A VERY EXCITING INITIATIVE COMING THIS SPRING

Each and every one of us first received the Holy Spirit at the moment of our baptism, becoming temples of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. As part of that indwelling, the Holy Spirit bestows upon

every single believer a variety of spiritual gifts.

Some of these gifts are given to us for our own sake to aid us in the work of our own sanctification. These are the classic "seven gifts of the Holy Spirit" that are explicitly mentioned in the Rite of Confirmation: wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, fear of the Lord. Every believer receives these same seven gifts as "helps" to us along the way of salvation.

However, in addition to those seven, all of us receive additional spiritual gifts of another sort: a category of gifts known as the *charisms*. Unlike the seven gifts previously mentioned, there is a huge variety of charisms and each person receives different ones. Another difference is that, unlike "the seven," the charisms are given to us not (directly) for our own benefit, but for the good of others. They are gifts that allow us to serve God and others in particular ways that are suited to how God individually created us.

In my experience, many Catholics have never heard of the charisms; or if they have, they know very little about them. It's also been my experience that very few Catholics—even those most involved in the Church—can identify or articulate which spiritual charisms God has bestowed upon them.

And so, this April, we are going to be putting on a very special workshop at St. Gertrude entitled Called & Gifted. The purpose of this workshop, which will be open to all parishioners, is to provide a solid grounding in what the spiritual charisms are and, even more importantly, *provide concrete guidance* helping each person to discern with confidence which spiritual charisms he or she has been given. Having discerned those charisms, it will help point each person in the direction of how God is inviting him or her to serve others. Remember, charisms are given to us not primarily for our own sake, but for the good of others.

I am so incredibly excited about Called & Gifted. Why? First of all, because of the impact it is going to have on our parish. I've said many, many times since my arrival, one of my dreams for this parish is that *every single parishioner*, without exception, is involved in at least one parish ministry or group besides simply going to Mass. It seems to me that sometimes people don't get involved in anything because they aren't sure where they "fit in." I think it's safe to say that anyone who goes through Called & Gifted, and thus gains an understanding of his or her own personal charisms, will be able to easily match up their charisms with the various ministries and initiatives we have here at St. Gertrude Parish. A greater sharing of these spiritual gifts with one another will strengthen our parish, bring us closer together, and lead to a greater fruitfulness in all that we do.

The second reason I am so excited about Called & Gifted is the effect it will have upon each individual getting involved. When someone is able to activate and put to use one of their spiritual charisms, the result of that is that they "come alive." There is a new vigor, an excitement, a joy that wells up within them when they put these gifts into action. I personally can testify to this in my own life; it is a feeling hard to put into words but is one of the most amazing things in the world. It is such a powerful feeling that I want everyone to experience this joy that comes from giving in this way.



January 24, 2024 Feast of St. Francis de Sales

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the feast of St. Francis de Sales, principal patron of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. As a bishop and renowned confessor and spiritual guide, St. Francis de Sales led people to follow the Lord more devoutly, and his writings have inspired countless thousands over the past 400 years to walk the path of holiness. It is good for us to consider how we also can lead people to Christ in our time and place, particularly through the parishes of the archdiocese.

At this midpoint of the second year of Beacons of Light, most Families of Parishes have progressed through Phase 1, which is focused on leadership. The leadership principle states, "Pastors, in collaboration with parochial vicars, deacons and lay ministers, according to their proper roles and charisms, share responsibility for pastoral leadership. The spiritual, physical and mental health and ongoing support of ordained and lay leaders is vital for Families of Parishes."

Beacons of Light is *a process of pastoral planning to best arrange all the resources of the archdiocese to proclaim the Gospel and make disciples in this particular time and place*. The goals and aspirations of this process have their roots in the Great Commission given by our Lord to the apostles: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt. 28:19-20). Thus, the purpose of Beacons of Light is perennial, and will endure well beyond my tenure as your archbishop or the terms of our pastors, parochial vicars, deacons, lay staff, or parishioner leaders.

The decisions regarding how to best arrange resources – human, financial, physical – to pursue our Godgiven mission will be discerned and made locally, specific to the circumstances and opportunities within each Family of Parishes. Leadership is and will continue to be essential to this process. Over the past eighteen months, Family Leadership Teams have come together, key staff members have been designated or are being hired, and leadership training has been provided. This is only the beginning. As the leadership principle of Beacons of Light indicates, there is an ongoing need for priests, deacons, and lay leaders to grow in skill and collaboration to discern the best steps toward missionary discipleship in their respective Families.

In the recent Parish Vitality survey that many of you completed, leadership was identified among the highest needs for the future of our parishes. Please pray for all the leaders – priests, deacons, and lay leaders – in our archdiocese that they may fruitfully encourage others to radiate the love of Christ to all. I am deeply grateful for all of you who, in this way, serve the mission of the Church in and through your parish and Family of Parishes. May God bless each of you as you continue this holy work.
