WHEN A GALLERY OF SAINTS IS MORE THAN JUST "DRESS UP" (AND THE LESSON IT TEACHES US ADULTS)

It was exactly two weeks ago that the second graders from our St. Gertrude School held their annual Gallery of Saints at the Parish Center and in the gym after

the 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday, October 30. They then repeated their presentations for their fellow students in the school the following Tuesday on All Saints Day. As you might expect, a big part of the fun of attending such an event is looking at all of the saintly costumes the children wear. It was a joy to see little St. Bernadette dressed like a French peasant girl, standing next to Our Lady of Lourdes. I observed a small St. Lawrence, complete with a metal grill and tissue-paper flames across his chest. There was St. Faustina, who told me all about Jesus' Divine Mercy, and St. Andrew Kim Taegon, who told me about his fellow Korean martyrs. I even got to meet my namesake, Pope St. John Paul II! The variety of saints the children chose was wonderful to see. The gathering was joyful, energetic, and in many ways, wonderfully cute and adorable.

But it was so much more than cute and enjoyable. It was **formative**. These children had worked very hard to memorize all sorts of details about the lives of their saints. They knew about the saints whose costumes they were wearing. They were inspired by their stories. When these little boys and girls memorized the stories of these saints and came to church and school dressed as them, they were—at least in some small way—saying in their own way, "I want to be like my saint."

That's a beautiful thing. Children want to imitate what they are around, imitate who they see, imitate the stories they hear and read. If we surround our children with pictures and statues and images of saints, if we read them stories and fill their imaginations with tales of the heroic and beautiful lives those saints lived . . . they are going to want to grow up to be like them. It's just the way children are. The more we lay these images and stories before them, the more they will aspire to imitate their great example.

So, what about us—as in, us adults? Our lives, too, are filled with images and stories. Sadly, for many of us, those images and stories are not of the saints, but of so many other less beautiful and less noble things. So often, they are images and stories of violence in our society, political parties at war with each other, corporate greed, selfishness, and so on. Maybe in our transition to adulthood, too many of us have lost (or perhaps we never had) these saintly images and stories before our mind's eye.

The good thing is, we can do something about that. Take a look around your house, your office, your garage, your kitchen, your desk. Are there images of the saints constantly before your eyes as you go

throughout your day? And if not, why not? We have a wonderful Catholic gift shop right here in Madeira, not even a mile from the church. Maybe it's time to stop in and purchase a statue or image of a saint or two. And how about reading material—when is the last time you, as an adult, read a biography of a saint or a spiritual work penned by one of our great saints? (And for those with children,



I don't mean reading a children's story about a saint to your child. I mean you, as an adult, reading a full-fledged adult biography of a saint.) If it's been too long, November—the month of All Saints—is the perfect time to do something about it. I encourage everyone to fill your vision and your imagination with at least one saint over the weeks ahead. If you do so, I'm sure you will be inspired to imitate the saint you have chosen, just as the children at our Gallery of Saints were so inspired.

Oh, and for you adults: wearing a costume is optional. \odot God bless,



ASK A PRIEST — A PROVIDENTIAL PAIRING: ST. GERTRUDE AND OUR PARISH

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Why was St. Gertrude, a Benedictine nun, chosen to be the patroness of a Dominican parish?

A: The workings of divine Providence are

mysterious, wonderful, and sometimes humorous. As I understand it, our parish was established on November 16, 1923, the Feast of St. Gertrude the Great. So *voilà*, we have our patroness (I defer to our centennial book committee for more information here)!

But our association with this thirteenth-century German mystic isn't just a calendar-accident; it's part of a divine plan that faith can help us uncover. First and most basically, St. Gertrude was a nun of the monastery of St. Mary at Helfta in modern-day Eastern Germany. This aligns with the German roots of so many of our parishioners and other Cincinnatians over the years. Second and more deeply, St. Gertrude was a consecrated religious, like the Dominican friars and sisters who have served our parish for most of its history. Sister Mary Jeremy, O.P., explains that our saint was a member of an independent Cistercian-inspired Benedictine abbey devoted to choral divine worship, study, and the education of young women. Furthermore, her community frequently had Dominican friars as preachers and spiritual directors. This highlights a third connection with our

parish: our elementary school run by Dominican sisters and administered by Dominican priests. These three providential connections of our parish to our patroness reveal something that God has been doing in Madeira for almost 100 years.


This said, I think we can take our St. Gertrude connection even further—and this year is the perfect time to do so! There is one way our patroness is very relatable to everyone who walks through our doors: her conversion story. When we scratch the surface of St. Gertrude's life, we find a fascinating woman of the Middle Ages: personally brilliant, driven, passionately in love with God, and not without weaknesses and flaws. It turns out that, like other saints, holiness did not come all at once for St. Gertrude. Entrusted to her abbey (perhaps an orphan?) from age five, she assimilated a rigorous intellectual formation but lacked the spirituality one would associate with being reared by nuns. Her pride, vanity, and curiosity, by her own admission, led her to significant sadness and anxiety by the time she was 24.

St. Gertrude then had a profound encounter with Jesus Christ, even after having lived so long as a Catholic and even a nun. In a dream-like vision, she saw and heard a young man who challenged her vanity and proposed a real commitment to her aching heart. She fell in love with God's Son. The spiritual life of her soul began to take precedence over other pastimes. This gave new life to her more professional talents of scholarship and teaching and afterward she labored to help others who were less brilliant attain similar fruits of study and contemplation. Jesus—not Church politics or natural aptitudes—made her St. Gertrude the Great.

How has our parish life, inspired and aided by St. Gertrude the Great, influenced you? How has God worked through St. Gertrude to enrich your life or that of your family? Hopefully, this is a question we can keep before us individually and together as we begin our centennial celebrations. St. Gertrude the Great, pray for us!


