Refreshments: Water is available at the start/finish line and during the race. Bagels and more after the race.

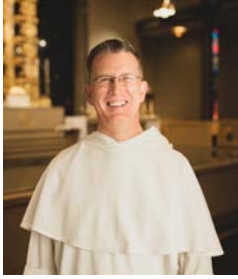
Mass: A Mass will be said for those loved ones remembered.

TRINITY SUNDAY AND THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

Making the Sign of the Cross is the most common prayer and gesture of our Catholic faith. It accompanies the beginning and end of our prayers; it expresses the most essential dogma of our faith. Unfortunately, the prayer and gesture are often made thoughtlessly or superstitiously. Sometimes it appears that a person is swatting away a fly more than making the Sign of the Cross.

“The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit”(CCC 261). One God in three persons is the God of our faith and worship. Hence, we are baptized in the name of the Three-Personed God, we pray in the name of the Three-Personed God, and we worship in the name of the Three-Personed God. This paradigm is reflected in so many of our prayers. For example, the Mass begins and ends with the Sign of the Cross and the invocation of the names of God. The prayers of the Mass are addressed to God through Jesus Christ and in the unity of the Holy Spirit. The end of the Eucharistic Prayer is Trinitarian when we say, “Through Him and with Him and in Him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all glory and honor is Yours forever and ever. Amen.”

Yes, this is a great mystery that can be hard to understand with the human mind. Most of us do not have the philosophical and theological training to grapple with terms such as “substance,” “person” or “hypostasis,” “relation,” and so on. Nevertheless, through our Baptism and the gift of faith, we are always in a relationship with God who is One and relates to us Person to person. He created us in love and in a plan of sheer goodness to make us share in His own blessed life (cf. CCC 1). We can have confidence that the Holy Spirit has guided the Church from the beginning in the clarification of our Trinitarian faith and articulated the true faith through the creedal statements of the earliest Councils. The Creed that we pray at Mass has its origin in the Council of Nicea in 325. When we pray the Creed, we re-affirm our Catholic faith and the promises of our Baptism.

The Sign of the Cross is a succinct profession of our faith and a reminder of the Cross of our salvation and redemption. We all do well to make this sign reverently and consciously. Doing so will deepen our relationship with God who created us, who saves us, and sanctifies us. It is a holy sign.



This weekend, we welcome Fr. Simon Teller, O.P., a son of our parish who was ordained to the priesthood last weekend. We extend our congratulations to him and pray for an abundance of God’s grace throughout the years of his priestly ministry. He will be staying with us of a couple of weeks and will celebrate some of the

parish Masses during that time. We also welcome this weekend, Brother Damian Day, O.P., who is a deacon in formation for the priesthood. Brother Damian will stay with us throughout the summer months, serving in liturgical ministries and other pastoral opportunities.



Next weekend is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. A solemn Mass will be celebrated at 12:00 noon, with a Eucharistic procession and Benediction following within the church. Fr. Clement will celebrate this Mass as he bids farewell to the parish. A reception will follow.

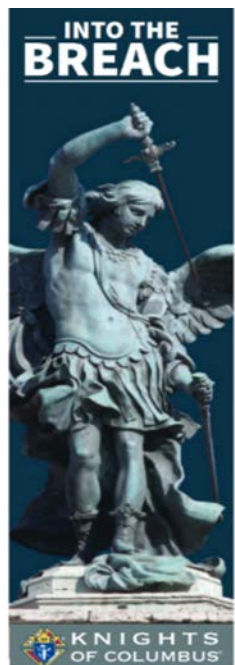

**ASK A PRIEST –
RECEIVING AND
OFFERING
FORGIVENESS**

Q: Are we, as Christians, called to forgive those persons who have harmed us and have not repented? Scripture seems to suggest that some people can put themselves outside of being able to receive from God’s mercy as well as our charity.

A: Forgiveness – whether receiving it or offering it to another – can be a very difficult area humanly-speaking. But Jesus shows us what is possible when the love of God is at work in our hearts. No sin is unforgivable for God, even if humans can choose whether or not to accept His mercy.¹ Christ’s attitude is proactive in regard to offering forgiveness and extending its healing power. This attitude is what He expects of us, His friends, too.

In the language of the Gospels, sins are like debts that add up for those who offend us. They are what we owe to those we have unjustly failed in some way. Most significantly, sin creates an insoluble debt between us and God, at least from our side. Jesus exhorts us to forgive others if we would hope to be forgiven by God: “if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses” (Mt 6:14-15). Of course, Jesus is explaining here why the famous Prayer He teaches His disciples makes forgiveness *conditional*.

At one point, St. Peter asks Jesus how *often* he needs to forgive his brother. Should there be a limit? Jesus’ response leaves little doubt: He tells a parable about a surprisingly generous king who forgives an enormous debt owed by one of his servants. The only expectation is that the servant would be similarly generous with his social equals. When the servant shows himself to be unmerciful and exacting with his fellow servant, he receives a pointed question: “should you not have had mercy on your fellow servant as I had mercy on you?” (see Mt 18:23-35). In addition to telling St. Peter that he must forgive “seventy times seven times,” He expresses an underlying expectation with respect to those who are in our debt: “forgive your brother from your heart” (v .35).

Jesus instituted the Sacrament of His Body and Blood which would be offered “for the forgiveness of sins” even before His betrayal and crucifixion. His disciples each would have to respond

to this lavish display of God’s mercy. Some would repent in tears with Peter, others would despair with Judas. The Catechism praises forgiveness a “highpoint of prayer” and a “fundamental condition of the reconciliation of the children of God with their Father and of men with one another.”²

Love is “indivisible” like the Body of Christ is indivisible; we cannot pick and choose what part of Christ’s gift of fraternal communion we would like to enjoy. We must receive from and give to all members of the Church, a Church that is continually expanding. Will we imitate Jesus’ greatness of heart as He forgave even those who were actively killing Him? Will we defer to the power of Christ’s Holy Spirit who can effect reconciliation between otherwise unreconcilable parties if they welcome His presence?

¹ This is a common explanation of the unforgivable sin “against the Holy Spirit” mentioned in Mt 12:31-32. See CCC 1864. It is possible to interpret the hopeless “sin unto death” mentioned in 1 Jn 5:15 in the same way.

² CCC 2844. See Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2840 for a helpful instruction on Jesus’ expectation regarding “forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.”
