WE NEED YOU (OR RATHER, WE NEED EACH OTHER)

"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the

expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes. . . . Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then, gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues." (1 Cor 12: 1-11, 28-30)

God has given everybody gifts. Occasionally, people receive very dramatic spiritual gifts, like speaking in tongues or working miraculous healings or prophecy. But let's be honest . . . in our day and age, finding people with such gifts is a rather rare occurrence. However, that doesn't mean God is inactive in our world today. Quite the contrary; God is still pouring gifts upon his people. In the Scripture passage above, St. Paul emphasizes that "to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." To each individual. There is no such thing as a person who is devoid of gifts from God. Toward the end of that passage, we read about some more mundane sounding gifts: being a good teacher, administration, assisting others. To that we can add all sorts of other examples. Being a truly compassionate listener is a gift. Having a deep love for praying for others is a gift. Having a warm and welcoming personality is a gift. Having a beautiful singing voice or being confident reading in front of a crowd is a gift. The list could go on and on.

Everyone has been given gifts. This weekend at St. Gertrude, we are going out of our way to ask you—each of you—to please



share the gifts you have been given with your fellow parishioners. At the Parish Center after all our Masses this weekend, we will have representatives of our 60+ parish ministries, groups, and programs. From the bottom of my heart, I hope everyone in the parish walks over after Mass and spends some time walking amidst the tables to learn more about the countless ways each one of you can become involved in our parish by sharing your gifts in service to God and your neighbor. We need your presence; we need your gifts. Our lives will be enriched by your sharing of your gifts with the rest of us.

And at the same time, sharing your gifts will also change and transform you. A gift opens the way and ushers the giver into the presence of the great (cf. Prov 18:16). If you've ever felt like your spiritual life is a bit stagnant or that you're stuck in a rut, there is no better way to get out of that situation than by getting involved in something new. The very act of giving of your gifts to others will also help to reveal your true self. As Pope St. John Paul II famously said, "Man does not discover himself until he makes the sincere gift of himself."

It is my hope and dream that every single parishioner would be involved in something (anything!) in the parish besides just coming to Mass. If you can't quite figure out where your gifts fit in, reach out to any of the priests or the parish office and we will do our best to help "match" your gifts to the ministries and groups in our parish.

We need you. We need each other. And we are all stronger in the faith when we are working at it together.

Looking forward to seeing everyone at the "ministries fair," as we are calling it, after Mass this weekend.

ASK A PRIEST— EXALTATION OF THE CROSS

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P.

Q: What does the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrate?

A: The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is on September 14. Theologically, of course, it celebrates the instrument

that God used to save the world. An instrument of grisly torture and death became the means of saving humanity from eternal separation from God. So, it is regarded with reverence and is a sign to us of hope and the power of God's love for us.

Historically speaking, the feast also celebrates important historical events related to the actual cross on which Jesus died. It falls on September 14 because, in the Eastern Church where the feast was first celebrated, it was the day on which the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem was dedicated around the year 335 AD. The church was built on the site where St. Helena, mother of the Roman





emperor Constantine, is said to have found the true cross that Christ died on. She had made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to look for the cross a number of years after Constantine legalized Christianity. So, the feast celebrates the finding of the cross and the dedication of the church that originally housed this revered relic of Christ's death.

Some also link the feast to the return of the holy cross to Jerusalem in 630 AD. The relic had been captured by the powerful Sassanid Empire of Persia about the year 614 or 615 during its wars with the Byzantine Empire based at Constantinople. Jerusalem was part of the Byzantine Empire and was attacked and conquered by the Persians. The Sassanids, for the most part, were not Christian, but their queen was, and she used her influence to ensure that the relic was preserved. It was taken to the Persian city of Ctesiphon and remained there until the Byzantines gained the upper hand in the conflict and used their advantage to negotiate the return of the relic. It was brought back to Jerusalem, and the Byzantine emperor Heraclius carried it back into the city himself. Tradition has it that when he went to meet the cross to carry it into the city, Heraclius was unable to move it until he took off his emperor's fine clothing and put on the poor garb of a pilgrim.
