
Jesus Is Waiting for You

ANOTHER STEP IN THE BEACONS OF LIGHT PROCESS

This past Monday, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati released the assignment plan for pastors and priests as part of the Beacons of Light process. The complete listing of assignments can be found at <u>BeaconsAOC.org</u>.

In that listing, you will find that I am named as pastor of St. Gertrude Church—remaining in my current position for the foreseeable future. The positions for two parochial vicars are listed as "projected." The reason for this determination reflects the reality that the parish is entrusted to the care of the Dominican friars, and it is the provincial who makes the assignments of priests to the priory community and proposes priests to the archbishop for a parochial assignment. Listing the positions as projected was a way for the archbishop to indicate two parochial vicar positions without overreaching and determining assignments that belong to the provincial. Currently, Father John Mark and Father Jordan are serving in the two positions and giving themselves wholeheartedly to the pastoral care of the parish. I am grateful for their presence on the parochial staff and for their commitment to the life and growth of the parish. I am not aware of any changes in their assignments, so we look forward to their continued ministry here.

The release of the assignments is another step in the Beacons of Light process. The first six months of 2022 are a preparatory period with trainings, workshops, and resources for priests, deacons, and parish staffs. Some of this work has included roundtable meetings to provide an overview of the Pastoral Planning Pathway and presentations on the Guiding Principles; providing formation and training for priests and lay leaders; and developing resources that will help parish teams understand and reflect on the theological foundations of Beacons of Light. Upcoming parish bulletins will provide further information to the parish on the six foundational principles for this pastoral planning process. I hope you will read them to stay informed about the process and its impact on our parish.

This weekend, we welcome Father Ken Letoile, O.P., prior provincial of the Dominican Friars of the Province of St. Joseph and a previous pastor here at St. Gertrude. He will celebrate and preach the 10 a.m. Mass. During his six days of visitation, he will meet with each Dominican priest and novice, as well as parish staff and parish members from the parish pastoral council, the finance council, PTO, and the school advisory committee.





ASK A PRIEST - LENT 2022 AT ST. GERTRUDE CHURCH PART II

Intrigued by our last conversation with Father Jordan Kelly, O.P., St. Gertrude Bulletin again chatted with Father Jordan about what Lent will be like this year at St. Gertrude. During this

discussion, we talked about the musical shape of the upcoming Lenten season.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Okay, Father Jordan, let's continue our conversation from last week. What will Lent 2022 *sound* like?

Father Jordan: I'm excited for our parishioners *to pray* the music being prepared for our Lenten journey. I purposely used the infinitive "to pray" because that is the *precise* purpose of all liturgical music—to deepen our prayer.

SGB: It's intriguing to think of music as prayer, Father Jordan. How does music help us to pray during Mass?

FJ: Music that is prayerful allows us to enter more fully into the mystery that is the holy sacrifice of the Mass, the perfect sacrifice in which heaven is wedded to earth. St. John Vianney teaches us, "If we really understood the Mass, we would die of joy." I pray that the musical structure used at our Masses will help us understand the Mass more.

SGB: How will this happen?

FJ: First this will happen through the use of a good deal of ritual music. Ritual music can be defined in two ways: a musical pattern that allows us to sing by memory, from the heart; and music that comes directly out of the texts of the Mass, those texts found in the Roman Missal and the Lectionary. Ritual music leads us back to the texts prescribed for that day's Mass.

SGB: Sounds interesting, but how will this happen?

FJ: Very simply, it will seem like we are repeating a lot of music. We have already experienced this repetition during Advent when the same tune was used as the Introit or Entrance Antiphon. The tune was the same each Sunday, but the antiphon and its verses were proper to a particular Sunday. During Lent, every Sunday Mass will begin by singing, "If today you hear the voice of God, harden not your hearts." The refrain remains the same but, like Advent, the verses will be proper to each Sunday.

Another key moment of ritual music is the Mass setting we will use during Lent. In Advent, we sang the Latin Mass setting *Missa Alme Pater*. We will use this Mass setting again during Lent. The *Missa Alme Pater* is a beautiful Mass setting, and we were just

getting accustomed to it when Advent became Christmas. Lent will give us a longer opportunity to use this setting.

SGB: Why do we use a Latin Mass setting, and how can this become music that comes from the heart?

FJ: Latin is the official language of the Roman Catholic Church, and the Second Vatican Council never intended it to be fully abandoned. In *Sacrosantum Concillium*, the document on the liturgy, the Second Vatican Council Fathers make clear that Latin and Gregorian Chant have "pride of place" in the celebration of the sacred liturgy, and both are to be preserved and taught to the people. In fact, Pope St. Paul VI wrote that every parish should be able to sing settings of the Latin Ordinary of the Mass.

SGB: Will we sing any of the familiar Lenten hymns like, *These* 40 Days of Lent, O Lord?

FJ: Yes. We will sing a familiar hymn on each of the Sundays of Lent.

SGB: Will the congregation's musical participation change this Lent?

FJ: Yes, there is one significant change this Lent: there will not be a recessional hymn at the end of any of the Sunday Masses.

SGB: Why is that?

FJ: The Sacramentary of Pope St. Paul VI and the Roman Missal, Third Edition, make no mention of the singing of a recessional hymn. Both state, "If desired, a hymn may be sung . . . " A recessional hymn is not required and has never been required. Traditionally, if there is a hymn following the final blessing, it is the appropriate antiphon to Our Lady. Instrumental music to accompany the procession is most appropriate.

Following the Prayer to Saint Michael, the priest(s) and servers will leave in silence. The people are asked to remain silently in their places until the procession has entered the sacristy. The silence reminds us of the penance we are embracing during the Lenten season. More importantly, it invites us to encounter together the contemplative silence in which we hear the voice of God.


