CHRISTMAS IS NEXT WEEK!

As we look forward to our celebration of the Lord's birth just one week from today, I want to share a few thoughts and comments regarding our parish celebration of Christmas this year. It will be the first year since 2019 that we will be able to celebrate Christmas Masses without any

COVID-related restrictions. It will also be the first Christmas here at St. Gertrude for Fr. Joachim, Christopher Holman (our director of music), Matthew Young (our head sacristan), and myself! With so many "new" faces involved in the preparations, things might—without us even realizing it—not end up happening *precisely* as they have in the past.

First, a few words about the schedule and seating for the Masses. With COVID capacity limits and social distancing requirements now a thing of the past, we have eliminated the need to obtain "tickets" or sign up in advance for a particular Mass. All Christmas Masses will be seated on a first-come, first-served basis. For the 3 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve, we will fill the church first and then begin seating people in the gym. That means there will be two Masses happening simultaneously at 3 p.m. While we don't expect the 5:30 p.m. Mass to overflow into the gym, in the event that we have completely filled the church and more people are still arriving, we will be prepared to have an overflow Mass in the gym at that time, as well.

Unlike in some previous years, we will not be having a Mass at 7:30 p.m. There were notes left for us from last year saying that attendance at that Mass was not all that great and suggesting that Mass be discontinued in the future. In addition, after discussing the schedule with the other friars, it was clear that, as a Dominican priory responsible for forming novices, it was very important for the community to be able to pray together and have a meal together on Christmas Eve. The only possible opportunity to do that in a reasonable way was during this early evening time slot, where there is a brief window between the end of the 5:30 p.m. Mass(es) and the beginning of Vigils and ultimately Midnight Mass. During this window, the three parish priests will be joining with the rest of the Dominican community in our communal celebration of Christmas Eve.



In recent past years, our "Midnight Mass" has (inexplicably, to me) begun at 11:30 p.m. This year, we decided to make it a proper Midnight Mass and begin the Mass at midnight! There is a long and deep history of Christmas Midnight Mass, going back (in the west) to

the year 440 AD when Pope Sixtus III began celebrating it, citing the tradition that Jesus was born at midnight. We know that even earlier than that, Christmas Mass was celebrated at midnight in Bethlehem. So, if it's good enough for Rome and Bethlehem, I say it's good enough for Madeira! In addition to the Mass, there will be a 30-minute program of Christmas carols beginning at 11:30 p.m. for those who wish to arrive early and share in some extra singing. Our Christmas Day schedule will remain unchanged from recent years, with Masses at 8 a.m., 10 a.m., and 12 p.m.

Finally, I'd like to extend a personal request that comes from deep in my heart to all of you, our wonderful and faithful parishioners. As you well know, many of our fellow Catholics are not very regular Mass goers, but do show up for major celebrations like Christmas and Easter. I ask you, from the bottom of my heart, be as warm and welcoming to them as you can. If you've been coming here for 20 years and always sit in the same pew yet you show up for Christmas Mass this year and there's some family that you've never seen before sitting there . . . smile at them. After Mass is over, introduce yourself and welcome them. Wish them a Merry Christmas. Maybe it will be your smile and warmth that brings them back to the parish again . . . sometime before next Easter.

For three weeks of Advent, we have been praying, "Come, Lord Jesus!" Now we await the final week of our Advent vigil. See you at the manger,

CHRISTMAS JOY

Hi, my name is Joshua Moore. I attended my first Christmas Mass at St. Gertrude in 2020 and came into the Catholic Church on Easter of 2021. My first experience of Christmas Mass may be different from other non-Catholics' first experiences of this Mass because I was already in the Become Catholic (RCIA) program here at

St. Gertrude. I had just gotten engaged to my beautiful wife, and I was already in love with Christ's Church. Nevertheless, I was taken aback by the entire Advent season.

I grew up Pentecostal, and we really only celebrated Christmas Day. There was always an emphasis on the "true meaning of Christmas," but only after seeing, learning, and experiencing the season of Advent that first year did I feel like I understood what that truly meant. The annual time of Advent allows us to appreciate and prepare for the joy of Christmas—the birth of our Savior. To me, St. Gertrude Church embodies this very thing.

During that first Advent, I noticed that St. Gertrude was decorated simply but elegantly with an arrangement of poinsettias. At that first Christmas Mass, the church was vibrant with color and was decorated with Christmas trees and the beautiful nativity scene.

Up until this first Christmas, I had only experienced a cantor singing during Mass—which I loved. Pentecostal praise and worship, while fun, can be less than reverent. I always loved it as a kid, but the music (and specifically, the cantor) in a Catholic parish just feels more intimate and beautiful—which I have enjoyed as an adult. To my surprise, the full parish choir was singing at my first Christmas Mass. I vividly remember being shocked and just curious about what that was going to be like, if it was going to be too much, or if I was even going to like it. The choir was rejuvenating and brought so much fullness into the church.

I have to admit, I'm sometimes guilty of slipping into spiritually dry spells because I let myself fall into a routine and just go through the

motions. Take singing at Mass, for example: I love singing at church and even doing my best to sing in Latin, but there are just times when I lose the sense of "I want to sing" and it becomes "I'm singing just so I feel like I'm participating." I was very excited to join the Church, but I had been reading and listening to tons of material that by the time we hit Advent in 2020, I was



struggling with feeling burnt out. At Christmas Mass when the choir began to sing and the whole church joined in, a smile came across my face that was just pure joy—a joy I hadn't felt in a long time. By this time, I had been attending Mass for months, attending Become Catholic, and had just gotten engaged. All of these things had brought me closer to God, and each one came with a new sense of joy and happiness. But the joy I felt at that Christmas Mass was different; it was a moment of clarity. Growing up, I attended Sunday school. There, we talked about the angels singing at the birth of Jesus, but that evening at Mass, for the first time, it felt like we were singing with them.

You may remember in the movie *National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation* that when the lights on the house finally light up, you hear a choir singing, "Hallelujah!" It felt like that, as if this bright light was shining on us. It sounds silly, but it's truly how I felt. A cartoonish moment that gave the realization of, "Oh, this is what that feels like." Joy is something that hasn't always been plentiful in my life and definitely not in my walk in faith. It is something that I found at St. Gertrude Church. I hope to see all of you at Christmas Mass, and I encourage you to bring someone you know who may be interested in the Catholic faith or looking for a new home parish. You never know how Christmas Mass will impact them, but I do know that my first Christmas Mass will always hold a special place in my heart.



HOLY TEACHING



ASK A PRIEST— WHO CAN RECEIVE ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

Q: When is the right time to request a priest for Anointing of the Sick and/or last rites?
A: Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Church and can stand on its own, apart from the other last rites. As a

sacrament of the new covenant, it involves "powers that come forth' from the Body of Christ, which is ever-living and life-giving." The special blessing or grace of Anointing of the Sick is the removal of sin and its effects (as a compliment to sacramental confession, normally received first) and the raising and strengthening of the soul. It can have wonderful effects that I have witnessed during my relatively short time as a priest: strengthened endurance, ability to resist temptations, and even physical healing.

So, who is supposed to receive anointing? The Second Vatican Council says the following about the recipients of this sacrament: "as soon as any of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." The pope and bishops emphasized that Anointing is *not* only for those who are at the point of death. In fact, it is right to benefit from the graces and effects of this sacrament sooner, whenever one's "health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age." As always, the sacraments are meant to provide the graces we need in the concrete calls and challenges of life. Jesus wouldn't want us to wait

until we "feel better" or, at the other extreme, we or our loved ones feel there's no hope left. 4

Among the baptized whose health is seriously impaired, children can be anointed once they have reached the age of reason. Those who have lost the complete use of reason (for instance, those with dementia) may receive the sacrament if they requested it, even implicitly, when they were in good health. Those about to undergo surgery due to serious illness can be anointed. Finally, Anointing of the Sick may be received multiple times, such as when an illness worsens or a new health problem arises.

Jesus doesn't promise to take away all our suffering every time, but he does promise to help us find divine support, purpose, and even salvation when we approach the sacraments in faith:

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." ⁵
