A VENERABLE EPIPHANY TRADITION: CHALKING THE DOORS

There is a long tradition in the Church, going back to the Middle Ages, of blessing houses at the beginning of the year, on or near the celebration of Epiphany. Over time, this developed into a particular ritual, in which blessed chalk was used to mark the

lintel above the front door (and, in some cases, above every door in the house).

This year, we will have baskets of blessed chalk at the entrances to the church during this weekend's Masses. We invite every household to take one piece of blessed chalk home with them to bless their house. There are a number of variations of the formula that a family can use for the occasion; the one below is short and simple, suitable even for families with small children (and thus, small attention spans!). Longer, more elaborate forms of the blessing (based on the pre-Vatican II *Roman Ritual*) can easily be found online.

The blessing can begin with those present making the Sign of the Cross. The one leading the prayers then says:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

The leader then says:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became man two thousand and twenty-three years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.



The lintel of the front door (either outside or inside) is then marked with:

20 + C + M + B + 23

The blessing concludes with everyone present praying the following prayer together:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love. May we be blessed with health, gentleness, and kindness of heart. Fill us with the light of Christ, that we may grow in grace and in the love and knowledge of you. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Side note: There are two meanings to the three letters used in the inscription, which are interspersed between the numerals of the current calendar year. They refer first to the names of the three wise men (whom we celebrate visiting the Christ child on the feast of the Epiphany): Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also are an abbreviation for the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*, meaning "May Christ bless [this] home."

SGB: What do you enjoy most about being a parishioner at St. Gertrude Church?


Susan: When we first moved to Madeira, we visited all the churches in the


ORGAN REPAIR UPDATE

For the month of January, music during the 4:30 p.m. Mass on Saturdays and the 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. Masses on Sundays will be a little different, due to repair work being done on the organ. This leaves us without our principal instrument for accompanying the liturgy, but fear not! Just as the choirs of angels never cease their singing, neither shall we—there will be a strong choral presence as usual at the Sunday Masses, plus we will have a quartet of cantors to support the singing on Saturdays. We will also have a very small pipe organ in the loft to support the choirs (alas, it's too small to accompany the full congregation). During this time, you can expect more hymns than usual, and many old favorites. We anticipate the repair work on the organ will be completed around the end of January. In the meantime, we heartily encourage you to continue to lift your voices in song. Remember, Psalm 100 says, "make a joyful noise unto the Lord." (Note that it doesn't specify the quality of said noise!)

ASK A PRIEST— DOMINICAN ROSARY PILGRIMAGE

Q: What is this I hear about a Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage and a nine-month novena?

A: The Dominicans are going big to promote devotion to the rosary this year,

with nine months of prayer culminating in a national gathering at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., on September 30, 2023. It's our customary Rosary Sunday brought to a whole new level!

Make sure to grab your rosary and a Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage prayer card (in the church or after you sign up at <u>rosarypilgrimage.org</u>) throughout 2023 to ask God for the graces you and our parish need. This prayer can be prayed especially on the 30th day of each month, starting January 30:

God our Father, we thank you for the gift of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we are adopted as your beloved sons and daughters. At Pentecost you poured out the Holy Spirit upon our Lady and the Apostles while they were at prayer.
