GOD'S BUILDING BLOCKS

In some ways, I am very much a product of the electronic world we live in today. I browse the internet, use email, have a smartphone (and a smartwatch), regularly post on Facebook, possess a Twitter account (though I don't use that very often), and have at least *some* familiarity with things like

Snapchat, Instagram, and various other means of modern social media.

As anyone who has spent any significant amount of time on these platforms knows, there is a *lot* of "garbage" out there floating around—garbage of all types and varieties, from the merely inane to the false and misleading to the outright morally reprehensible.

That being said, there is also some "good stuff" out there. In fact, there are a lot of positive things to be found in the "electronic universe" as well. There are great sources of solid information about every topic under the sun, stunning pictures of locations most of us will never see in our lifetimes, and even a fair amount of spiritually fruitful and uplifting insights.

I want to share one such item with all of you today. It is a quote, from a noted contemporary Catholic speaker and author, that came across my Facebook feed a while back. It simply states, matter-of-factly: "God made saints out of far worse people than you."

Wow.

Reading it immediately made an impact on me. It put a smile on my face, and the more I pondered that insight, the more I felt like smiling. I found the truth contained in that quote quite comforting: the making of saints is ultimately God's work, not mine. Whatever my past has contained (the good, the bad, the ugly, the beautiful, and everything in between), God looks at me right now and sees plenty of building blocks within me to craft me into a saint. *I just need to let him.*



This is true for all of us. There is absolutely *nothing* in our past—no action, no choice, no sin, no failure—that has the power

to prevent God from turning each of us into living saints. All of us have the necessary building blocks present to be crafted and fit together to become living saints in our world today. Even our sins and failures and mistakes, in some mysterious way, are used by God as building blocks to help shape us into saints. Indeed, we need look no further than the New Testament to see how Jesus seemed to *intentionally* choose people whose histories were less-than-holy to craft them into the first generation of Christian saints: Matthew the tax collector (essentially, in those days, the extortioner), Mary Magdalene (traditionally seen to be the woman caught in adultery and the one of whom it was said had "seven devils" cast out of her), Dismas (the "good thief" crucified along with Jesus), Saul (the persecutor and killer of Christians until his conversion and renaming as Paul), and so many others.

All this reminds me of another great quote that I have also seen floating around the internet recently: "Every saint has a past; every sinner has a future."

My brothers and sisters, God has everything he needs to turn us into saints. Nothing is lacking. Our future is bright. Sainthood awaits! Let us run to meet him, and give him permission to rearrange the building blocks of our lives so as to form us into the saints we were created to be. Amen.

<u>ASK A PRIEST</u> <u>ANGELIC WARFARE</u> CONFRATERNITY

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P. Q: What is the Angelic Warfare Confraternity?

A: Good question! You probably have seen the Angelic Warfare Confraternity listed under our spiritual groups in the bulletin and wondered *what's that*?

The Angelic Warfare Confraternity (AWC) is an official prayer ministry of the Dominican Order devoted to growth in the virtue of chastity with St. Thomas Aquinas (i.e., "the Angelic Doctor") as its patron saint. Chastity is the virtue that ensures the integrity of our human powers to live and to love, especially in regards to the opposite sex.¹ Aquinas was strengthened in this virtue especially in the early part of his life as a Dominican friar, even miraculously being visited by angels whom God sent to ensure this gift. Since everyone, no matter their official state or vocation in life, needs to achieve mastery in the area of sex and love in order to flourish as a human person and a disciple of Christ, a prayer group for chastity can be a big help!

Members of the AWC commit to live chastely—with God's help—in the way most appropriate to their single, consecrated, or married state of life. Everyone prays two special prayers each day (see below) and 15 Hail Mary's for all the other members of the confraternity. A blessed cord, reminiscent of the angels who "girded" St. Thomas with chastity, is worn by members (or, optionally, a blessed medal). Christians must have first received the sacrament of Confirmation in order to officially be enrolled, but anyone can pray the required prayers to some benefit. Whether you feel weak or strong in your ability to see and treat others with purity of heart, this confraternity stores up a treasury of graces available for its members. Here are the daily prayers, recited in addition to 15 Hail Mary's:

Dear Jesus, I know that every perfect gift, and especially that of chastity, depends on the power of Your providence. Without You a mere creature can do nothing. Therefore, I beg You to defend by Your grace the chastity and purity of my body and soul. And if I have ever imagined or sensed anything that could stain my chastity and purity, blot it out, Supreme Lord of my powers, that I may advance with a pure heart in Your love and service, offering myself on the most pure altar of Your divinity all the days of my life. Amen.

Chosen lily of innocence, pure St. Thomas, who kept chaste the robe of baptism and became an angel in the flesh after being girded by two angels, I implore you to commend me to Jesus, the Spotless Lamb, and to Mary, the Queen of Virgins. Gentle protector of my purity, ask them that I, who wear the holy sign of your victory over the flesh, may also share your purity, and after imitating you on earth may at last come to be crowned with you among the angels. Amen.

Enrollments into the AWC will be at St. Gertrude on Saturday, January 28 (10:30 a.m.) and Saturday, March 25 (time is TBD). Any Dominican priest can enroll a confirmed Catholic into the confraternity. 
