Sirach 35:12–14, 16–18

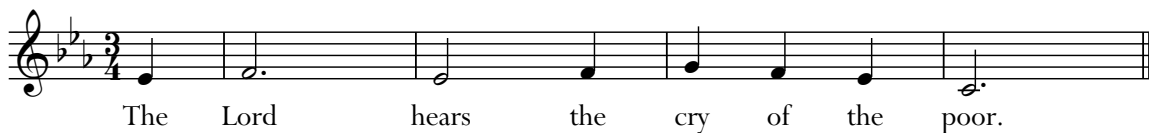

2 Timothy 4:6–8, 16–18

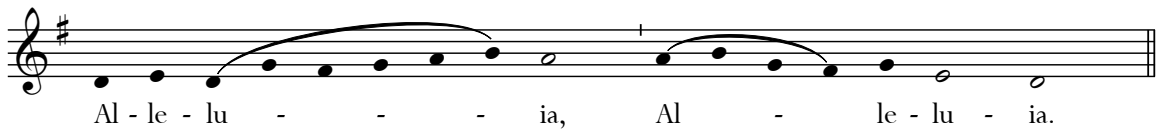

GOSPEL

Luke 18:9–14

I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

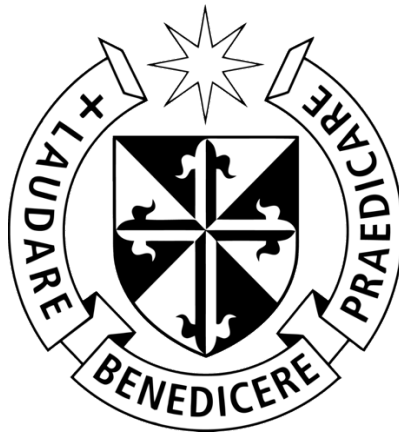
