



Saturday, March 19, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph—spouse of the Virgin Mary, foster father of Jesus, and patron of the universal Church.

Please join us for a solemn Mass at 11:30 a.m. in honor of St. Joseph. Mass will be celebrated ad orientem and will include the traditional chants of St. Joseph and music from Schola Dominicana.



THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The Gospel reading for this Second Sunday of Lent presents us with the Transfiguration of the Lord on a mountain. It is a reading that can fill us with hope in the current political and economic uncertainties of our world. First, St. Luke

tells us that Jesus "took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray." This initiative shows that Jesus invites us to be united with him in prayer. Jesus knows the tragic events of his future crucifixion and death. He knows that the faith of the apostles will be shaken. So, he takes the apostles with him to pray so that their faith will be strengthened. How is Jesus calling each of us to pray in union with him? Do we respond to his invitation and intentionally make time for prayer? Do we go to a place of solitude—physically and

technologically—
to be still in the presence of the Lord? Are we learning from him the manner of praying with trust? Are we learning from him how to seek the Father's



will and grace in every present situation and for whatever the future may bring?

Current world events and the evil manifested by many different persons demonstrate that the grace of conversion and obedience to the Lord is still needed. We can pray for the outpouring of this grace when we pray in union with Christ. We can pray with faith and hope because we know that Jesus is more powerful than all the evil in the universe because of his resurrection.

Second, the Transfiguration of the Lord during this time of prayer teaches us that God has the power to transform the human condition. This truth should be first applied to ourselves. This thought reminds me of the often-told story of G.K. Chesterton's answer to the question, "What is wrong with the world?" to which he politely and pithily responded, "I am." Jesus invites us into prayer with him just as we are, but he uses the opportunity to show us who we are created to become. The Gospel reading tells us that Moses and Elijah spoke of the exodus that Jesus was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. This exodus is the deliverance from slavery to sin and the power of death. This exodus is the liberation of our souls to live in the freedom of the children of God. The grace of our conversion into persons of greater virtue and holiness comes from the Lord.

St. Irenaeus once wrote, "The glory of God is man fully alive." All who cooperate with the grace of the Lord experience the power of

the divine shining through our humanity. Thus, our hope is that what Jesus accomplishes for ourselves is also the work he is doing in others. The future of our world may appear dire, but it is not hopeless. This is a time for all of us to listen to the divine, heavenly voice that directs us to listen to Jesus. This is a time for his voice to be the first and most important voice to which we listen and respond. Think about it: One person right now is changing the course of the world order in a negative and destructive manner. And one person, Jesus, can reverse that course and set us on a path of peace and reconciliation.

Third, Jesus and his apostles came down the mountain and continued on the way to Jerusalem. There is a reciprocal accompaniment happening here. The apostles walking with Jesus and Jesus walking with the apostles. We who know the promise of the Lord, "I am with you always," have the hope and assurance that we are not alone no matter what happens or how difficult circumstances may become. How and when the Lord will change the world is a mystery to us, as was his crucifixion for the apostles. Nevertheless, the reciprocal accompaniment will sustain us. We may have to endure hardships and persecutions, but salvation awaits all who remain faithful to the Lord.

My dear parishioners, may the Holy Spirit unite and inspire us in vigilant prayer for peace and transformation in the world. May his presence among us be a source of strength and encouragement in difficult times.

MEET OUR VOLUNTEERS: MELISSA FLORES

Every so often, the St. Gertrude bulletin features an interview with one of our dedicated volunteers. This month, we're highlighting Melissa Flores, who has faithfully and consistently spent her Sunday mornings as an office volunteer during our child and youth faith formation offerings.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Would you please

tell us a little bit about yourself?

Melissa: I am a senior at Madeira High School and have been volunteering with St. Gertrude's Evangelization Office since the summer of 2018, helping with Family Faith office tasks on Sunday mornings. I was enrolled in religious education at St. Gertrude from a young age and had my First Communion and Confirmation at the parish. I'm involved in a few school clubs, and I spend a lot of time participating in those, but I also love playing video games, writing, and cooking or baking.

SGB: What inspired you to get involved with child and youth faith formation at St. Gertrude?

Melissa: My mom used to help out every Sunday when she was waiting for me and my siblings to finish in class. When I finished

Confirmation, I started volunteering at first because I needed service hours for school, but then I continued because I enjoy it.

SGB: What do you do as a faith formation office volunteer, and how does your work serve the ministry?

Melissa: I do a lot of cutting papers, stuffing folders, and labeling, but I do a large variety of tasks in the office. I relieve pressure and mundane tasks from the higher-ups/adults so they're freer to do the bigger tasks. I have also helped prep craft projects, been a teacher aide when catechists need assistance in the classroom, helped with confession lines when priests used to hear confessions during class time, taken photos for First Reconciliation and for VBS, and helped with the Advent Wreath Making event.

SGB: What do you enjoy most about being a child and youth faith formation volunteer?

Melissa: I really like how it doesn't feel like I'm doing work or volunteering. It's more fun and interesting than that. I spend a lot of time printing and organizing pictures and worksheets, and I usually end up reading them or paying attention to the pictures. Sometimes I ask clarifying questions about the pictures and worksheets to start important conversations, learning different facts and stories that I didn't learn (or forgot) in the past.

ASK A PRIEST: THE PRESENCE OF GOD IN CHURCH HISTORY

FATHER JOHN LANGLOIS, O.P.

Today's Ask a Priest column is devoted to our parish Lenten Speaker Series. This 4-week series on the Presence of God continues on Thursdays, March 17, 24, and 31 at 7 p.m. in the St.

Gertrude School cafeteria. We hope you can come with a friend or family member!

Our second speaker is Father John Langlois, O.P., who will be talking about the Presence of God in Church History. Here is a short preview of his presentation.

Q: On Thursday, March 17, you will speak to us about the Presence of God in Church history. Is this a ploy to get a group of mostly ethnic Germans to hear about how the Irish saved the Church and civilization?

A: Brilliant idea! Certainly, Irish monks in the early middle ages did a great deal to spread the Christian faith and "save" Western civilization after various pagan barbarian tribes had brought down the Roman Empire in the West. Given my French heritage, however, I'd be more likely to take this opportunity to extol the contributions of the many French saints who have helped renew the Church in different ages!

But seriously, the real point of my talk will be to demonstrate Christ's fidelity to his Church, as he promised, until the end of time. From the beginning, the Church has faced numerous challenges, both externally and internally—many of which threatened her very existence. She has had to deal with persecutions, attempts by secular authorities to control her, the outbreak of heresies, times of moral


corruption at the highest levels of the hierarchy, and more. Were the Church a purely human institution, she would never have survived these various challenges. Human beings from without and within would have destroyed the Church long ago.

Yet we are more than 2,000 years now since the death and resurrection of Christ, and the Church continues not only to exist but to flourish. She continues to fulfill her mission in the world to preach the Gospel, despite all attempts to "bring her down." This is the case precisely because she is not only a human institution, but also a divine one, the mystical body of Christ animated by the life-breath of the Holy Spirit.

My lecture will explore a few key moments in the history of the Church where we can see that Christ's promise to be with his Church until the end of time is marvelously fulfilled: the early persecutions of the Church in the Roman Empire coming to an end with the miraculous conversion of the Emperor Constantine in the early 4th century; the Great Western Schism in the late 14th century, when the Church was divided between two popes, and no one knew for sure who was the legitimate one; and finally, how the French Church came back to life, producing saints and missionaries, after it had been completely destroyed by the French Revolution in the late 18th century. (Well, I did somehow have to work in mention of the French!)

Hopefully, the lesson of the lecture will be that, despite the significant challenges that our beloved Church faces today, we have a firm foundation to believe and hope that she will not be overcome by these. And the reason for our hope is Christ's promise, "Know that I am with you always, until the end of the world" (Mt 28:20).




