CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

Today is the beginning of Catholic Schools Week, which is an opportunity to reflect upon and celebrate the presence and offerings of a parish school. As pastor of a parish with a school, I have a great interest in our school and its operations.

A parish school fits within the overall mission of a parish to bring people to an encounter with Jesus and support their friendship with him as a disciple. Obviously, there is much for children to learn in the entire realm of the arts and sciences, and a Catholic school does well to educate in these disciplines. There is an integrity and coherence in this education because a parish school can communicate to students (and parents) that all truth in every discipline is a reflection of the truth and creative order of God. One might ask what science has to do with God. A Catholic school can communicate that the laws of nature and the intricate functions of the world around us did not evolve out of nothing but reflect an intelligent being who orders creation and makes humanity stewards of it. The study of history not only offers much information but also teaches that God's Providence is revealed in the unfolding of human events. The study of art and music develops an appreciation of beauty and the cultivation of creative gifts.

A parish school provides a unique context of human formation in virtue. Catholic faith provides a clear teaching regarding the dignity of the human person and the excellence which every person can achieve. There are not only natural virtues but also the supernatural virtues that form and strengthen the goodness of a person. As St. Thomas Aquinas teaches, grace builds upon nature and perfects it. Certainly, it is a lifelong process, but a Catholic school education supports the workings of God's grace in each student. Intelligence is formed along with personality and character. Interacting with fellow students are occasions of practicing and perfecting the virtues.

Particularly, a parish school supports parents in their handing on of Catholic faith, doctrine, morality, and service. The school brings parents together with faculty and staff to provide the children with opportunities to encounter Jesus and experience the truths of faith in action. The school day begins and ends with prayer. Classes make devotional visits to the Blessed Sacrament in the school chapel or take a rosary walk on parish grounds. Each week, our students gather for the celebration of the Eucharist with their schoolmates. Regularly, our students encounter the loving mercy of Jesus in the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Christmas pageant helps students to know and embrace the gift of the Incarnation. The rosary procession in October emphasizes the Catholic devotion to Mary, the Mother of God and our mother.

Many people and organizations support the operations of the school. We have parent volunteers who assist with serving lunch each day. There is the PTO that works to develop and sustain good relations between families and faculty and provides schoolwide activities such as Trunk or Treat in October and movie nights that bring school families together in a social setting. The School Advisory Committee (SAC) is a group of parents that provides advice and counsel to the school administration on matters that are

important to families. The Athletic Boosters provide many opportunities for team sports throughout the year. They utilize the Sports Leader program, which is a structured, intentional, and specific method and curriculum to help form leaders and teach virtue in the Catholic tradition. And we have many generous parishioners and alumni who support the school through the monthly in-pew collection, the Annual Fund, and other donations made in support of Catholic education.

In short, a parish school affirms the gift of every student as a child of God and strives to promote and support the full development of a child physically, emotionally, and spiritually. This reflection reminds me of the encouragement of St. Paul found in his letter to the Philippians: "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (4:8). We are truly blessed to have a school as a vital expression of our mission as a parish. It is a blessing to see our children learning and growing in many ways. And how beautiful it is to hear and see our children praying to Jesus with childlike love and sincerity.

As we begin the observance of Catholic Schools Week, I invite everyone in the parish to give thanks to God for our parish school and the administration, faculty, staff, and volunteers who see to its daily operations. I also ask that you share the news about our school with others and encourage families to enroll their children in our school. We have room for more students and resources to make a Catholic education available for all who seek it. The school is an avenue of fulfilling our mission to form minds, hearts, bodies, and souls in all that is good, beautiful, and true. This formation is an encounter with God.



ASK A PRIEST — CANDLEMAS (HOW TO RELISH CHRISTMAS IN FEBRUARY!)

Q: When will we have our next special solemn Mass at St. Gertrude Church?

A: Once again we will mark the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February

2) with a solemn 7 p.m. Mass replete with traditional Romas and Dominican customs. *Candlemas* is the old English name for this feast, so-called because of the blessing of candles and procession that take place before Mass. The candles reflect the light which Jesus has brought into the world, the light he has shared with all the baptized. If you enjoyed our all-stops-out celebration of Christmas at St. Gertrude, then Candlemas is the perfect *inclusio* before you start down the path of Lent, which leads to Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Why celebrate the Presentation of the Lord? During Advent and Christmas/Epiphany we began to recall the joyful mysteries in which God came to his people *and* revealed his salvation to the entire world. The days are sometimes very intentionally sequenced so that the faithful have the sense that the Lord acts in real time and in our real lives. For example, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on January 1 (the final day of the Christmas Octave) was also the celebration of Jesus' circumcision. In Luke 2:21, this ritual was carried out eight days after Christ's nativity, marking him as part of God's people through the covenant with Abraham. On February 2, forty days after Christmas, we are reminded again of the biblical timeline. In Luke 2:22-40, Joseph and Mary brought the six-week-old Christ Child to

the temple to be consecrated to God and for Mary to be purified, in accord with the requirements of the Law of Moses. Besides making the mysteries of Christ's life more accessible to us, this calendar-spread of Christmas feasts invites each of us to take in their salvific meaning and power.

Why Candlemas? If welcoming Christ's light again into your daily life and celebrating Christmas together one last time aren't good enough reasons for you, then I'll lay out some specifics:

- Blessed Candles: Bring or purchase candles for the priest to bless at Mass, so that you can make use of these sacramentals (signs that dispose believers to be more open to God's blessings) at home throughout the year.
- Renewal in Baptismal and Religious Consecration: We continue a custom from the traditional Dominican liturgy where, at the offertory of the Mass, the friars entrust their baptismal light to the superior. Following, all the baptized are invited to entrust themselves to the care of their priests through this symbolic action.
- Latin Chants and Ad Orientem Posture: Once again, we
 offer parishioners and friends a chance to pray the Mass in a very
 traditional, Catholic way that crosses the barriers of time and
 space. Beauty in the liturgy helps lead us back to God.

Every Mass is an opportunity to welcome Jesus Christ, who still comes to live in the consecrated places of our churches, homes, and hearts. Through attending the Eucharist for Candlemas night, even when it's not obligatory, may our personal and communal hope in God's salvation grow and his light be inflamed within us.




