MARY'S MONTH, THE ROSARY, AND TRANSITIONS

Today is Mother's Day in the secular calendar and it is a wonderful occasion to honor all mothers and express our love

and devotion to them. It is also an occasion that directs our attention to Holy Mother Mary — the Mother of Jesus and our Mother as well. For many years in the history of the Church, the month of May has been dedicated to her honor. Devotion to our Blessed Mother is fitting because Mary always leads us into deeper communion with Jesus her Son. Fitting because Mary prays for us that we may grow in discipleship with the Lord who comes to us in the Holy Eucharist. Fitting because Mary leads all her children on the narrow way of the Lord Jesus into eternal life. (A statue of Our Lady of Fatima was crowned at a May Crowning ceremony last Tuesday by the 8th grade class of our school.)

We Dominican Friars and Sisters have a centuries-old association with the Rosary of Our Lady — preaching and encouraging the praying of the Rosary so that all people can meditate on the mysteries of the life of Jesus while holding onto the beads of Mary in our hand. It is a simple prayer, a humble prayer, a Scriptural prayer, a powerful prayer, and a meditative prayer. Generations of people have found help, strength, and consolation through this prayer. Through the repetition of the basic prayers of the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be (which many Catholics learned as children), we find that Jesus and Mary accompany us through all the joys and sorrows, highlights, and ordinariness of our lives. No circumstance or experience is excluded from their loving presence and compassion for us.

Quite truthfully, the Rosary should be a devotion that is a part of every Catholic life. Popes, saints, and spiritual directors have recommended it for hundreds of years. The holy beads are not meant to be a kind of jewelry worn around the neck, or a decoration over the rear-view mirror of a car; rather, they are meant to glide through our fingers with loving attention to the presence, love and mercy of Jesus and Mary. Learn the Rosary, teach the Rosary, pray the Rosary! Through Mary to Jesus we find every grace we need to persevere on our pilgrimage of faith, filled with hope that God will bring us to the perfection of charity and make us saints.

Recently, announcements were received regarding personnel changes here at St. Gertrude. Fr. Clement Dickie, after nearly

4 ½ years of parochial ministry here at St. Gertrude will be moving to St. Joseph Church in Greenwich Village, NYC to serve as parochial vicar there. Please see his announcement on the previous page in this bulletin.



Marian Consecration: 33 Days to Morning Glory

As part of the Bicentennial Marian Pilgrimage for the Visit of the Our Lady of Fatima Statue, St. Gertrude is encouraging all parishioners to consider consecrating (or re-consecrating) themselves to Jesus through Mary on June 12.

Marian consecration has a long history in the Church, and it flows from the grace of our Baptism, through which we were originally consecrated, or "set apart." Marian consecration is basically a renewal of one's baptismal promises in and through an act of entrustment to Mary. The actual act of consecration will take place on June 12 at 8pm.

The method of consecration set forth by St. Louis de Montfort consists of a 33-day period of prayerful preparation followed by the actual act of consecration itself which takes place on "Day 34." The 33 day preparation in advance of June 12 begins on May 10.

Over the past year of navigating COVID-19 and in light of the recent departures of Bryan Wells and Megan Dickert, we are reevaluating all of our formation offerings for youth in order to best serve our families, introduce the youth to Christ, and maximize our staff. Beginning in the Fall, we will implement a two-year Confirmation formation process for all non-St. Gertrude School 7th and 8th graders seeking Confirmation during the 8th grade year at St. Gertrude (next year's 8th graders will only receive 1 year of formation in this new format as we make our way through the transition). The students will meet 1 time per month from September-May (plus a few additional events) for a dynamic, youth-ministry based experience that will focus on Christian discipleship, prayer, and, of course, Confirmation.

Brad Bursa, our evangelization team lead and director of adult formation will be hosting two informational meetings to explain the new format and answer questions on May 18 at 6:30 p.m. in the School Cafeteria and May 24 at 7:00 p.m. in the School Cafeteria. 

ASK A PRIEST - MAY DEVOTION TO THE BLESSED MOTHER

Q: Why is May devoted to the Blessed Mother? Does this have to do with the celebration of Mother's Day?

A: It's very appropriate that Mother's Day and the Marian Month of May align, whether by accident or Providence or both! Both associations are relatively recent, historically speaking, and trace their designations to the last two centuries.

Mother's Day in the United States was begun at the initiative of Anna Jarvis, whose own mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, is remembered for her efforts to reconcile soldiers from the North and South, along with their mothers, after the Civil War. A parallel holiday, "Mothering Day," was revived in England by Constance Adelaide Smith. She encouraged mothers and their children on *Laetare* Sunday during Lent to spend time together, visit the "mother" church of their Baptism, and reflect on the role of the Mother of Jesus in the lives of Christians. Finally, in associating the entire month of May with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Catholic Church has brought together a number of its ancient traditions to help her members appreciate Jesus' Mother and theirs at this especially bright time of the seasonal and liturgical year.

During Easter time, Mary especially symbolizes the Church who is our "mother" in Baptism. Mary was present at the foot of Cross and became the "mother" of the beloved disciple and

showed herself to be mainstay and "mother" of the fearful disciples awaiting the Lord's promised Spirit in the Upper Room (see Acts 1:12-14). Catholic teaching consistently has highlighted Mary's maternal role in the life of every Christian, especially at this time of year:

"We are delighted and consoled by this pious custom associated with the month of May, which pays honor to the Blessed Virgin and brings such rich benefits to the Christian people. Since Mary is rightly to be regarded as the way by which we are led to Christ, the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise. For what other reason do we continually turn to Mary except to seek the Christ in her arms, to seek our Savior in her, through her, and with her? To Him men are to turn amid the anxieties and perils of this world, urged on by duty and driven by the compelling needs of their heart, to find a haven of salvation, a transcendent fountain of life."¹

Of course, we Catholics have love for our adoptive Mother year round! This is evidenced by special feasts during most months which are dedicated to Mary. Yet, with nature's "motherhood" manifest all around us during Spring, May seems an especially appropriate time to stand beside Mary and appreciate what God has brought to life in Jesus through her motherhood. As the priest-poet Gerard Manley Hopkins put it:

All things rising, all things sizing Mary sees, sympathizing

With that world of good, Nature's motherhood.

The magnifying of each its kind
With delight calls to mind
How she did in her stored
Magnify the Lord.²
