

OUR PARISH CELEBRATION OF MARDI GRAS!

This coming Tuesday evening, our parish will be having its first annual parish Mardi Gras potluck dinner. As far as I can tell, our parish hasn't had any celebration of Mardi Gras in recent years. But during this special year of preparation for our parish centennial, we decided to combine a

celebration of Mardi Gras with the time-honored tradition of a good, old fashioned potluck dinner.

Why is a Catholic parish celebrating Mardi Gras? Isn't that some raunchy night of drinking and debauchery that happens each year in New Orleans?

Certainly the manner in which Mardi Gras has been celebrated in New Orleans in recent decades is both infamous and, well . . . not exactly within our Catholic understanding of upright moral behavior. But Mardi Gras is celebrated in many countries, especially the traditionally Catholic countries of Western Europe and South America. In most of these countries, Mardi Gras (literally "Fat Tuesday," i.e. the day before Ash Wednesday and thus the fasting of Lent) is simply the final day of what has been several weeks of celebration of *Carnival*, a time of rejoicing and festivity that begins on the feast of the Epiphany in early January and runs until Fat Tuesday. Mardi Gras is a Catholic celebration through and through!

Why a parish potluck?

In whatever form the celebration of *Carnival* and Mardi Gras takes in various countries, there is always an emphasis upon food. Since Lent is a season of fasting and abstinence, and many Catholics choose to "give up" one or more food items they particularly enjoy as a form of special Lenten penance, the weeks (and especially the final day) before Ash Wednesday are naturally a time to enjoy such foods before the time of fasting begins. In the context of our parish, what better way to have a "celebration of the goodness of food" than through a potluck? A potluck

is a wonderful way for people to share a little bit about themselves with their fellow parishioners through the food they make for the purpose of sharing it with others.

What if I'm not a good cook / I don't like cooking / I don't have time to cook?

It doesn't matter! Come anyway. Bring something. Anything. Heck, stop off at a KFC and bring in some fried chicken. Stop at a bakery and buy a package of nice dinner rolls. I don't want anyone to avoid coming just because they are self-conscious about their cooking. If you can't or don't want to cook, stop at the store and buy something to bring. Just come! It's my hope that *everyone* in our parish comes to enjoy this evening.

What if I don't know anyone in the parish? Am I going to be stuck sitting at a table all by myself, feeling awkward and out of place?

No! One of the purposes of a parish event like this is to help people meet and get to know each other. Along those lines, I would encourage everyone in the parish to take advantage of the potluck to get to know some new people. Don't just sit with the same friends that you see all the time. Branch out. Sit at a table with someone you don't know. Introduce yourself. Hear their story of being at St. Gertrude Church (however long or short they have been) and share your story. The more we all get to know each other, the stronger our parish will become.

Is the event kid-friendly?

Absolutely! Bring all the little ones. We'll have decorations, live music, and other ways of helping even the smallest of our parishioners share in the fun.


CONGRATULATIONS, SECOND GRADERS!

GIVE ALMS TO THE POOR

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us by saying: "You must be perfected as your heavenly Father is perfect." As we prepare for Lent, let us be reminded that Lent is a



call to "give alms for the poor." Through your almsgiving, you are doing the will of the Father and finishing the work of Jesus who has asked us to take care of our brothers and sisters who are suffering. Some are within walking distance of our parish.

<u>LENTEN REMINDERS -</u> FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Ash Wednesday (February 22) and Good Friday (April 7) are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

ASK A PRIEST— RE-TRANSLATED ABSOLUTION FORMULA FOR PRIESTS

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: I heard that the words used by the priests in confession will be different soon, similar to the translation changes in the Mass about a decade ago. Would you please explain the changes?

A: This is an important question to answer so that people understand why the absolution formula whereby they are forgiven for their sins sounds different starting this Lent!

As mentioned, the newly translated words of sacramental absolution (see below) are part of a larger project initiated under Popes John Paul II and Benedict XVI to ensure that translations of the official Latin prayers of the Roman Rite are adequately rendered in vernacular languages. Whereas a previous theory of translation

allowed for a looser "dynamic equivalency," the emphasis behind our new liturgical translations strives for "formal equivalency." In short. the Church wants Roman Catholics to understand the artistry and theological meaning conveyed by the ancient prayers, even if they don't usually access them in the official Latin. This is not to discourage praying in our mother tongue with more



familiar turns of phrase, especially in less formal settings. But the official prayers of the liturgy (such as the formula used in confession) must cultivate a truly Catholic spirit within us so that we can then faithfully carry the faith into our daily lives and prayers.

Here are the English language changes that are optional for priest-confessors in the United States to use as of Ash Wednesday and mandatory as of Divine Mercy Sunday:

CURRENT:

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


NEW FORMULA:

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and poured out the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The changes (underlined in the "new formula") are few but not without significance: the mention of "pouring out" the Holy Spirit reminds us that Jesus wants us to be *bathed* in God's merciful love. Blood and water poured out of Jesus' side for our sake from the cross, and the risen Christ "breathed" the Holy Spirit on the disciples. The new translation helps us remember that we make similar contact with God's refreshing grace in the sacrament of Reconciliation. The second change, which uses the verb "grant" instead of "give," better reflects the humble prayer-language of the Church. None of us have an automatic claim on God's pardon and peace, but we trustingly implore it nonetheless as a gift from our loving Father through Christ in the communion of the Holy Spirit.
