

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



OUR LENTEN JOURNEY

We have embarked upon our Lenten journey with the imposition of ashes on our foreheads last Wednesday. While many look forward to this time as an opportunity for spiritual growth and renewal, quite often many of us see it as a liturgical season to dread. We focus on "What am I going to give up?" "How

long can I live without whatever it is I am going to give up?" "How many more days before I don't have to give up whatever it is that I am giving up?" Who wouldn't dread a liturgical season with such a narrow focus?

Lent is a season of grace that provides many opportunities for God to heal our sin-sick souls. Certainly, these graces are available to us throughout the year, but the season of Lent engages our mind and heart in the ongoing work of conversion so that we may experience in our lives the dying and rising of Jesus. God desires our happiness—true happiness—which comes to us through the intentional response we make to God's call to conversion. His grace prompts us to welcome his word and his will as saving, renewing, and perfecting of ourselves. His mercy forgives our sins and restores a good and righteous relationship with him. Over these next few weeks, we are all encouraged to begin reflecting anew on the real purpose of Lent, the power such a season can be for us, and the real potential for a deeper commitment to our Catholic faith, and most important, a deeper communion of love with God. Such a deeper understanding could give us a new attitude for Lent.

Baptism is one of Lent's foundational focuses. At the Easter Vigil, the catechumens (referred to as "the elect") will be fully initiated as Catholics through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. It is no coincidence that on Easter Sunday, all the baptized will renew their baptismal promises. Renewing our baptismal promises recognizes something still foundational in our lives. Renewing our baptismal promises opens our hearts to God's grace. Grace reveals God's great love for us and God's purpose for our lives. This great divine love energizes our own love and leads us to a deeper commitment to

live these promises more faithfully. Easter is one time in the liturgical year for us to remember that we are baptized once for a lifetime and not merely once in a lifetime. Lent is the time set aside to prepare us to make that renewal faithfully.

As we begin our Lenten journey, I ask you to pray for those who are continuing to prepare for full initiation into our Catholic faith. Pray for Kayla Minton, a student in our school, who will receive all the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. Pray for Harrison Engel, Corey Longtin, and Timothy Shane who are already baptized Christians. They are candidates for full communion with the Catholic Church and will make a profession of faith, be confirmed, and receive the Eucharist for the first time. And pray for Ryan Longtin and Andrew Schuster who are baptized Catholics who will receive the sacrament of Confirmation. They will be fully incorporated into our parish community through these sacraments and be one with us in the worship of God and Catholic life.

The parish offers opportunities for prayer (eucharistic adoration, for example), sacramental confession, and faith formation and development. (Information is found in the bulletin and on the parish website.) I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunities and resources offered to you so that you may grow in your personal relationship with Jesus and experience the fullness of life in him.

The eucharistic adoration chapel remains open each day from 7:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. New to this schedule is the addition of overnight hours on Wednesday into Thursday morning. After months of recruiting, adorers have been secured for the overnight hours so that the Blessed Sacrament is never left unattended. Additional volunteers are still needed for some of the daytime hours during the week. Please consider making a commitment to spend time with the Lord.

ASK A PRIEST: THE ONE GOD, PRESENT IN SCRIPTURE

FATHER JOSEPH ALOBAIDI, O.P.

Today's Ask a Priest column is devoted to our parish Lenten Speaker Series. This 4-week series on the Presence of God will take place on Thursday, March

10, 17, 24, and 31 at 7 p.m. in the St. Gertrude School cafeteria. We hope you can come with a friend or family member!

Our first speaker is Father Joseph Alobaidi, O.P., who will be talking about the Presence of God in Sacred Scripture. Here is a short preview of his presentation.

Q: On Thursday, March 10, you will speak to us about the Presence of God in Scripture. Sometimes I am confused about the different ways God appears throughout the Bible, all the while remaining the very same God whom we believe in today. Will your presentation help me?

A: Is the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob the same as the God of Jesus Christ? The answer is, yes! Yet, he is different. Are you, as an adult, the same person as the infant who was once a few hours old?

The answer is, yes—yet you are different. There are biological laws that govern the development of the human body, making yesterday's child the adult that you are today. All this in the span of one human life that may reach 80, 90, 100 years or even more. Are there laws, comparable to these biological laws, that govern God's image in the Bible, a book that took almost 11 centuries to be written in a variety of places, times, languages and mentalities? To be concrete, is the loving Father of Jesus Christ the same as the God who massacred the first born of the Egyptians, as Psalm 136 proudly mentions? Worse: Is God who is Love, according to 1 John 4, the same as the God who, in Exodus 32, incited Moses to exterminate the golden calf's worshipers, who were from his own people? These questions and others may appear academic, to be left to Bible scholars to discuss. But they are not. God's behavior in the Bible determines, in a way, the faithful's behavior, since religion indicates a relation to the divinity that governs that religion. To behave in godly fashion, we have to imitate, in our own imperfect way, the God whose ways are perfect—God who is the same, from the first page of the Bible to the last, yet different.

FROM THE DIARY OF ST. MARIA FAUSTINA KOWALSKA



When some suffering afflicts me, it no longer causes me any bitterness, nor do great consolations carry me away. I am filled with the peace and equanimity that flow from the knowledge of the truth. How can living surrounded by unfriendly hearts do me any harm when I enjoy full happiness within my soul? Or, how can having kind hearts around me

LENTEN REMINDERS - FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Catholics are obligated to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. Good Friday (April 15), is a day of abstinence *and* fasting. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.


