Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and offer a sacrifice of praise and worship to God who calls each of us to share in his own blessed life through his Son and in the grace of the Holy Spirit. The celebration of this feast engages our faith to believe that Christ is not a king of dominance or

subjugation. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI writes: "The feast of Christ, the King is therefore not a feast of those who are subjugated, but a feast of those who know that they are in the hands of the one who writes straight on crooked lines." Today's feast reminds us that Jesus Christ has dominance over the power of sin and death. Through his death and resurrection, he liberates us in his grace from the dominance and subjugation of Satan. Through his death and resurrection, Christ reveals to us his power and authority. Whatever the sins of our past life. Christ redeems us and makes of us a new creation.

Origen, a priest of the fifth century, says that ". . . it is clear that he who prays for the coming of God's kingdom prays rightly to have it within himself, that there it may grow and bear fruit and become perfect. . . . If we wish God to reign in us, in no way should sin reign in our mortal body; rather we should mortify our members which are upon the earth and bear fruit in the Spirit. There should be in us a kind of spiritual paradise where God may walk and be our sole ruler with his Christ." In short, we have more to fear when sin rules in our hearts because sin deprives us of freedom and true human flourishing. Sin deprives us of the life of God. Christ conquers the power of sin and fills us with his Spirit, which produces in us the fruits of "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness [and] self-control"(Gal 5:22-23). When we possess these virtues, we are then fully human and fully alive.

Accepting Jesus Christ as King of the Universe engages our minds and hearts in a divine way of thinking and a divine way of acting. Through Christ, we enter into "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace" (Preface of Christ the King). Our submission to his authority in our lives protects the new life and freedom we have received from him, beginning with Baptism. Each of us must choose to accept and honor the authority of Christ over our lives. When we do, he will look after us and guide us. In this relationship, he will bring us freedom, joy, and peace.

Next weekend is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the new liturgical year. We will begin using the St. Michael Hymnal in our worship to raise our minds, hearts, and voices to God. Thank you to all who purchased a hymnal and donated it back to the parish. Your support is greatly appreciated.

MEET OUR MINISTRIES: CATHOLIC MEN'S FELLOWSHIP

St. Gertrude Church has many ministries, programs, and groups for children, youth, and adults-some you may be familiar with and others you may not even know exist. To give you a deeper look into some of these offerings, the St. Gertrude bulletin will feature interviews with members of some of these ministries, programs, and groups over the next several months. This month, we're highlighting the Catholic Men's Fellowship.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: If a stranger approached you on the street and asked you about the Catholic Men's Fellowship, what would you say?

Catholic Men's Fellowship: Catholic Men's Fellowship is made up of men of all ages from St. Gertrude Church and surrounding parishes who gather in the school cafeteria every second and fourth Saturday of the month from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m. The men who come have either been coming for years or show up for the first time because they were invited to attend or were encouraged by a loved one to go. Men who are there recognize the need for God in their lives to help them become better sons, husbands, and/or fathers. The goal of the Fellowship is to help men deepen their faith and their relationship with God and improve their relationships with family and friends.

SGB: What do men find at the Fellowship?

CMF: Men find lifelong friends and mentors whom they can turn to in times of need, someone that will listen and offer counsel if asked, and men who will pray for you and your family's needs and be there when you need them the most. Each meeting starts at 7:30 a.m. with fellowship over coffee and donuts. By 7:45 a.m., we begin with song, followed by prayer, and then the introduction of a topic that is relevant for all men. Scripture is shared, then one or more men offer their personal witness, followed by discussion in either the large group or in smaller groups, depending on the topic. We finish with prayer and receive our chaplain's priestly blessing.

SGB: How does the CMF fit into the bigger picture of St. Gertrude? CMF: Better men translates into better husbands and fathers who are able to better raise Catholic children in loving families in today's culture. CMF focuses on men deepening their spirituality, faith, and prayer life. This leads to deeper participation in the sacraments, the Mass, and Reconciliation and becoming more active Catholics and parishioners across other ministries, benefiting wives, children, and the parish.

SBG: Who attends?

CMF: Men 18 and older are welcome. CMF members tend to be older, as many members have been coming for 10, 20, or even 30 years. We do have a 25-year-old man who recently joined our leadership team, and we are very happy about the diversity of thought and energy he brings. We encourage men in their 20's and 30's who are starting their professional or personal lives to come experience at least one meeting. What younger men realize immediately is that men in their 40's all the way to their 80's have experienced the same issues during their careers, marriage, and raising their children and grandchildren that the younger men are facing today. Listening to these men reflect on their successes and failures enables each man, with the Holy Spirit's inspiration, to leave with a new insight to tackle whatever challenge he is facing with a new perspective.

SGB: How did the CMF get started at St. Gertrude?

CMF: CMF started over 30 years ago. Kevin Lynch, a St. Gertrude parishioner, was one of four men who gathered here in Cincinnati and talked about the need for Catholic men to come together and encourage one another to deepen their faith and relationship with God. This was the beginning of the Catholic Men's Fellowship movement that led to the first Catholic Men's Conference being held in St. Gertrude's gymnasium with Fr. Clement Burns' blessing. The goal of all subsequent conferences was to lead men to fellowship groups at their local parishes. With these humble beginnings, CMF has spread across the United States and many countries.

ASK A PRIEST—JESUS' REIGN AND MY NEEDS

Q: As close as I try to be to God, I feel frustrated (still angry with myself and others, still committing sins of weakness, still having doubts about my faith, still feeling afraid, etc.). Am I doing something wrong?

A: I've been a priest and confessor long enough to know that your experience is shared by other Catholics! While I can't deny that some people are more expressive of this predicament than others, from what I understand, such a struggle is necessary to progress in following Jesus. It's a step along the journey to holiness.

Sometimes life is like purgatory! I want to suggest that this is not a bad thing, at least for those who have faith that God's power can and will overcome every disappointment and difficulty. God wants to prepare our doubtful minds and weak hearts for a love beyond all telling! I think the Solemnity of Christ the King has something really hopeful to give each one of us who travels through this "valley of tears." Just think about it: Where was Jesus Our King "enthroned?" Although his kingdom was not to be of this world, he welcomed the "good thief" into that kingdom as they hung side-by-side on the cross. This act of judgement and mercy was a truly *kingly* act. And it all began with a prayer: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingly power" (Luke 23:42).

When you pray, hoping for justice, love, truth, freedom and peace, you are seeking something good and important! All human beings, individually and collectively, are fulfilled when these values are pursued and respected. As we all know, sometimes these priorities are not respected, and this calls for a certain kind of action (I intend to address judgement and justice in next week's column). First and foremost, however, justice, love, truth, freedom, and peace should be the object

of our prayers. You are right to ask God in prayer for the graces you desire!

Is it possible to desire these values but to be left lacking them? Yes, at least temporarily. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says the following: "According to the Lord, the present time is the time of the Spirit and of witness, but also a time marked by 'distress' and the trial of evil which does not spare the Church and ushers in the struggles of the last days. It is a time of watching and waiting" (672). In these "last days" we can feel especially close to Jesus whose royal dignity as the Son of God was openly mocked. Having preached to and healed and loved the people who would become his people, he had to face abandonment, torture, and death as he mounted the cross. For those similarly marked by the Sign of the Cross, we should expect a similar "distress" that is part of a faithful life in a sinful world.

What did Jesus feel when he prayed those cloaked words of Psalm 22 as he hung from the cross? "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Psalm 22:1; see also Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34). If we feel emptiness and/or desolation in our prayers, this is not a reason to panic! Jesus allowed himself to feel something similar. But make sure to read Psalm 22 to the end, and see the hope that the author really had in mind! Through the power of Jesus' death on behalf of sinners and his glorious resurrection from the dead, our moments of agony will eventually give way to the glories of God's kingdom. This is Jesus' kingly promise to those who believe in him. In that eternal kingdom, healed of all infirmities and forgiven all sins, one day we shall reign with him.




