FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



THANKSGIVING

In just a few days, our nation will celebrate the national holiday known as Thanksgiving. For many, it will be a day highlighted by a meal of turkey and "all the fixings," enjoying a day (or maybe even two) off work, and perhaps watching (or even playing) some football.

But in our spiritual lives as Catholics,

thanksgiving is not something limited to one day a year. Rather, it is something that is meant to characterize our lives every single day. In fact, it is such a crucial part of our spiritual lives that I hardly believe it is possible to really grow in holiness if one is not living in a state of thanksgiving.

St. Paul often wrote about the importance of thanksgiving. "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess

5:16-18). And again, "Persevere in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving" (Col 4:2). And Jesus himself taught about the importance of this during the incident where he healed 10 lepers (Luke 17:11-19). After healing all 10 and only having one of them return, Jesus says, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" (Luke 17:17-18).

Indeed, it is so important that "in all circumstances" we give thanks. And yet I suspect that many of us struggle with that, at least from time to time. So I would offer a few practical suggestions that might help you to cultivate a greater sense of thanksgiving in your own life.

 Avoid the temptation to focus on what you don't have; always keep your eyes fixed on what you've already been given.

Focusing on what we don't have is always going to be a dead end road, because there will always be things we don't have. Instead, work to cultivate a spirit of gratitude in your life for what you do have; what you have been given. This can be as simple as making it a part of your daily prayer routine to intentionally call to mind one blessing from the previous day and thank God for that blessing. It could be something big; most days it will probably be something rather small. The more we can be intentional about that, the better and better we will become at identifying and truly seeing the gifts and blessings we've been given.

2) Avoid the temptation to focus on what **others have**. This sounds simple, but it can be *so difficult*. The comparison game can be deadly to both our spiritual lives and our mental health. It seems that the world around us is constantly trying

to get us to focus our eyes on what others have (that we don't). This tends to lead to envy and all sorts of related vices, and in its extreme form, can actually blind us from recognizing the good things we have received because our eyes are so focused on others. Instead, let us keep our eyes fixed on the Lord, for as Jesus taught, "Your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Matt 6:8).

So, my brothers and sisters, as we celebrate Thanksgiving this coming week, let us all realize that what lies at the heart of this holiday is not turkey or football, but the intentional cultivation of a spirit of gratitude toward God in our lives, 365 days a year. God bless,

ASK A PRIEST— CAN WE MESS UP GOD'S PLAN FOR US?

Q: Can our own free will take us off God's plan for us?

A: In my attempt to answer this question, I thought of the great composer Amadeus

Mozart. His melodies sound unsophisticated and effortless. Yet, they hide depth and mastery of art that a superficial view can never grasp. So, it is easy to say that yes, human beings can opt to be outside—or even to oppose—God's plan of salvation. A certain Hitler and Stalin are eloquent proofs of the opposition to God and his plan of saving human beings.

The same question can be treated differently: It is a fact that opposition to God crosses human history. Such opposition is easy to detect in the Bible and beyond. There are faithful witnesses in every generation who die out of love for God. There are also those who put them to death. Dying for God is optional, putting to death God's friends is optional, too. Both attitudes are possible because of a free decision. The question that lingers is whether God knows both kinds of human beings. Does he *predestine* certain people to be martyrs and others to be their executioners? Are these two groups free to choose their sides? Here the answer starts to be confessional. Indeed, *predestination* is an important part of Reformation theology.


Let us go back to the historical example above mentioned: Is Hitler, his existence and policy, part of God's plan of salvation? If the answer is yes, we must include the consequence of his policy also: the 42 million dead and injured of the second world war. In other words, God has a plan that includes millions who perished in the Holocaust and much more who died victims of the war. Here the question receives yet again another form: How to reconcile the Biblical image of the tender God the Father with the God whose plan implies atrocity and victims. Are we still speaking about God "who in the desert carries you like a man carries his child" (Deuteronomy 1:31), the God "who is love" (1 John 4:8)?

God is the loving Father whose plan of salvation is to gather to himself the human beings who, through the first rebellion, have chosen to leave him. To have a clear idea about

the human part in God's plan of salvation, two confusions have to be clarified. The first confusion is between *knowledge* and *responsibility*. God knows everything, from the beginning of the cosmos to its end. Everything is known instantly to him. We have past, present, and

future. God sees all the *times* as one instant. He knew about Hitler before his birth. Yet, his knowledge does not make him responsible. He knows all that I did, am doing, and will do. But I and I alone am responsible for my actions. Otherwise, he is responsible for all the evil that human beings may commit. The other confusion concerns human *nature*: God willed us to be free. Freedom always implies choice. I am free if I exercise my choice between two possibilities, at least. Animals are not free because they have no choice—they have to preserve themselves to perpetuate the species. We are created to be free—we have the choice between **yes** and **no**. This applies to our relationship with God as well. We have the freedom to join his plan of salvation or to reject it. Take away this choice and we will be like animals, with no choice but to follow our instinct.

God's relationship with humanity is represented by two comparisons from the Book of Genesis to the Book of Revelation. The first comparison presents God as Father and human beings as his children. Like loving parents who care for their child hoping that their child will love them back (but also knowing that their child may choose to do the opposite), such is our God in his relationship to the human race. The other comparison represents humanity as the bride and God as the bridegroom. Just imagine that the bride has no choice but to say "yes" to the bridegroom and you will see how wrong it is to say that we have no choice in our association with God. Out of love, God created us free . . . with the hope that we choose him and with the risk that we reject him.


