

ASK A PRIEST— WHAT TO SAY TO GOD AT HOLY COMMUNION?

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Sometimes I am at a loss as to what to say or do when I receive holy Communion, even if I was able to follow along with the other parts of the Mass. Would you offer me some guidance?

A: Your question is important (after all, it concerns the art of prayer), but the answer isn't easy. I say "not easy" because art requires knowledge *and* practice. This means you and I probably aren't going to get it perfect the first, second, or even hundredth time.

Holy Communion is a sacred, spiritually enriching time when a Catholic can have a heart-to-heart conversation with God after consuming his Son's body, blood, soul, and divinity present in the Blessed Sacrament. At holy Communion, we are placed in the "school" of the Blessed Mother: Mary is the model student, and the Holy Spirit is the teacher. Mary was accustomed to experience the sacred mysteries of Jesus and ponder them "in her heart" (see Lk 2:19, 51). Practicing meditation and openness to God's work inside us at holy Communion can lead to a loving union with him, like the one Mary enjoyed after she conceived the Son of God in her womb.

First, we can't downplay the vocal prayers and guided reflections offered to us by the Church and the saints. These are designed to encourage meditation on the Christian mysteries and personal appropriation of these works of God which are meant for our salvation. For example, St. Ambrose helps us enter the mystery of the Visitation (see Lk 1:39-56): "[Mary and Elizabeth] speak of the grace they have received while the children are active in secret, unfolding the mystery of love with the help of their mothers, who prophesy at

the spirit of their sons." Acknowledging that every Christian comes into contact with the presence of Christ in mystery (i.e., through celebrating the sacraments), St. Ambrose continues: "Let Mary's soul be in each of you to proclaim the greatness of the Lord . . . Christ has only one mother in the flesh, but we all bring forth Christ in faith." The formal prayers of the Mass certainly encourage us to live out this closeness to Christ—to let his saving mysteries take root *here and now* in our lives. At every Mass, this is the purpose of "Prayer after holy Communion" chanted by the priest. Any one of us could keep that prayer folded in a pocket for the rest of that day so as to repeat it in a free moment.

Second, the time of holy Communion invites that even deeper form of prayer called contemplation. The saints and the structure of the Mass itself give us some steps to follow, but this form of prayer awaits unique discovery by each believer. There is the story of St. John Vianney's question to a parishioner he noticed habitually sitting in the church in front of the tabernacle.

Basically, the saint asked him, "What do you say while you sit there?" The man answered: "I look at him and he looks at me." Ultimately, the Eucharist leads us to enjoy contemplative prayer, sometimes called the prayer of presence. The Catechism characterizes this type of prayer as "a gaze of faith fixed on Jesus, an attentiveness to the Word of God, a silent love." Our own holy Communions and time spent in Eucharistic adoration can come to be just this, even if we're still amateurs in the art of prayer. The Catechism gives some rough steps that can be practiced in harmony with the parts of the Mass. These steps should help us benefit more from holy Communion:

- 1. "Gather up" the heart.
- Recollect our whole being under the prompting of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. Abide in the dwelling place which we are.
- 4. Awaken our faith in order to enter into the presence of him who awaits us.⁴

For those who say "yes" to God's invitation after the model of Blessed Mary, Christ is always coming to dwell within them. May our time at Mass during this new year, as well as every other opportunity for Eucharistic adoration, see more and more "Christ dwell[ing] in our hearts through faith." ⁵
