

ACCOMPANIMENT THROUGH THE STAGES OF DISCIPLESHIP

TYLER CASTRUCCI, COORDINATOR
OF ADULT EVANGELIZATION

Welcome back to part 3 of our series on the stages of discipleship! Part 1 outlined the stages, and part 2 was a brief overview of Walter's personal journey to discipleship. While last week's article

was from the first-person perspective of someone being converted to the Lord, this week is from the perspective of accompanying someone going through a conversion. Accompaniment can take many different forms, depending on the circumstances. In general, there are two guiding principles that always apply: listening and patience. It can be tempting to always want to have the "right" answer to a difficult question, or to try and convince someone of the truth of Church teaching but, oftentimes, this can end up pushing someone further away, especially when done too early in the process. The virtue of patience can give us the strength to listen more than we talk and to leave room for the Holy Spirit to lead the way. Names and some personal details have been changed, but the events all really happened!

Trust - Positive association with Christianity and/or Christians

When I first met John, he was living a very secular lifestyle and mildly involved with a Masonic group. He was very interested in philosophy and ancient literature but was very skeptical about Christianity and the concept of God in general. His mother was a disciple of the Lord and prayed regularly for her son's conversion. She was the bridge of trust between John and the Church. At this point, I was primarily focused on being a friendly face and getting to know him as a person.

Curiosity – Intrigued by Christianity, but not willing to change one's life yet

After my many years of praying and extending invitations, John finally decided to check out an RCIA class that I was leading. He was interested in learning more about Christianity, but it was primarily an intellectual exercise at this point. In particular, he was intrigued by the five "proofs" for the existence of God that St. Thomas Aquinas gave in his *Summa Theologiae*. The well-reasoned arguments of Aquinas made sense to John, and he began to express interest in learning more

about other facets of the faith. I tried to answer his questions but always framed my responses as a proposition or redirected questions back to him to get him to wrestle with an idea. My goal was to keep our conversations going and not stifle his curiosity.

Openness – Open to a personal relationship with God and changing one's life, but not committed yet

As more and more of John's questions about Christianity were answered, his walls began to come down. When I would talk about Catholicism in one-on-one conversations, he began to use more positive language. Intellectually, things were beginning to "click," and the idea of having a relationship with Jesus was now on the table as a possibility. He was very intrigued by the Eucharist, so I invited him to check out adoration. Introducing him to new and different forms of prayer was powerful in this stage.

Seeking – Everything in life is reexamined in light of Jesus

To my great surprise (and delight), John strolled into the church one day with a daily Roman missal in hand and talked to me about how much he loved the beautiful prayers of the Mass. Every time I saw him, he would talk to me about a different book he was reading about Catholicism or a passage from the *Summa* that he was wrestling with. He was beginning to attend Mass regularly and signed up to do Eucharistic adoration on a weekly basis. The way he lived his life was beginning to change, and he was now asking me more pointed questions about morality and the precepts of the Church. He was counting the cost of following Jesus and beginning to realize it was worth it. I was now able to challenge him to take the next step and commit.

Discipleship – Saying "yes" to Jesus and committing to following him

Thanks be to God, John did take the next step and said "yes" to the Lord. His conversion had a ripple effect on his whole family. His child was baptized, he was married in the Church, and ultimately completed his sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil Mass. From then on, he became a daily Mass goer and regularly volunteered to help with events and ministries in the parish. There was still a lot more that he wanted to learn about the faith and his journey of growing in relationship with the Lord was certainly not over, but he was now a disciple.



HOLY TEACHING



ASK A PRIEST—PRAYER

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P.

Q: Do you have any advice about prayer? **A:** In the Office of Readings this past week, the second reading has excerpts from St. Augustine's letter to Proba about prayer. Proba was a wealthy and noble widow who had asked St. Augustine for some advice on the subject. His long letter in response contains an abundance of insights into how

and why we should pray. Here are a couple of them.

Pray not in order to change God, but to change yourself. It's a common objection that if God already knows what we need, why should we pray? St. Augustine says that we pray not to inform God about something but to "exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it." Time, effort, intentionality all increase our desire for something. An athlete aiming to win a championship spends lots of time thinking about it and working toward it, and this helps him to want it more. Then, when the championship is won, he enjoys it more.

Our desire grows slack, St. Augustine says, because of all the other thoughts and pursuits that we engage in that distract us. When we return to prayer, our desire is renewed. All prayer should, in the end, be directed back to the most essential thing—God. So, St. Augustine recommends making the Psalmist's prayer our own: "One thing I ask of the Lord; this I seek: To dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the Lord, to visit his temple" (Ps. 27:4). We pray not to change God's mind or to get something from him but in order to be more able to receive the gift of God himself. We pray to conform our will to God's as Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Father, not my will, but thine be done."

Pray frequently, but there's no need for an excess of words. St. Augustine cites the monks in Egypt who would frequently offer short prayers "hurled like swift javelins." These prayers offered up would turn their minds and hearts to God once more. Whatever desire was stirred up by them, they would let last as long as it would. Praying for a long time doesn't mean continually speaking. That becomes burdensome. Just desiring God is itself a prayer. "To spend much time in prayer is to knock with a persistent and holy fervor at the door of the one whom we beseech.


This task is generally accomplished more through sighs than words, more through weeping than speech."




