to monks who vow stability of

place and diocesan clergy who serve in the local Church, the friars and some of our sisters (like our Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia) travel in imitation of the Apostles who were sent out "two by two" to evangelize many nations and cultures. Whereas it can be refreshing to experience the dynamism and variety of a Dominican parish and school, that same beehive of activity can have certain drawbacks from a human standpoint (e.g. "I finally got to know Father X, and now he's being sent across the country!" or "My daughter adored Sister Y and her absence next school year will be felt!").

I've heard our more seasoned parishioners express their familiarity with this pattern of comings and goings among the Dominicans: certain friars and sisters may be missed but they are also remembered. If you stick around St. Gertrude Parish long enough, you become familiar

with more men and women religious than you ever thought possible; every holiday and summer, old friends appear! One parishioner shared this insight: Dominican detachment is very good; the priests are detached in order to be radically free to follow what is asked by their superiors. However, wherever they go, they are remarkably attached to those they are asked to serve. I think this parishioner captured something unique in the Dominican ideal.

The French Dominican Lacordaire famously said that a priest of Jesus Christ "belongs to all men and yet to none." I would say this applies to all Dominicans: novices, sisters, and priests. The Holy Spirit helps us to be agents of Christ wherever we go, possessing something of St. Dominic's spirit: "Dominic was so much on fire with zeal for souls that 'he received all in a broad embrace of charity and since he loved them all he was loved by all in return." Our Dominican Constitutions go on to explain that every Dominican is called to a supernatural, God-like way of loving: "We imitate the virginal life of Christ who for love of the Church gave himself up for her. Impelled by our apostolic vocation we are wholly dedicated to the Church, and thus to love humanity more fully."1 The "impelled" part of itineracy is both exciting and unsettling; we can never get too comfortable as long as we live in this present life!

The mission of the Dominican Order and its apostolic impulse can be traced (in spirit) back to the Garden of the Resurrection. The risen Lord Jesus spoke a kind of admonition to St. Mary Magdalene when she recognized him and reached out in excitement: "Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father; but go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God" (Jn 20:17). Like Mary, the Dominican sisters and friars wish to announce the Good News of the victorious Christ wherever they are sent. Jesus simply did not "settle down" in this world; he traveled, preached, suffered and died, rose from the dead, and ascended to prepare a place for us with his Father. So while we can be thankful for the love and joy we experience even now in our beautiful parish and school community, the movement of the friars and sisters reminds us that only in God's paradise will we find the full fruition of our earthly friendships.
