THE PASTOR AS WE BEGIN 2023

Now that we have concluded the Christmas season and are settling into the beginnings of Ordinary Time—with school and life schedules back to normal—I wanted to share some parish updates about a variety

of items, some new and some old.

SEATING FOR WHEELCHAIRS AND WALKERS

Next time you are in the church, you will notice that the two rows of extra-wide pews in the side section of seating by the rosary altar now have blue placards indicating these are special seating areas where those with limited mobility and their companions have priority seating. During Masses or events where there are not a large number of those with limited mobility, anyone is certainly free to use those pews.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

The strategic planning process for the parish and school that I announced in the bulletin last fall is progressing. A core team of roughly 20 people (a mix of parishioners and parish/school staff) has been meeting once a month for a couple of months now. The core team, working with Sister Maria Christi and myself, has identified seven major challenges we think are facing us as a school and parish at the present time. Beginning in February, there will be larger planning workshops where brainstorming solutions to those challenges will begin. In addition, there will be a parish-wide convocation in May where every single individual and family who is a part of our parish and/or school will be invited to give their input into the process. That date is still being finalized, but we will announce it to everyone as soon as it is confirmed. Stay tuned!

SOUND SYSTEM

We are still in the process of getting bids for our sound system upgrade. This has taken longer than I initially expected but is still in progress. We did do some "tweaking" of the current system in the days before Christmas, which seems to have made some improvement as I had several people make comments to that effect.

DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX

In the next few weeks, all parishioners will receive an email asking them to participate in a survey called the Disciple Maker Index, or DMI. I know many of you might be thinking, "Wait, didn't we just take a survey last fall?" The answer to that question is yes, but these are two very different things. The survey last fall was very brief, general, and simply meant to survey whether you were enthusiastic enough about our parish and school that you would recommend

them to others. The DMI is a more comprehensive survey that is meant to help you reflect on your own journey of faith, your relationship with Our Lord, and whether the various sorts of opportunities we currently offer in the parish are being effective in helping you grow. So the focus is not on things like facilities or grounds or anything of that sort, but really hones in on the ways we are (or aren't) being spiritually effective in what we do. I truly hope everyone—whether you are a longtime parishioner or new to our parish family—takes the time to answer the survey. Because in the end, the most important thing we in parish leadership are called to do is to help you grow closer to God . . . and the DMI is one very important way in which we can assess how well our attempts to do that are bearing fruit.

FINALLY . . . WE HAVE A NEW DOMINICAN PROVINCIAL!

Last weekend, I was away in New York for a special elective assembly of friars representing all of the priories and entities of our province, where we elected a new prior provincial. I am happy to share that we elected Father Allen Moran, O.P. Those who have been in the parish a while will surely recognize that name. He was a novice here in 2000-2001, and more recently, served for five years as the prior here from 2013 to 2018. He knows St. Gertrude quite well, and I am sure he will be attentive to the needs of our parish and priory in his role as prior provincial. Please join me in praying for Father Moran as he takes on this important role in our Dominican province.

IT'S NOT A CLUB; IT'S A VOCATION

St. Gertrude Church has dozens of ministries, groups, programs, and organizations for adults and children of all ages. You are probably familiar with some of them; others you may have never heard of. One group—unique to the Dominicans—is the lay Dominicans, men and women who are dedicated to Dominican spirituality and strive for the sanctification of themselves and those around them.

St. Gertrude Bulletin had the opportunity to speak with Margaret Brecount, a longtime St. Gertrude parishioner and current member

of the lay Dominicans, about why she joined this group and her experience with the Dominican Laity.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What drew you to the Dominican Laity?

Margaret Brecount: Sometimes a particular saint exercises influence over our lives, and we don't realize it until later. This has certainly been the case for me with St. Dominic. His quiet invitation to friendship has stretched across much of my life, but I didn't realize it until I got older.

As a senior in high school, I started occasionally coming to St. Gertrude's 6 p.m. Mass. At the time, I had no idea who the Dominicans were, but I was always drawn to their solid preaching. In college at the University of Dallas, some of the most influential priests on campus were the wise Dominicans who offered daily Mass. By my early 20s, my sister and I had visited the Nashville Dominicans several times, and we were drawn to their strength, joy, and zeal.

My sister entered the order in 1998. But God had other plans for me. While attending a Catholic young adult group, Generation Christ, I befriended the dynamic young man, David Brecount, who had started the group with Father James Sullivan, O.P. David would become my husband in the year 2000, and Father James would marry us!

As David and I followed alongside my sister's religious vocation, we too felt called to participate in this specifically *Dominican* way of living out the faith. In 2002, David and I entered lay Dominican formation together, and the rest is history! We made our final promises as lay Dominicans on the feast of St. Albert the Great, November 15, 2008.

SGB: What has been the biggest struggle of being a lay Dominican?

Margaret: When I was a young homeschooling mother with five little children, I found the daily prayer requirements and monthly

assignments for chapter meetings sometimes heavy, not because these obligations were undesirable, but because I felt spread so thin. I struggled to get enough sleep and then to find connected times of silence for prayer and study; oftentimes I juggled an infant on my hip and lively little ones in the pew as I attempted daily Mass; I would sometimes scramble for babysitters so that we could make our chapter meetings. This season as a young parent was definitely a time of pruning and shaping. Yet, God simultaneously poured out tremendous grace. In those years, for example, with sleeping babies on my lap, I plowed through St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body, encyclicals, saint biographies, Russian novels, and Father Jacques Phillippe books. The Lord took whatever scraps I could give him and cleared space for my intellectual and spiritual formation.



SBG: What has been the biggest blessing of being a lay Dominican?

Margaret: Living this vocation with David has been the biggest blessing. To be sharing a vision with my husband—where we're both headed in the same direction, following the same approach—is so stabilizing.

SGB: What advice do you have for someone contemplating the lay Dominicans?

Margaret: Father James Sullivan advised us decades ago: "The lay Dominican life is not a club. It's a vocation." A deep desire for prayer, study, contemplation, preaching, and teaching, as well as zeal for souls, are all components of the Dominican vocation.

ASK A PRIEST—WHY "SABBATH" ON SUNDAY

Q: Why did the Church shift the obligation to "keep holy the Sabbath" from Saturday to Sunday?

A: There's a historical aspect to this response that I don't feel fully qualified to give! We know that from the earliest days of the Church, Christians

distinguished between the Jewish traditions inherited through the Apostles and a new way of doing things now that Christ (i.e. "Messiah") had come. Sooner or later, the day of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, Sunday, became the more significant day on which to recognize "the Lord's Day of rest." Jews who did not recognize Jesus continued to worship God and rest on the seventh day, Saturday, the traditional "Sabbath" according to the law of Moses.

The Christian celebration of Sunday as the Lord's Day really sets us apart and deserves revisiting throughout our Catholic lives. Why and how do we keep holy the Lord's Day?

Both the Jewish and Christian Sabbaths set their respective believers apart: they communicate a story and an identity. They also ask something of them. Like the Jewish people, Catholics celebrate the dignity of being made "in God's image" (see Gen 1:27) on their day of rest. Sunday designates a day of thanksgiving and enjoyment in communion with God our Creator who gazed upon his creation and saw it "very good." Do we take time on Sunday to imitate God in his rest and to rejoice in it with him and our loved ones?

Once again, like the Jewish people, the Church recognizes that the story of creation continued with God's liberation of his people in history (see Exodus 20:1-11). Jesus, our "new Moses," rescued us from a life of slavery to sin and introduced us to a new life of freedom in God's Holy Spirit through the life of the Church. This happened through Jesus' suffering and death on Good Friday and his resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday. For those redeemed by Jesus' blood and welcomed into the Church through the waters of Baptism, this part of the story is perhaps more significant than our first creation! Here we rediscover our identity as God's beloved children and heirs to his kingdom. Do I "remember the Sabbath day" in accord with countless generations of Catholic Christians who recognized the freedom Jesus came to win?

Our recognition of Sunday, the Christian Sabbath, should not be marked by toil or oppression or fear of these. Jesus teaches this in the Gospels (for example, see Mk 3:1-6). Sunday is a day to celebrate the freedom Jesus won for us by his redemptive death and life-giving resurrection. It can be our joy and happiness to listen to God's Word, to praise God with the Church, to partake in the Bread of Life, and to love our neighbor as a brother or sister. All this can happen on Sunday, thanks to God's gift in Jesus.
