Registration is now open for our summer 2022 and 2022-2023 academic year faith formation programs.



THE MONTH OF MAY

Today is the beginning of the month of May. For many years in the history of the Church, this month has been dedicated to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Mother. She always leads us into deeper communion with Jesus, her Son. She prays for us that we may grow in discipleship with the Lord who

comes to us in the holy Eucharist. She leads all her children on the narrow way of the Lord Jesus into eternal life.

We, the Dominican friars, have a centuries-old association with the rosary of Our Lady—preaching and encouraging the praying of the rosary so that all people can meditate on the mysteries of the life

of Jesus while holding onto the beads of Mary in our hand. It is a simple prayer, a humble prayer, a scriptural prayer, a powerful prayer, and a meditative prayer. Generations of people have found help, strength, and consolation through this prayer. Through the repetition of the basic prayers of the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be



(which many Catholics learned as children), we find that Jesus and Mary accompany us through all the joys and sorrows, highlights, and ordinariness of our lives. No circumstance or experience is excluded from their loving presence and compassion for us.

Quite truthfully, the rosary should be a devotion that is a part of every Catholic life. Popes, saints, and spiritual directors have recommended it for hundreds of years. The holy beads are not meant to be a kind of jewelry worn around the neck or a decoration over the rearview mirror of a car; rather, they are meant to glide through our fingers with loving attention to the presence, love, and mercy of Jesus and Mary. Learn the rosary, teach the rosary, pray the rosary! Through Mary to Jesus, we find every grace we need to persevere on our pilgrimage of faith, filled with hope that God will bring us to the perfection of charity and make us saints.

We have received notification that the parish will host a deacon for a summer ministerial experience. He is Brother Michael Donahue, O.P., and we expect him to arrive in late May and stay through the beginning of August. This assignment will be an excellent opportunity to learn about parochial ministry, develop gifts and skills in preaching, and contribute to the spiritual and communal life of the parish.

Additionally, we have received notification that a newly-ordained friar will be serving in the parish for a couple of months in the summer. He is currently Brother Philip Nolan, O.P., who will be ordained to the priesthood on Saturday, May 21, in Washington, DC. His arrival date remains unknown, but he will provide coverage in the liturgical

and sacramental life of the parish so that other priests will be able to take time for vacation.

Today is the last day of my pastorate here at St. Gertrude. Father John Paul Walker, O.P., will arrive on Thursday, May 5, and preach at all the Masses during the weekend of May 7-8. His process of on-boarding as pastor of the parish will be intense, especially with the schedule of first holy Communion, Confirmation, and eighth grade graduation. If I may say so, please give him the opportunity to learn names and the multifaceted reality of the parish. Please give him the chance to settle in and determine how he will offer his gifts and talents in service to God and the parish. Please allow some time before making requests or asking questions.

My next assignment is not yet known. I do know that I will remain here until the end of June. The Dominican friars are convening for a provincial chapter in June, wherein a new provincial will be elected and many other appointments to positions will be made. The expected assignment changes resulting from the chapter may influence my next assignment. I am trusting in God's providence for the future. In the meantime, I will be available to assist Father John Paul with the transition of leadership and help with the liturgical and sacramental ministry of the parish when requested.

I am grateful to God for the opportunity to have served as pastor of this parish. I am grateful for the prayers and support I have received. I pray that God will continue to bless this parish with his grace so that his light and truth will bring everyone into a deeper encounter with Jesus.

MEET OUR MINISTRIES: BECOME CATHOLIC

St. Gertrude Church has many ministries, programs, and groups for children, youth, and adults—some you may be familiar with and others you may not even know exist. To give you a deeper look into some of these offerings, the St. Gertrude bulletin will feature interviews with members of some of these ministries, programs, and groups throughout the year. This month, we're highlighting Become Catholic.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: If a stranger approached you on the street and asked you about Become Catholic, what would you say?

Become Catholic: St. Gertrude Church has a unique and powerful program for people who wish to join the Catholic Church! A succession of Dominican priests in cooperation with lay leaders have shaped a widespread introduction to the Catholic faith. Known as Become Catholic (formally Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), we foster "a process of coming to know and love Jesus Christ through the Church he founded and heads." We hold Monday night meetings September through late May/early June to provide adult non-Christians and non-Catholic Christians with the sacramental, spiritual, and theological formation they seek. Sometimes adult Catholics who have missed Confirmation join, too.

We have witnessed how helpful it is for inquirers to work closely with our priests and to build relationships with parishioners who serve as mentors. This helps candidates to know the right time to enter the Church. Every person has a unique situation and calling, even if the goal is Catholic unity.

SGB: Why did the name change from Rite of Christan Initiation of Adults (RCIA) to Become Catholic?

BC: RCIA is the name for the formal, liturgical, process whereby

non-Christians enter the Church, usually in the months leading up to Easter. At St. Gertrude Church, we still follow RCIA, but we offer Become Catholic as a weekly program that prepares non-Christians (who come to be called "catechumens" after their initial commitment) to understand and undergo these sacred rites. We also utilize Become Catholic to welcome fellow Christians and even some Catholics who wish to complete initiation as Catholic Christians. They may not need the full RCIA, but Become Catholic offers them a place to receive important formation on various levels.

SGB: You mentioned that you hold weekly Monday meetings. What do these meetings consist of?

BC: Our weekly sessions (beginning in September each year) involve introductory-level classes in Catholic belief and practice, time for personal and communal reflection and conversation, and prayer. They are usually led by a Dominican priest (a unique aspect of our program) who is supported by a lay team from the parish. There's no commitment required for the first several weeks of the program. Further on, inquirers are asked to share their intentions about whether they will or will not join the Catholic Church the following Easter.

SGB: How does someone get involved with Become Catholic, whether they want to join the church or be part of the team?

BC: Call the parish office and ask to speak with Father John Mark Solitario, director of Become Catholic, or fill out the interest form on our website at <a href="style="style-type: style-type: st

ASK A PRIEST—ENDURING CATHOLIC TEACHING

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Can Church teaching change? I've heard some Catholics suggest to others to "wait things out" if they're dissatisfied with certain Catholic positions. Although this feels friendly, I suspect it will sow false expectations

especially among young Catholics.

A: Older generations of Catholics may have talked about enduring their teachers (revered and feared religious sisters placed at the helm of over-full elementary school classrooms!). But for that generation, Catholic teaching and practice was "enduring" in another sense of the word: it was recognized as something constant, stable, and reliable. Granted, much has changed in a hundred years. However, current-day Catholics who expect the Magisterium to function like a progressive democracy do indeed set themselves up for disillusionment. True: the Church is always reforming herself so as to live and preach more effectively to new generations. This is a sign of health and life. But her basis is always the Gospel, and this message does not change.

The Gospel is first and foremost the Good News of Jesus Christ. He is the Son of God who became a human being like us, taught us how to live as adopted children of God, and suffered, died, and rose again for our redemption and eternal salvation. He commissioned the Church to baptize in his name, to do what he did and to teach what he taught. The sacred Scriptures as well as the Church's body of teachings and practice carry this Gospel as "coming from the mouth of Christ or being inspired by the Holy Spirit and preserved in continuous succession in the Catholic Church." The Tradition can certainly come down to us by different "avenues," such as through a specific

experience of the liturgy or a special apostolate with which we might be involved. But to take a cafeteria-style approach regarding the core beliefs of our religion misses the point entirely: God has come and has given us what we could never have dreamt up or given ourselves. Will we let him nourish us with the "food" he wants to provide?

Can some Catholic practices change? Yes, and sometimes this helps people better receive the essence of the Gospel. Can Catholic doctrine develop? Yes, because there will always be new insights to glean based on what God has revealed through his Son and entrusted to the Church. (And as the Church learns and lives through the experience of her saints, her moral teaching will be enriched, too). But will the Church reverse her teaching on fundamental questions of faith? Of morality? No. Catholic preachers and teachers may do a less-than-great job handing on these teachings at one time or another, but God loves his people too much to keep from them the truths they need for salvation. Jesus, after all, is the same "yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 12:8).

If you or someone you know is confused or frustrated about a teaching of the Church, *yes*, please do encourage them to remain Catholic! But help them to see the Gospel-principle at work in the teaching they find difficult, rather than telling them that someday it might change. The Lord may use this challenging proposition to help them see something they did not see before. And hopefully they will love him more for having seen it.




