



THE JOY OF FORGIVENESS

Over the last two weeks, the second graders in our school and religious education program have approached the Lord for their first celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation. These celebrations bring the children into a deeper relationship with Jesus as they express

their sorrow for sin, repent of the wrong they have done or the good they have failed to do, and receive the merciful gift of God's forgiveness of their sins. The joy of forgiveness and reconciliation radiates on the faces of the children. It is a beautiful moment of encounter, love, and grace.

The children's formation in preparation for this sacrament uses the approach of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, which is described on the CGS website as follows: "We believe that God and the child have a unique relationship with one another, particularly before the age of six; that growth of this relationship should be assisted by the adult, but is directed by the Spirit of God; that children need their own place to foster the growth of that relationship; and that the child's spiritual growth is best served through tangible but indirect means." The use of this approach here at St. Gertrude is a special offering to parents to help their children encounter the Lord, experience his love, and to develop their knowledge and understanding of our Catholic faith.

At this young age, the children learn that the sacrament of Reconciliation is closely related to their baptismal identity. After the celebration of the sacrament for the first time, the children renew their baptismal promises with the help of their parents, light a candle from the Paschal Candle in remembrance of the light of Christ received at baptism, and are clothed in a white garment to recall outwardly the identity and dignity they have in Christ. These symbols are reminders that the sacrament of Reconciliation restores the innocence of Baptism and renews the relationship and covenant we have with God the Father.

My hope is that this first experience of the sacrament is motivation

to receive the sacrament regularly-not only for them, but for their parents and all parishioners as well. We all offend God and one another in innumerable ways and countless times in our thoughts and words, in what we have done, and in what we have failed to do. Expressing sorrow for sins, repenting of them, and making a firm intention to amend one's life is an act of faith in God, who loves his children and wants a personal and vibrant relationship with them. Confessing our sins is an act of humility that makes us receptive to the graces God offers so that we can grow in virtue and holiness. The Lord is kind and merciful. He does not wish the sinner to die, but to turn back to him and live. There are multiple opportunities to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation here at St. Gertrude and multiple priests to serve you. The occasion of grace and mercy is offered to each of us so that we may experience the joy of reconciliation with God and with one another.

The bulletin for last Sunday was not delivered in time for the weekend because of the weather. My article in that issue provided information on the parish pastoral council and invited nominations from parishioners for new members. You can refer to that bulletin via the parish website. The nomination form is found below.

Father Ken Letoile, O.P., prior provincial of the Dominican friars and former pastor here at St. Gertrude, will be visiting the priests and novices in the priory from February 16-22. He will celebrate and preach the 10 a.m. parish Mass on Sunday, February 20. All are welcome.





ASK A PRIEST -LENT 2022 AT ST. GERTRUDE CHURCH FATHER JORDAN KELLY, O.P

St. Gertrude Bulletin recently visited with Father Jordan to discuss what the approaching season of Lent would be like this year at St. Gertrude Church.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Father Jordan, when you think about Lent and the liturgies of the Lenten season, what are the first thoughts that come to your mind; where do you begin?

Father Jordan: I would like to begin my answer to this question from what might seem to be a very strange starting point.

One of my happiest memories, whether as a child or an adult, is my parents' home on a Sunday afternoon. From the moment I walked through the door, I was enveloped by aromas that said, "you are home, Jim," and, "this is love in action." My mom's cooking was without comparison (every son says that but . . .)! Whether it was a roast, a ham, or her award-winning gravy (some people say red sauce) and meatballs, I instantly knew I was home, I was safe, and I was loved. Walking into our home, you would also be greeted by my dad's music: big band music, lots of Cole Porter, George Gershwin, and Frank Sinatra. To this day, whenever I hear this music or smell any of these aromas, I am back on Minor Street and with my mom and dad.

How is this tied to the season of Lent and the Lenten liturgies? Because the sights, sounds, and aromas that greet us when we walk through the door of St. Gertrude Church should remind us that we are in the season of Lent (or whatever season we are celebrating). teaches that "during Lent it is forbidden for the altar to be decorated with flowers. Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), solemnities, and feasts are exceptions" (305).

As far as sound is concerned, we will experience more times of silence—just enough organ to support the singing, and no instrumental music. Again, the GIRM instructs:

In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only to support the singing. Exceptions are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), solemnities, and feasts (313).


[The *Gloria*] is sung or said on Sundays outside the seasons of Advent and Lent, on solemnities and feasts, and at special celebrations of a more solemn character (53).

The *Alleluia* is sung in every season other than Lent. The verses are taken from the Lectionary or the *Gradual* (62, a). During Lent, in place of the *Alleluia*, the verse before the Gospel is sung, as indicated in the Lectionary. It is also permissible to sing another psalm or tract, as found in the *Gradual* (62, b).

SGB: Sounds like it could be a little depressing?

FJ: It's not always easy to embrace these disciplines, but like any discipline, they are for our own good and our better and deeper participation in the Lenten restraints that lead to a glorious Easter! Next week, we will learn more about the musical shape and other liturgical matters for Lent 2022 at St. Gertrude. Stay tuned!

FJ: Smells might be tough, but I would start here: beeswax. When we enter a church during Lent, we should be greeted by the aroma of burning beeswax candles or beeswax candles that have just been extinguished.

While the aroma of beeswax will increase, the pleasing scent of flowers will be gone from church, except on Laetare Sunday, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, and the Solemnity of the Annunciation.

At all times, but especially during seasons like Lent, the celebration of the liturgy is guided by the *General Instruction on the Roman Missal*, or GIRM. The GIRM
