
PENITENTIAL ACT




LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I



Tell us, O Mary [of Magdala], what did you see in your journey? I saw the tomb of the living Christ, and the glory of the risen one; angelic witnesses resting the shroud and burial cloths. Arisen is Christ, my hope: he will go before his people into Galilee.

We know Christ to have risen from death, truly: O victorious King, have mercy on us. Amen. Alleluia.

John 20:19–31

GOSPEL

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.


RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION


This liturgy is for the Sunday 10 A.M. mass only.

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

The candidate is called forward. The celebrant then prays:

Dearly beloved, with one heart and one soul, let us by our prayers come to the aid of our sister Molly in his blessed hope, so that, as she approaches the font of rebirth, the almighty Father may bestow on her all his merciful help.






PRAYER

Almighty ever-living God, be present by the mysteries of your great love and send forth the spirit of adoption to create the new peoples brought to birth for you in the font of Baptism, so that what is to be carried out by our humble service may be brought to fulfillment by your mighty power. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THANKSGIVING OVER BAPTISMAL WATER

Praise to you, almighty God and Father, for you have created water to cleanse and to give life.



Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, the Father's only Son, for you offered yourself on the cross, that in the blood and water flowing from your side and through your death and resurrection the Church might be born.

Springs of water, bless the Lord; Praise and exalt him above all forever. Praise to you, God the Holy Spirit, for you anointed Christ at his baptism in the waters of the Jordan, that we might all be baptized in you.

Springs of water, bless the Lord; **Praise and exalt him above all forever.**

You have called your daughter Molly to this cleansing water, that she may share in the faith of your Church and have eternal life. By the mystery of this consecrated water, lead her to a new and spiritual birth. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The celebrant invites the candidate to renounce sin and profess her faith.

BAPTISM

Immediately after the profession of faith the celebrant baptizes the candidate:

Molly, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The newly baptized is then clothed with a baptismal garment and presented with a lighted candle.

CONFIRMATION

The celebrant introduces the Rite of Confirmation, and invites the congregation to pray for the candidate. Afterward, the candidate is invited to kneel. The priests lay their hands on the candidate as the celebrant calls upon the Holy Spirit to bestow his graces upon the candidate, concluding with:

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The celebrant anoints the candidate.

Celebrant:	N., be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.
	The celebrant anoints the candidate with chrism oil.

After the final petition, all pray:


Almighty Father, you have created us for some definite purpose. Grant us the grace to know the path you have planned for us in this life and to respond with a generous "Yes."


PREFACE DIALOGUE AND SANCTUS


The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.



THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER


The celebrant continues with the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:


For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever.

May he, by whose redeeming work you have received the gift of everlasting freedom, make you heirs to an eternal in heritance.


