PENITENTIAL ACT


Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.






THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The celebrant continues with the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, he sings:


Mysterium fidei.


