

For a long time now, our parish has kept the beautiful custom of praying the St. Michael prayer at the conclusion of our Masses, invoking the protection of the "prince of the heavenly host" upon all of us. What many people don't know is that the prayer we pray today is a much shortened, edited version of the original prayer. In honor of the feast of the Holy Archangels, which we will celebrate this

coming Thursday, I want to share with everyone the original form of this prayer. May St. Michael and the armies of heavenly angels lead, guide, and protect us always.

Prayer to St. Michael, composed by Pope Leo XIII in 1888.

O glorious Archangel St. Michael, Prince of the heavenly host, be our defense in the terrible warfare which we carry on against principalities and powers, against the rulers of this world of darkness, spirits of evil. Come to the aid of man, whom God created immortal, made in his own image and likeness, and redeemed at a great price from the tyranny of the devil.

Fight this day the battle of the Lord, together with the holy angels, as already thou hast fought the leader of the proud angels, Lucifer, and his apostate host, who were powerless to resist thee, nor was there place for them any longer in heaven. That cruel, that ancient serpent, who is called the devil or Satan, who seduces the whole world, was cast into the abyss with his angels. Behold, this primeval enemy and slayer of men has taken courage. Transformed into an angel of light, he wanders about with all the multitude of wicked spirits, invading the earth in order to blot out the name of God and of his Christ, to seize upon, slay and cast into eternal perdition souls destined for the crown of eternal glory. This wicked dragon pours out, as a most impure flood, the venom of his malice on men of depraved mind and corrupt heart, the spirit of lying, of impiety, of blasphemy, and the pestilent breath of impurity, and of every vice and iniquity.

These most crafty enemies have filled and inebriated with gall and bitterness the Church, the spouse of the immaculate Lamb, and have laid impious hands on her most sacred possessions.

In the Holy Place itself, where has been set up the See of the most holy Peter and the Chair of Truth for the light of the world, they have raised the throne of their abominable impiety, with the iniquitous design that when the Pastor has been struck, the sheep may be scattered.

Arise then, O invincible Prince, bring help against the attacks of the lost spirits to the people of God, and give them the victory. They venerate thee as their protector and patron; in thee holy Church glories as her defense against the malicious power of hell; to thee has God entrusted the souls of men to be established in heavenly beatitude. Oh, pray to the God of peace that he may put Satan under our feet, so far conquered that he may no longer be able to hold men in captivity and harm the Church. Offer our prayers in the sight of the Most High, so that they may quickly conciliate the mercies of the Lord; and beating down the dragon, the ancient serpent, who is the devil and Satan, do thou again make him captive in the abyss, that he may no longer seduce the nations. Amen.



(TRYING TO) LIVE THE MISSION: THE BRIDEGROOM

One Sunday of each month, St. Gertrude Bulletin will feature stories and tips for trying to live the faith in the ordinariness of life.

"Thus says the LORD: I will lead her into the desert and speak to her heart. She shall respond there as in the days of her youth, when she came up from the land of Egypt. I will espouse you to me forever: I will espouse you in right and in justice, in love and in mercy; I will espouse you in fidelity, and you shall know the LORD." (Hosea 2:14, 15b, 19-20)

This beautiful reading from the prophet Hosea first captured my attention when I was in college. Now I consider these verses to be like a melody that keeps returning to echo in my heart again and again throughout the seasons of my life. When I first read and considered these words, I was prayerfully discerning a vocation to religious life. I saw the loving hand of God at work in my life and felt that he was indeed leading me like he said through the prophet Hosea: "I will lead her into the desert and speak to her heart." I relished moments in the adoration chapel, spending time meditating on God's unfathomable, unconditional, and intimate love for me. Receiving Christ in the Eucharist each day at Mass, I knew my soul was being nourished like the Israelites partaking of the manna each day in the desert when they "came up from the land of Egypt." I recognized the gentle way God was pursuing me and placing the desire in my own heart to respond completely.

In studying sacred Scripture in various courses, I became aware of the idea that there is "nuptial orientation" in God's relationship with his people. He forms covenants with his chosen ones, extending himself in fidelity and in mercy. He shows his people the path to life, calling them away from sin and idolatry. He is like a jealous lover who will stop at nothing in order to protect his beloved, even to the extent of making the ultimate sacrifice: "he gave his only Son." Jesus Christ is the bridegroom of the Church. He weds himself to humanity through the sacrifice of the Cross.


I was deeply attracted to this imagery of Christ the bridegroom and the Church as his bride. While on Earth, we all can prepare for and await the day when we will see him "face to face . . . as he is." However, the profession of religious vows makes this spousal relationship a lived experience here on Earth. I desired this and felt called to give my "yes" to the Lord. Many of you know that I did enter religious life and offer the gift of myself back to God. "I will espouse you to me" took on a very real and concrete meaning as I lived those days, months, and years in the convent. I did not plan or expect this to be temporary, but before my profession of final vows, it was evident that God was doing something new—he was again "leading me into the desert" and would "speak to my heart."

During that time, my trust was weak, and it was tempting to doubt. However, he is always faithful, merciful, and good. Little did I realize, he indeed had a new and beautiful path planned for me—one that surpassed all I could ask for or imagine! My heart still had a great desire for holiness, to live with faith, to love and be loved, to be known . . . and the Lord knew I needed someone to be the mirror of his love, fidelity, and mercy for me.

God brought Rob Thiemann into my life at just the right moment. As we got to know one another and began our courtship, I came to appreciate and experience in a real way how fitting it is that nuptial imagery is used in Scripture. Just as Rob gently pursued me, the Lord seeks us and understands us. Rob and I know we are not perfect, and we see each other's mistakes . . . so, too, God knows our weaknesses, but does not humiliate us. Just as Rob and I are honest and vulnerable with one another, God desires our complete trust and surrender. When I am anxious or afraid, Rob encourages me . . . just as God raises us up and strengthens us in our trials. As I look at the beautiful ring he placed on my hand when he proposed, I remember that Rob sees the *good* and finds joy in me, which is a reminder that "the Lord takes delight in us!"

In Christian marriage, spouses *become Christ* for one another. "I will espouse you in fidelity, and you shall know the Lord." This is what Rob and I anticipate with joy!



ASK A PRIEST - CHOIRS AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION (PART 1)

Q: Last week, you discussed the new Schola Cantorum and the importance of teaching the next generation to participate in Catholic life and worship through singing. Considering our parish choirs, would you explain the part they play in helping everyone engage at Mass?

A: I think we'll need two weeks to do justice to this question! Returning to the documents of Vatican II and some of the instructions issued by the Church in the years following the Council, we can appreciate the part that singing and choirs have to play in helping people enter into the heart of Catholic worship. Different types of participation all point the way to fuller and more fulfilling worship: "When the Church prays or sings or acts, the faith of those taking part is nourished, and their minds are raised to God so that they may offer him their spiritual homage and receive his grace more abundantly." ¹ This week, I wish to explore the significance of "active participation," since this appears to be the immediate goal of the Church's prayers and singing during Mass. Next week, I'll address the question about how our choirs and singing can help us engage in the Mass in the way the Church intends, all for the worship of God and our spiritual benefit.

It's worth repeating that the Second Vatican Council considered "the full and active participation by all the people" in the sacred liturgy to be the principle aim of its envisioned liturgical reforms. The official prayers of the Church, especially at Mass, are the birthright of every baptized man and woman; liturgy cannot become solely the preoccupation of the clergy or background ambiance to peoples' private devotional lives. This is because the Catholic liturgy is "the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit." ²

Pope St. John Paul II interpreted this "full, active, and conscious participation" called for by the Council with wise nuance when speaking to a group of American bishops many years later. Allow me the freedom to paraphrase:

Full. Everyone has a part to play, although the parts of priest, accompanying ministers, and the congregation of the baptized are different. "The liturgy, like the Church, is intended to be hierarchical and polyphonic, respecting the different roles assigned by Christ and allowing all the different voices to blend in one great hymn of praise."

Active. Everyone in the congregation takes part in Christ's sacrifice offered to the Father for the sanctification of his people through "gesture, word, song, and service." However, "active participation does not preclude the active passivity of silence, stillness and listening: indeed, it demands it." At Mass, any activity is for the sake of God's worship and our holiness, and not for its own sake.

Conscious. Christians must receive instruction and formation so that their participation in liturgy doesn't deteriorate into empty ritualism. Nor should our worship be hyper-rationalized so as to exclude whatever can't be packed into a tidy formula. The pope advocates a balance inspired by the belief, preaching, and pastoral sense of the Church Fathers: "the Roman Rite is again distinctive in the balance it strikes between a spareness and a richness of emotion: it feeds the heart and the mind, the body and the soul." ³

Next week, we'll discuss how our choirs and the sung parts done by all are meant to help us worship at Mass through full, active, and conscious participation.
