

# ANNOUNCING THE LAUNCH OF A YEAR OF PREPARATION FOR OUR PARISH CENTENNIAL

Just over a year from now, on the Feast of St. Gertrude the Great (November 16, 2023), our parish will celebrate its 100th anniversary. Major anniversaries like this are a time of profound graces and blessings.

To help us prepare for this historic anniversary, we will be holding a variety of events during the year ahead. A group of parishioners has been working very closely with me in planning these events, and we are now able to announce some amazing things that will be happening over the next two months to kick off our centennial preparation year.

# KICK-OFF MASS Sunday, October 30 | 10 a.m.

We are honored to have the Most Reverand Christopher Cardone, O.P., Archbishop of Honiara (Solomon Islands), as the celebrant and homilist for the Mass that will officially begin our centennial preparation year. As many of you know, Archbishop Cardone is a member of our Dominican Province of St. Joseph and served at St. Gertrude Church as a young priest before he began his missionary work. There will be a reception with the archbishop following Mass.

# THREE WEEKS, THREE EVENTS: TRUTH, BEAUTY, AND GOODNESS

During the three weeks between the opening Mass with Archbishop Cardone and our parish's celebration of St. Gertrude's feast day this year, we will have one major event each week, focusing on one of the three "transcendentals" of truth, beauty, and goodness.

# WITNESS TO TRUTH: THE VIGIL OF ALL SAINTS

This special liturgy will be an evening of focusing on the varying ways saints throughout history have witnessed to the truth of our faith. # THE POWER OF GOODNESS: CHARITY IN THE MIDST OF SUFFERING – A UKRAINIAN FAMILY SHARES THEIR STORY

Over six months ago, the armies of Russia invaded the nation of Ukraine, causing untold suffering and leading to millions of Ukrainian refugees fleeing their homeland. Our parish will welcome one such refugee family who will share not only their first-hand account of the horrors of the situation in Ukraine, but also how the goodness and charity of so many allowed them to survive and eventually find their way to the United States to begin their life anew.

How should you respond when your efforts seem small in the face of the culture of death? The following excerpt from "Homily of the Holy Father John Paul II" answers this fundamental question and explains that changing the culture is a process of conversion that begins in our own hearts.

# **HOW TO BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE**

# **Our Christian Identity**

To understand more fully how to defend and protect human life, we must first consider who we are, at the deepest level. God creates us in his image and likeness, which means we are made to be in loving relationship with him. The essence of our identity and worth, the source of our dignity, is that we are loved by God: "We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of his Son."[1]

We are called to divine intimacy, true communion with God, and we can grow in this closeness with him through daily prayer, reading the Scriptures, and frequent participation in the sacraments, especially Confession and the Eucharist.

### **Our Mission as Christians**

The knowledge and realization of how deeply we are loved by God elicits a response of love that simultaneously draws us closer to God and, at the same time, impels us to share his love with others.

Embracing a relationship with God means following in his footsteps, wherever he may call. Just as Jesus invited St. Peter and St. Andrew to become his disciples, he invites us to do the same: "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19).

Being a disciple of Jesus naturally includes sharing the Gospel with others and inviting them into a deeper relationship with God. As Christians, our identity and our mission are two sides of the same coin; like the apostles, we are called to be missionary disciples.

# **Missionary Discipleship**

This doesn't necessarily mean quitting our jobs or moving to foreign countries. For most of us, our mission field is daily life: "Christ teaches us how to evangelize, how to invite people into communion with him, and how to create a culture of witness: namely, through love. A Christian life lived with charity and faith is the most effective form of evangelization."[2]

The first step towards living this life is allowing Jesus to meet and transform us daily. If we respond to his grace, our lives will show we have something beyond what the world offers: we follow a person whose love changes our lives, so we want others to also experience his transforming love.

When we live in union with God, open to his prompting, we're more able to see the opportunities for witness and his guidance in responding to these opportunities. We may fear doing the wrong thing or saying the wrong thing, but we do not need to be afraid. Jesus promised his disciples, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).

## **Identity Crisis**

As a society and as individuals, we often measure ourselves by false standards: by what and how much we do, our successes or failures, how others treat us, the degree of our pleasure or independence, etc. And when these changeable substitutes prove to be insufficient, or when we are faced with challenges and suffering, we may feel helpless, alone, or abandoned; we may be tempted to feel as though our lives have decreased value or worth.

But God's love—individual, real, unchanging—is the true source of our worth, identity, and dignity. It really is not a question of who we are, but rather whose we are. Because his love will never change, nothing can reduce our God-given dignity, and nothing can diminish the immeasurable worth of our lives.

# **Our Response**

When someone is facing great trials, we need to meet them where they are, walk with them on their journey, intercede for them, and be open to sharing Christ's love however he directs.

When a woman becomes pregnant, and her boyfriend threatens to leave if she continues the pregnancy, we need to lovingly walk with her. When family members or friends become seriously ill, we need to assure them that God still offers them something in this life, and they still have purpose. We need to consistently be with them every step of the way. Sometimes our actions speak for themselves; other times, words are needed. Whatever the situation, Jesus knows how to speak to each person's heart; we simply need to follow where he leads.

# A Culture of Life

This is how we answer our missionary call. This is how we build a culture of life, a culture that joyfully proclaims the truth of God's love, purpose, and plan for each person. Changing the culture is a process of conversion that begins in our own hearts and includes a willingness to be instructed and a desire to be close to Jesus—the source of joy and love.

When we encounter Christ, experience his love, and deepen our relationship with him, we become more aware of our own worth and that of others. His love for each person is cause for great joy, and growing understanding of this priceless treasure motivates us to share his love with others. Our lives are often changed by the witness of others; so too, others' lives may be changed by our witness and authentic friendship with them.

Let us go, therefore, and not be afraid. God is always with us.

# ASK A PRIEST—RCIA/ BECOME CATHOLIC UPDATE

**Q:** How are things going so far this fall with the parish RCIA/Become Catholic program?

**A:** As the director of our Become Catholic program, I get this question a lot this time of year! First, I can say that *things* 

are certainly going—God is at work bringing people into full communion with the Catholic Church here at St. Gertrude Church! They want to know more about what's going on here, and not only at the surface level. Frequently, they are responding to something God has been up to in their hearts and minds for quite some time. Candidates for RCIA and RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and Children, respectively) don't arrive at our door by accident!

This Sunday at the 12 p.m. Mass, offering thanks to God, we get to witness a major step in God's grace-filled action in the life of our catechumen, Rebecca. In August, she was formally welcomed into the catechumenate after a year with the Become Catholic program. Now, Rebecca will receive the sacraments of initiation: Jesus will baptize, confirm, and nourish her with his sacred Body and Blood through the sacraments of initiation and at the hands of priests. I hope you can make it to bask in the light of these sacred mysteries, renew your own commitment to Christ, and offer Rebecca your support. Please come to the reception afterwards to congratulate her and her family who join us from out of town.

Second, I like to remind people who ask "how's RCIA going" what I need to frequently remind myself: It's not about numbers. While a robust Become Catholic group each year stokes the faith of those of us who are already Catholic, we need to respond to the actual needs of those who approach us wanting to learn more. I'm sure there are more people who wish to become Catholic than the roughly 20 adults and children with whom I am currently working with in Become Catholic, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, and through private instruction. But these people need much encouragement and prayers from us. Life is complicated, and sometimes, as in Rebecca's case, more time is needed outside the annual Become Catholic schedule. That said, I would encourage

non-Catholic inquirers to attend our Monday night sessions.

Please don't pass up this opportunity! Recognizing our limitations but wanting to be faithful apostles of Christ, let's all take to heart what St. Paul says to Timothy (2 Tm 2:9-10): "the word of God is not chained. Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus."


