Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.



May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**





LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I Acts 4:32–35

READING II 1 John 5:1–6

Beloved: everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

I saw the tomb of the living Christ, and the glory of the risen one; angelic witnesses resting the shroud and burial cloths.

Arisen is Christ, my hope: he will go before his people into Galilee.

We know Christ to have risen from death, truly:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

May our young people respond to your call with courage and zeal.


Stir among our men a desire and the strength to be good and holy priests.

We lift them up to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right and just.



All kneel


The celebrant says the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:

Amen.



May he, by whose redeeming work you have received the gift of everlasting freedom, make you heirs to an eternal in heritance.


