The Archbishop dispenses the faithful from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Please do not come if you feel sick. Those who are vulnerable may consider coming to a less crowded weekday Mass.

HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES

- Keep a prudent distance inside the church. Ushers will help ensure safe seating on Sundays.
- We ask that the faithful wear cloth masks for the sake of the common good. People with breathing difficulties and young children should not wear masks.
- Only friars, sisters, novices, lay ministers and a limited number of staff members will be in the sanctuary and sacristy.
- Volunteers will help wipe down high-touch surfaces between Sunday Masses.

HOLY COMMUNION

- You are not obliged to receive Holy Communion at every Mass you attend. Consider making a spiritual communion, or receiving at a weekday Mass.
- The faithful who choose to receive Holy Communion will come up to the altar rail, where one or two priests will distribute the sacred host. Keep space in line, and only remove your mask at the rail.
- \bullet You may receive in the hand or on the tongue, kneeling or standing. Note: the rail is a high-contact surface.

SHARING THE TRUTH OF THE GOSPEL

The parable of Jesus about the 10 virgins with their lamps (proclaimed in today's Gospel reading) reminds us that we have no lasting dwelling upon this earth as we know it. The kingdom of heaven is that place - more profoundly, that relationship for which each of us is created. Through the gift of faith, we are converted to Jesus as savior and redeemer, embarking upon a relationship of discipleship for the whole of our lives. Our hopes are set upon the fulfillment of salvation and eternal life in friendship with God. Our identity as Christian disciples carries the duty and responsibility for us to cooperate with God's grace so that we may know the truth, love the truth, and live the truth in every area of our lives. Only the truth has grace; only the truth can set us free; only the truth can bring us peace. All truth, in every discipline of study and activity, reveals the goodness and beauty of God.

The encounter we have with Jesus, who identifies Himself as the Truth, impels us to share and communicate what we have learned and experienced with others. As Pope St. Paul VI once wrote, "it is unthinkable that a person should accept the Word and give himself to the kingdom without becoming a person who bears witness to it and proclaims it in his turn." A significant manner through which our parish communicates the truths of God for human flourishing is the operation of our parish school. In a Catholic and Dominican environment, our students are formed as disciples of Jesus and taught the truths of many disciplines so that they may grow in grace and wisdom. In this time of pandemic, our school is open and functioning as "normal" as possible. There has been great collaboration among the administration, faculty, and parents to adjust where needed; and to embrace new ways of teaching and learning. Years ago, when I served here as a parochial vicar, the school earned a National Blue-Ribbon Award for Excellence. Striving for excellence is a continual motivation for it connotes the actualization of each person's gifts, talents, and natural abilities.

ST. GERTRUDE LAUNCHES FAMILY FAITH

The life of faith first begins in the home. The faith life and practices of the parents are the first experience children have with the faith. In fact, the National Study on Youth and Religion found that the faith practices of parents are the single greatest indicators for the faith practices of a child as that child emerges as an adult. This is an ennobling and empowering task that can seem daunting for families who have so many other opportunities and responsibilities surrounding their family life.

With this in mind, our Office of Evangelization took time to pray and discern the direction the Lord was calling us this year. Knowing we couldn't offer Religious Education as we had in years past, we saw the situation we found ourselves in as an opportunity — an opportunity the Lord was giving all of us to reengage family life and faith life together. So, this last summer we developed Family Faith.

Family Faith is a dynamic program that engages the whole family together. Once per month, families gather to engage in family competitions, hands-on activities, breaking open and discussing Scripture, and praying together as a family. We, in the Office of Evangelization, hope that through this program, we can walk with families and equip parents to be the primary witness of the faith to their children.

This last month, families read the creation stories of Genesis 1 and 2 in order to come to a better understanding of who God is as a loving and tender Father and how He welcomes all of us to be a part of His family. Families are then given the ability to continue the conversation at home in their day-to-day life. Throughout the rest of this year, we'll break open stories and read about Biblical figures we've heard before, such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, and Jesus.

This first year, we have a little over one hundred families participating either in person or joining us remotely from home. After our first month, many replied with positive feedback, including:

"...we enjoyed the interaction and getting to complete the activities together while learning."

"Wow, I was impressed how well online [Family Faith] was! ...The curriculum was well thought out, fun, very organized, and thought provoking – my family got a lot out of it!"

"I thought this morning's session was great. It was executed well, timing was perfect and the messaging/content were well delivered and purposeful."

We're excited to continue this new journey in the faith with so many families. Please pray for us as we explore this new territory together.

ASK A PRIEST: AM I GOING TO PURGATORY?

I have a funny uncle (who doesn't?!) who used to end his pranks against us kids with the comedic line, "the Devil made me do it!" Of course, we saw right through this cover-up and quickly set about planning a full counter-attack. In his more contrite and humble moments — admirably, my uncle is that sort of a man — he was in the

habit of repeating the exclamation: "O! I'll be lucky to get into Purgatory!" Yes, in our more truthful moments, each of us may experience similar thoughts and feelings.

The Church teaches that no one can know for certain where he or she is going before death and judgement: i.e., Heaven or Hell. This is the same as admitting that no one of us knows verifiably our current spiritual state — whether we are living in God's grace or not, whether we are "justified" in His sight or not. This is because we cannot *make* ourselves pleasing to God (or anyone else, for that matter). Justification and holy friendship with God is a gift He offers and not something owed to us. Furthermore, it is a gift that you or I are free to reject. This is a scary but real possibility: I could refuse the only One who promises to complete and fulfills. You or I could turn away from God.

During the month of November with its darker days and falling foliage, with a liturgical calendar marked by saints' celebrations and prayers for the dead, Catholics are well poised to think about the "Last



Things:" Death, Judgement, Heaven, or Hell.¹ The month of the Holy Souls is a time in which we have the opportunity to strengthen our ties with "the souls of the just," imitating the holy men and women of old who trusted that God would have mercy on their loved ones.² We might rightly fear the possibility of "waking up" in eternity alongside the demons and the souls of the damned, those who have definitely rejected friendship with God. However, we hope that – sinners though we may be – God would mercifully forgive our sins and failings and welcome us into His gracious embrace now and then.

Purgatory, although inescapably painful, is actually an overwhelmingly happy place. This is because those who go there are assured of God's positive judgement, something we lack during life on earth. As opposed to the "fires" of Hell which torment its inhabitants with the pain of the freely rejected Love of God, the "fires" of Purgatory enable that Love to burn away all that prevents human hearts from embracing the all-good God.³ It is the kind of pain comparable to a weight loss regimen or the withdrawal from an addictive drug. A better and glorious life awaits all who pass through the "fires" of Purgatory. The Church's pastors and doctors have long encouraged us to offer prayers — especially the Holy Mass — to shorten and ease the sufferings of the holy souls in Purgatory.

So, "Am I going to Purgatory?" Well, only God knows that. Assuredly, each one of us will face judgement at the moment of death for our acceptance or rejection of God's grace-filled gifts. At that time, those of us who have received absolution from our sins but still require purification from minor "obstacles" to God's love will go to Purgatory. The present life is indeed a time of testing. Will I make use of the sacraments, those "channels of God's grace"? Will I cultivate holy



associations and friendships with those, living and deceased, who lived in a way clearly receptive of God's mercies? If we give our "yes" to these questions, then we already find ourselves in the good company of God's saints. Whether we face purification here or later, our companionship with Christ and his saints will bring us to the blessed and eternal Vison of God.
