Isaiah 49:3, 5–6

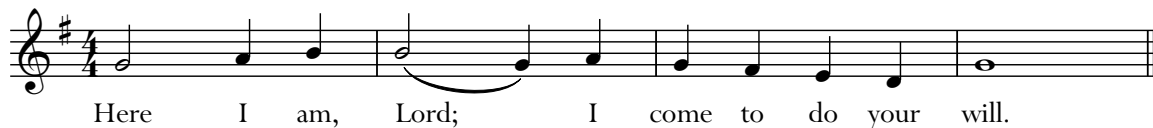

Amen.


