THE HOPE OF EVANGELIZATION

Last Sunday, Archbishop Schnurr promulgated the final Families of Parishes, which is part of the Beacons of Light pastoral planning process. Our parish of St. Gertrude is established as a family of one parish with the Dominican

Friars continuing to provide it with pastoral care and leadership. While this news may bring a sigh of relief because we do not have to go through the process of uniting as a family of parishes, we will be wise to remain engaged in the pastoral planning process so that we can be renewed and grow as a parish. We need to return to the evangelizing mission of the Church and correctly organize our resources (human, physical, financial) to pursue that mission.

Religious practice is declining nationwide, and the same can be said of our parish. Here are the statistics, based on counts made in October of 2001, 2011, and 2021:

- 20 years ago, 2,985 people attended Sunday Mass
- 10 years ago, 2,449 people attended Sunday Mass
- This year, 1,748 people attended Sunday Mass

Fewer Catholics are involved in parish life. A clear example is the commitment to the adoration chapel. Before the pandemic, the chapel operated 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with a full complement of adorers. When we reopened the chapel in October 2020, we were not able to return to 24-hour adoration; and 1 year later, though we have the desire to return to 24/7 adoration, we are not able to find enough adorers to pray through the night on just two nights per week. (Two nights is an interim schedule with the hope of rebuilding the list of adorers.)

Sharing this information with you is not a way of saying that our parish is dying. I don't believe that for a second. But these realities do mean that we need to prayerfully evaluate our life, programming, and use of physical and financial resources. As the archbishop asked in a recent column, "Are [our resources] working in concert to continuously draw parishioners and attract new members into a more intimate relationship with Jesus? Or are they consumed by efforts to maintain the status quo and spread too thinly to be truly effective?" The archbishop continues, "The Beacons of Light pastoral planning process is designed to address exactly these questions. I am convinced that this initiative, born in great hope, will enable us to form stronger parishes, centered on the Eucharist, that radiate the love of Christ and the joy of the Gospel."

I believe that embracing the mission cannot wait for a pastoral planning process. We have programming that can be improved and enhanced. We have ideas to be considered and implemented. The recent Giving Tuesday initiative focused on raising More for Mission to further provide and promote opportunities for people of all ages to encounter Jesus and follow him as a disciple. The support of the

parish indicates an agreement that the mission must continue. Over 250 parishioners supported the one-day campaign and contributed over \$117,000. In the archdiocese, we had the highest number of parishioner support, and for that we won a \$1,000 prize. Thank you to all who supported this effort and donated.

Living the mission is the responsibility of every person. "Transmitting the faith means to create in every place and time the conditions which lead to this encounter between the person and Jesus Christ. The goal of all evangelization is to create the possibility for this encounter, which is, at one and the same time, intimate, personal, public and communal" (Working Document. Synod for New Evangelization). Each of us can live this mission within our family and among friends. Invite someone to Christmas Mass. Offer to pray for needs and intentions. Give some time to assist with errands or a project. Bring the light, love, and mercy to others. Keep it simple. Keep it local. Allow the Lord to work through you. Be a beacon of light.

Let us love one another and pray for each other.

ASK A PRIEST — ADVENT ROSE AND OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Is there a connection between Gaudete Sunday (when the priest wears rose-colored vestments) and the amazing story of Our Lady of Guadalupe?

A: There is this year! It is indeed a beautiful work of God's providence that this year we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) with its unique rose-colored vestments and the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Queen of the Americas, on the same day.

Our Catholic imaginations combine the jubilant color rose and the Blessed Mother quite naturally. Indeed, maybe this is the motivating force for many a priest who would otherwise be reluctant to wear pink clothing for this Sunday of Advent, which celebrates that the Lord is near! There is the biblical love poem, the Song of Songs, where the voice of bridegroom and bride foreshadow the deep and captivating mutual love of Christ and his Church. The "rose of Sharon" and "lily of the valleys" in Song 2:1-2 are titles that might be applied to Jesus and Mary, the Savior-Son and his mother who ushered in the reflowering of humanity that started on the first Christmas. There is also the prophecy of Isaiah 11:1, in which a "shoot from the root of Jesse" is foretold that will grow and reunite fallen creation. The popular Advent carol Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming, presents Jesus as the "rose" springing from "tender stem" coming off of this root. The song continues, "Isaiah twas foretold it,/ The rose I have in mind;/ With Mary we behold it,/ The Virgin Mother kind."

The rose connection between Jesus, Mary, and Gaudete Sunday is beautiful but sort of difficult to capture, given this scattered "bouquet" of biblical connections. What if rose is simply a natural sign encouraging believers to keep up hope as they await Christ's coming? This is partially the case. But the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe concretely brings flowers—and particularly the rose—before our sight today. One important detail in the miraculous happenings near Mexico City in 15311 was a collection of Castilian roses which fell from the famed tilma (cloak) of Juan Diego. This ordinary native man and Christian convert came before the first bishop of Mexico City, wishing to convince him of something extraordinary: he had seen a heavenly lady who expressed her maternal love for the suffering native and requested that a church be built on a hilltop near Juan Diego's village. The roses that fell from his bunched-up outer garment in front of the bishop—a type of flower known to grow in his native Spain and hence quite out-of-place in Mexico in mid-December—were a clear sign of heaven's workings. The bouquet had been arranged by the mysterious maiden herself and was part of the revelation of the luminous image now known throughout the Americas as Our Lady of Guadalupe. What a sign of hope for all involved!

The appreciation of this heavenly image, accompanied by a

bouquet of roses, deserves the attention of every man and woman on our continent. It holds deeply meaningful symbolism for the marriage of native and European cultures that cannot be explained apart from the intervention of God's love for mankind in Jesus. How the number of conversions from among the native population sky-rocketed as they freely confessed faith in Christ after this occurrence is history. How our Lady of Guadalupe is a sign and instrument of hopeful new life for all Americans today is for each of us to discover. It turns out that, this Sunday, Mary gives us roses along with her Son.




