
ALL SOULS' DAY MASS

SOME PARISH UPDATES

In my letter in last week's bulletin, I shared some exciting news about a string of major events we will be having in the parish over the next two months to launch our year of preparation for our parish's 100th anniversary. If you missed last week's announcement, please swing by the parish office to pick up a copy of last week's bulletin

or view the bulletin online at <u>stgertrude.org/bulletin</u>. Information about those events can also be found at <u>stgertrude.org/centennial</u>. This week's letter I will devote to updates on some slightly more mundane matters that are still of great importance to us as a parish.

HANDICAPPED SEATING

By the time this bulletin goes to print, our facilities staff will have removed a pew from the seating section in front of the rosary altar to create a second "extra wide" pew. This will give us two full pews that are able to accommodate those with wheelchairs, walkers, etc., as well as their family members. In the near future, we will have those pews marked with blue signs, indicating that they are priority seating for those with limited mobility.

PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Before COVID, it was the custom throughout the archdiocese that at the conclusion of the Universal Prayers (Prayers of the Faithful) at Sunday Masses, the entire congregation would pray together the "Prayer for Vocations," written by Archbishop Schnurr. We will be resuming that custom beginning next week. The prayer will be printed in each week's pew booklet so that all can follow along. This is a good reminder of the importance all of us have in praying for—and encouraging—priestly and religious vocations among our young people.

CHURCH CEILING

Several weeks ago, during that stretch of multiple days of very heavy rain, we experienced some water leaking into the church from the ceiling. Our facilities staff was able to discover the cause—a clogged drain in the roof combined with several fissures in the waterproof coating of the roof. The drain was cleared and the fissures sealed, so there will not be any additional leakage. However, the interior ceiling materials became quite soaked in the process. As the ceiling has been slowly drying over these past weeks, there has continued to be some material flaking off and falling to the ground. As soon as the ceiling has fully dried, this will stop. At some point, we will look to repair the interior damage, but as high as that ceiling is, such a project will involve either interior scaffolding from floor to ceiling or some sort of interior crane (which will require temporarily removing a section of pews). Neither of those options will be quick, easy, or cheap, and so I do not have any ETA on repairs at this point.

SOUND SYSTEM UPDATE

We have begun reaching out to companies that have the expertise to make improvements to the quality of the church sound system. It is my hope that in the next few weeks we will begin receiving concrete bids that we can begin to evaluate. I will continue to keep the parish updated as this process continues.

PRIEST CONVOCATION

Two weeks ago, Father Joachim and I attended the four-day convocation of the priests of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, held at a conference center about four hours from here. It was a very good experience. As both of us are new to the area, it allowed us to meet many of the priests and spend some time learning about them and the parishes they serve. There were also some truly excellent presentations from two Catholic organizations. The first was Divine Renovation, which helps parishes move from a "maintenance mode" to a "mission mode," with a focus on growing a parish in numbers and engagement through evangelization, hospitality, and discipleship. The other organization was the Catholic Leadership Institute, which specifically works with priests to help them become better leaders in the midst of the challenges and changes we are experiencing in the Church today. While it was hard to be away from the parish for nearly a week, it was time well-spent. I am grateful to Father John Mark for remaining behind to run the parish in my absence and to the other priests in our Dominican community who took on extra responsibilities that week.

Looking forward to the next few months and the launch of our centennial celebrations!


FAITH RALLY

OHIO MARCH FOR LIFE: PROTECTION FOR THE UNBORN

West Gardner, a twenty-something St. Gertrude Church parishioner, attended the October 5 Ohio March for Life at our state capitol. Here is a first-hand account of his powerful experience.

"I love my life!"

These simple yet solemn words brought tears to my eyes as they echoed throughout the crowd gathered before the Ohio Statehouse for Ohio's first annual March for Life.



Amongst speeches from clergy, politicians, and directors of various ministries, these words spoken by 10-year-old Victor Cabrera-Henriquez are a testament to the sacredness of life and family in a culture that continues to attack these

pillars of civilization. Ten years ago, Victor's mother, Ruth Cabrera-Henriquez, faced a daunting pregnancy as a single mother. Despite recommendations from her doctor to abort Victor, the compassion, information, and resources offered by a local pregnancy care center helped Ruth choose life—a decision she and her precious son, Victor, could never regret today. Now, the two travel the country to empower the fight for life by sharing their testimony and those sweet words, "I love my life!"

Standing before the stage in a sea of pro-life warriors and partaking

in cheers and tears evoked from the various speakers was the perfect way to enter into our march through the streets of downtown Columbus. After thousands of us lined up on High Street with signs in one hand and rosaries in the other, we began our witness for the unborn. Every step taken, every Hail Mary prayed, every protester loved was a physical and spiritual victory in the fight for the lives of

Ohio's most vulnerable.

While I've marched for the end of abortion at our nation's capitol, marching in Columbus alongside fellow St. Gertrude Church parishioners felt different than before. Perhaps this is because of the increased priority to advocate for life at the state level after the recent Supreme Court decision to overturn *Roe v. Wade.* Perhaps it's because of the heightened impact that my presence and prayers have the opportunity to make at Cincinnati's Planned Parenthood on Auburn Avenue, which still kills a school bus worth of children in our community every week. Regardless, if there's one thing I learned from the October 5 march, it's

that the pro-life movement is more important now than ever before

Marching was an incredible way to pray for the preborn, demonstrate pro-life passion to our politicians, and witness to pregnant mothers that there is a community of people and



families ready to love and support them and their child. However, we don't just put on our pro-life shirt and precious feet pin one day of the year to march; as Christians, we are called to constantly fight against any injustice as severe as the genocide of abortion. Thankfully, Cincinnati has so many ways to be a voice for the voiceless! Support Cincinnati Right to Life, our local pregnancy resource centers, or attend the 40 Days for Life Vigil currently being held through November 6. (See page 5 in this bulletin for more information.) Most importantly though, pray the rosary! This is a spiritual battle, and so it can only be won through spiritual weapons.

And in all of this, recall the famous words of pro-life champion Congressman Henry Hyde to encourage you in this battle:

"When the time comes, as it surely will, when we face that awesome moment, the final judgment, I've often thought, as Fulton Sheen wrote, that it is a terrible moment of loneliness. You have no advocates, you are there alone standing before God -- and a terror will rip your soul like nothing you can imagine. But I really think that those in the pro-life movement will not be alone. I think there'll be a chorus of voices that have never been heard in this world but are heard beautifully and clearly in the next world -- and they will plead for everyone who has been in this movement. They will say to God, 'Spare him, because he loved us!'"



Q: Why is it critical to vote pro-life in November's elections?


A: Please join us for our Evening for Life: Pro-life Panel Event on Tuesday, October 25, at 7 p.m. for a better and more complete answer to this question. But in

short, the Ohio State Supreme Court justices and the legislators that we elect in November will be setting precedents and enacting laws regarding abortion in Ohio that could last for generations. It took almost 50 years for the United States Supreme Court to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, a 1973 ruling that had interpreted a right to abortion into the US Constitution. We do not want to face a similar struggle in the state of Ohio by sitting on our hands this November. Millions of children and women in this state will be killed and hurt through the grisly procedure that abortion is if we do.

The bishops of the United States have pointed out well that there are other issues in addition to abortion that go into building the culture of life that we all want to see take hold in our country; but as they also point out, not every issue is morally equivalent. Some goods are more important than others. Also, the paths to achieving certain goods are very uncertain and debatable. Abortion goes directly against the greatest natural good that we are given, which is life itself. Furthermore, it is never a morally legitimate path to achieving any good. There is always a better answer than abortion to the real problems that pregnant women face. In an election in which abortion is the most prominent issue due to its being sent back to the states by the overturning of *Roe v. Wade* this past summer, it is all the more important to get pro-life justices and politicians into office.

The following people make up our outstanding group of panelists who will be speaking on October 25 to educate us more on the cause for life and the situation in Ohio at this point in time:

- Aurora Tinajero Aurora is a mother who found herself in a crisis pregnancy and chose life and is now a pro-life speaker and radio show host. - Philip Williamson St. Gertrude church parishioner and an attorney recognized in Best Lawyers: Ones to Watch, Philip works extensively with Alliance Defending Freedom and filed an amicus brief at the Supreme Court in the Dobbs case that overturned Roe v. Wade.
- Brenna Lewis Brenna is a St. Gertrude Church parishioner

 young people to be leaders in the pro-life movement.
