## PUBLIC WORSHIP AT ST. GERTRUDE CHURCH IN TIME OF PANDEMIC

Updated April 1, 2021

"The Coronavirus pandemic, despite positive trends and widespread vaccination, is not yet over. For that reason, the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will remain in place at least for now to not unduly burden the consciences of those who have serious health concerns, either for themselves or for someone in their immediate care. Likewise, please maintain vigilance when it comes to wearing masks, social distancing and using hand sanitizer in church. #### HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES

- ${}^{\bullet}$  Keep a prudent distance inside the church. Ushers will help ensure safe seating on Sundays.
- $\bullet$  We ask that the faithful wear cloth masks for the sake of the common good. People with breathing difficulties and young children should not wear masks.
- Only friars, sisters, novices, lay ministers and a limited number of staff members will be in the sanctuary and sacristy.

#### HOLY COMMUNION

- You are not obliged to receive Holy Communion at every Mass you attend. Consider making a spiritual communion, or receiving at a weekday Mass.
- The faithful who choose to receive Holy Communion will come up to the altar rail, where one or two priests will distribute the sacred host. Keep space in line, and only remove your mask at the rail.
- You may receive in the hand or on the tongue, kneeling or standing. Note: the rail is a high-contact surface.

## WITNESSES OF THE RESURRECTION

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! On this Easter day the entire Church rejoices in the victory of Christ over sin and death; we rejoice that He has reconciled us to His Father who is also our Father. The

future for us is hopeful; the future for us promises new life in the grace of the Holy Spirit; the future for us is the gift of eternal life in communion with God. All sadness associated with human life and sin is overcome with the power of the Lord's Resurrection. As St. Paul says in a powerful and important way: "Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as [being] dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:11). Examine your thoughts; examine your manner of living. Ask God to help you live in the grace of the Resurrection.



Please join me in welcoming the newly-initiated Catholics of our parish. Those baptized and fully initiated are: Nathaniel Scott John Bosco Owens; Patrick David Augustine Miller; and Sophia Victoria Rose Henderson. Those who are entering into full communion with the Catholic Church and receiving Confirmation and Holy Communion are: Christine Carol Therese Bascom and Joshua Leland Jerome Moore. (Confirmation names are in bold.) They now participate in the life and sacraments of the Church, continuing their formation and growth as disciples of Jesus. The community of believers is a necessary support for these new members. The Church calls them "neophytes," meaning that they are young in the faith. They need prayer, fellowship, and encouragement to remain committed to the new life God has bestowed upon them. Why? Because they are beginning this new life amid a culture that is barely supportive of them.

A Gallup poll released last week "found that in 2020, 47% of U.S. adults belonged to a church, synagogue or mosque, falling below 50% for the first time in the 80 years Gallup has measured the topic... Gallup found that the decline in membership is primarily driven by an increasing number of Americans who express no religious personal preference. Over the past 20 years, the percentage of Americans who do not identify with any religion has grown from 8% in 2000 to 21% over the past three years" (US News and World Report).

"Among religious groups, the decline in membership is steeper among Catholics (down 18 points, from 76% to 58%) than Protestants (down nine points, from 73% to 64%). This mirrors the historical changes in church attendance Gallup has documented among Catholics, with sharp declines among Catholics but not among Protestants" (Gallup. com). These results confirm what we already know experientially. We all know family members, parish members, friends, and neighbors — particularly in the younger age groups — who have stopped living Catholic faith and practices.

As believers and disciples, we cannot lose hope. During the Easter season, the Church reflects upon the Acts of the Apostles. In these daily readings, we see the holy zeal of the apostles and disciples to share the Good News of Jesus as Savior and Redeemer. They used every opportunity to invite people to faith in Jesus and supported the early Church in their gatherings to hear the word of God and celebrate the Eucharist. We who have received the same Holy Spirit as did the apostles are equipped to live in the same way. Through our prayer, words, and actions, we show that God exists and wants a personal relationship with every person through Jesus. The Holy Spirit guides us in the welcome and hospitality we extend to all who come to our parish. God desires all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. (cf. 1 Tim 2:3-4). Our desires can be no less. May the grace and joy of the Resurrection make us effective witnesses within our parish. Invite people to encounter Jesus here.

#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**



The Archdiocese is recruiting Men and Women to be "Guardian Pilgrims" for the Our Lady of Fatima National

Statue Pilgrimage. Each day, Guardian Pilgrims will carry a statue of Our Lady of Fatima between 6-15 miles as they process from one parish to the next. Guardian Pilgrims will commit to specific legs of the journey which last from 3-6 days. We will stop at approximately 36 parishes and other institutions along the way. # ASK A PRIEST - WHY UNLEAVENED BREAD FOR THE EUCHARIST?

**Q**: Why is the bread presented for consecration at Mass unleavened?

A: I remember practicing for my first holy Communion with the wafers used for Mass, in their pre-consecrated state. They were disappointingly tasteless. I should have predicted this, but their resemblance to *Necco* wafers and other similar candies probably had given the eight-year-old me false expectations. Yet in reflecting upon this in hindsight, it seems totally appropriate for the Host at Mass to taste plain and unimpressive and (no offense to lovers of pita bread) unleavened. Why do I say this?

From His birth to His training as the son of a carpenter to His preaching among country folk to His silent death on the Cross, Jesus did not try to impress in the worldly sense. "Like a lamb led to the slaughter...he did not open his mouth" (Isaiah 53:7). It was not Jesus' mission to "make a splash" in the common political sense, but to win sons and daughters for His Father's eternal kingdom. As we know well from experience, what is sparkly and loud and stimulating can also be fake, a mere "front," a sort of mirage that catches the attention of the senses but lacks deeper substance. From the time of its use for the Jewish Passover as well as the offerings made by the Levitical priests before the Holy of Holies, the bread of God would offer an alternative diet to the foodstuff of society-at-large. Its being *unleavened* signified that it was different and exceptional and for-something-else.

On Easter Sunday, we hear the following excerpt from St. Paul's *First Letter to the Corinthians*. It reflects the tradition of the Passover as well as the Eucharist, Jesus' "innovation" on the solemn Jewish observance:

Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us celebrate the feast, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. (1 Cor 5:7-8)

The "matzah" bread spoken of here had spiritual significance: Those who would celebrate the Christian Passover and approach Christ's banquet table must be free of all pretense and duplicity, a "fresh batch of dough." Even scant traces of pride and other worldly vices could change the entire batch and "puff us up"

with malice and wickedness. These attitudes are opposed to the humble recognition of sin needed to receive God's mercy and true spiritual nourishment. Jesus, who emptied Himself even of legitimate claims to honor and glory and became "servant" to all, models the humility required of all who would be "fed" by God. The offering of unleavened bread in the Mass can symbolize this necessary Christian virtue.

Admittedly, the use of unleavened bread for the Eucharist is an ancient but not universally practiced tradition. Fr. Giles Dimock explains that the essential elements confection of the Eucharist throughout Church wheaten bread and natural grape wine. These remind us of the dietary staples at the time and place in which Jesus instituted the Sacrament of His Body and Blood. chose Jesus to use them and the Church dares alter the recipe! Both elements also possess



deep symbolic value, along similar lines to what we have already said. The use of unleavened bread in the Western Church "like Jesus used [at the Last Supper]" and the use of leavened bread in the Eastern Churches "to symbolize the risen Lord" both lead to valid Eucharistic celebrations. May we approach the Eucharist this Easter with thanksgiving and humble openness to the ways in which God would like to make us more like His beloved Son Jesus.
