A VERY DIFFERENT GIVING TUESDAY REQUEST

My dear parishioners, as I am sure most of you know, traditionally, the Tuesday after Thanksgiving is known as "Giving Tuesday," a day where people all across the nation are encouraged to make a donation to a charity that

is close to their heart. The last three years, we have had a significant Giving Tuesday drive here in the parish.

This year, we are doing something that many might find shocking: we are not conducting a Giving Tuesday fundraising drive for the parish. Instead, I am asking everyone in the parish to do a different sort of giving this coming Tuesday. What motivates this request are the results of the recent election. With abortion now legal in Ohio through nine months of pregnancy, the only way we are going to be able to save babies moving forward is by providing moms (or couples) in crisis the support they need to have the confidence to deliver their babies. The work of crisis pregnancy centers and similar organizations moving forward is more critical than it has ever been. So I am asking you, my parishioners, to please consider making a gift to one of the organizations listed below instead of giving to the parish this year on Giving Tuesday. All of them have direct connections with our parish and are working every day to support moms in need and save the lives of their babies.

Pregnancy Center Plus (pcplus.org) is on Madison Road in Cincinnati. Pregnancy Center Plus has assisted over 135k families since 1982, offering them a confidential, safe place to get truthful information. Their ministry empowers families through pregnancy, parenting, and beyond with free services, including a 24/7 hotline, 24/7 nurse chat line, pregnancy testing, pregnancy counseling, first prenatal visit via telehealth, 3D ultrasound, on-site adoption services, and parenting education. They also distribute baby and toddler supplies such as diapers, formula, cribs, car seats, and more to needy families throughout the city. Currently, three St. Gertrude parishioners are board members, and at least 10 parishioners are volunteers.

Elizabeth's New Life Center (enlc.life) operates nine pregnancy centers throughout the greater Cincinnati and Dayton metropolitan areas. They provide a range of services including pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, full prenatal care, parenting resources, and adoption assistance. One of our parishioners sits on the board and many others are supporters. Our own Knights of Columbus council raised the money to purchase an ultrasound machine for ENLC in 2022.

Mater Filius Queen City (mfqc.org) is a maternity home for pregnant women and their babies who do not otherwise have a safe place to be. Their vision is to help women create a new and healthy lifestyle for themselves and their family as they develop their role as a mother through their parenting workshops and mentoring program. One of our parishioners is a volunteer, and currently, St. Gertrude School is running a food and supplies drive to help restock the Mater Filius pantry.

Old St. Mary's Pregnancy Center (oldstmarys.org/about/ pregnancy-center/), located downtown, supports all mothers and children who come to them in need by providing material assistance, counseling, prayer, and encouragement. They offer free pregnancy tests and, once the child is born, free baby items such as diapers, clothing, strollers, hygiene items, and more. While clients wait for their items to be gathered by a volunteer, they attend a short "Bible study" of that day's Mass readings. After their babies' births, moms can come back once a month for more supplies for their growing children. Currently, the interim executive director is a St. Gertrude Parishioner, as is one of their regular volunteers.

There are many other organizations in the area worth supporting, but I wanted to highlight these four because of their connection to our parish. So please consider supporting one (or more) of them this coming Tuesday, November 28.

One final request: If you do make a donation, if it is possible, please let them know you were encouraged to do so by St. Gertrude Parish. It's one thing for them to receive a bunch of random donations; but if they receive a number of donations where the donors all indicate they are donating because of this request from our parish, it will really reinforce the idea that we, as a parish, strongly support the work they do. 

TEACHER Q&A WITH MRS. BEATRICE (6-8 HISTORY TEACHER)

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Why did you choose to work at St. Gertrude School?

Mrs. Beatrice: I like that the primary focus at St. Gertrude School is faith, and that there is a classical approach to teaching here, aligning the literature with the history in the junior high classes.

SGB: What is unique about St. Gertrude School?

Mrs. Beatrice: St. Gertrude School has a rich Dominican tradition, and the presence of the Dominican sisters is a great blessing. Not many schools get to have religious working and teaching for them nowadays. Also, it is great that the Dominican friars and novices make time to be part of our school activities.

SGB: Why should a parent consider a St. Gertrude School education?

Mrs. Beatrice: St. Gertrude School provides strong support for parents, who are the primary educators of their children. Catholic parents are trying to prepare their children for their adult lives in this world and for eternal life in the next. St. Gertrude's administrators and faculty members are focused on helping parents with these goals.

SGB: What do you love most about teaching at St. Gertrude School?

Mrs. Beatrice: First, I feel fortunate to work with all of the exceptional people on this faculty and administration, who are all supportive and faith-filled coworkers. Next, I really enjoy the students and families here. I am constantly amazed by the creative, generous, and thoughtful things that the parents do for our school and for the teachers. Finally, studying with the students each day is a joy.

SGB: What are your hobbies and background?

Mrs. Beatrice: I am married, have two daughters and three sons, and four grandsons and a granddaughter. I love spending time with my family, visiting Lake Michigan, or traveling in general. I have enjoyed gardening and raising chickens, and so we are very excited now to have just moved to a place where we can try our hand at raising livestock. I like to read and try to keep up with news in the Church and in politics.



NO ONE IS SAVED ALONE

TYLER CASTRUCCI, COORDINATOR <u>OF ADULT EVANGELIZATION</u>

You can't become a Christian simply by reading a book. Now, I love reading (especially about the faith!), so this is a difficult pill to swallow. When I was going through my reversion to the faith, reading and studying what the Church teaches

was pivotal. I read everything I could get my hands on. I started with Scott Hahn books and gradually worked my way into studying St. Thomas Aquinas, Pope Benedict XVI, St. Augustine, and many other towering figures in the Catholic intellectual tradition. While all of this reading and education helped remove the intellectual obstacles I had to Christianity, it wasn't the thing that ultimately led me to return to the Church.

The faith is certainly reasonable, but it's not solely based on human reason. We also need grace and community. And, of course, in the final analysis, the Holy Spirit is always in the driver's seat. Nevertheless, during my reversion, the sense of belonging I experienced from the parish community deepened my faith in unexpected ways. In fact, the more I learned about the faith from reading books, the more my desire grew to talk about it with other people. Thankfully, I was able to join a small Saturday morning lectio divina group. Praying the Scriptures together and hearing what the Lord was saying to the other people in the group inspired me to gradually work up the courage

to share what I was receiving. It truly became a group of disciples discipling each other. This is parish life at its best.

Even before COVID, the rise of loneliness and isolation in our society has been well documented. In January of 2020, a study published by the major health insurer, Cigna, reported that three in five Americans are lonely. Loneliness and isolation can often have adverse effects on physical health, but more importantly, it can also cause serious spiritual problems. A faith that isn't lived out in the context of a community of believers often withers. In other words, as Pope Francis has said several times during his pontificate, "No one is saved alone."

Next Sunday, December 3, our parish is blessed to celebrate the Rite of Acceptance and Welcoming during the 12 p.m. Mass. This rite is the first major liturgical step toward receiving or completing the sacraments of initiation for adults and youth in our parish. While it's an important day for them personally, it is also an important day for us as a parish community. As part of the rite, the priest will address the entire assembly and inquire if it is ready to accompany the candidates on their faith journeys. Are we ready?

This week, I ask you to pray for all of those people discerning to enter the Church or be received into full communion, and ask the Lord "How are you calling me to accompany these people?" Perhaps it's offering a rosary for them, or making a point to go up and personally say hello and welcome them to the parish. Maybe the Lord is even calling you to take on the responsibility of sponsoring someone. Whatever the case may be, let's also pray that we would respond generously to the Lord's call.

At our St. Gertrude feast day and centennial celebration last Saturday, November 18, Chris Hilberg, the mayor of Madeira, presented our parish with this proclamation and congratulated us on our 100th anniversary.

Proclamation

WHEREAS, this day commemorates the celebration of St. Gertrude Parish 100th anniversary in the City of Madeira; and

WHEREAS, St. Gertrude Mission, now known as St. Gertrude Parish, was established in 1923 by 25 Catholic families. Parishioners gathered every Sunday for Mass at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Willenbrink on the corner of Naomi and Miami Avenues in Madeira; and

WHEREAS, at the end of 1924, the families had raised enough funds through organized socials and special collections to purchase land on Miami Avenue. In 1925, the first church building was completed; and

WHEREAS, in 1934, St. Gertrude School opened with 40 students in grades one through eight. Over the last 89 years, the school has been led by the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia; and

WHEREAS, on this commemoration of its 100th anniversary, St. Gertrude Parish remains as committed today as it was in 1923 in helping people encounter Jesus Christ; and

WHEREAS, as we celebrate this milestone, we pause and give thanks, honor, and praise for the deep and abiding Christian commitment of those who in faith began this work and for all of those who have given so unselfishly during these many years to see that the work of the church continues to grow and thrive.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Chris Hilberg, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the 40th mayor of the City of Madeira, and on behalf of the City Council, do hereby congratulate St. Gertrude Parish on their 100th Anniversary. Please join me in recognizing the contributions of the St. Gertrude Parish staff, faculty, and parishioners, both past and present to our community.


