A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION

ON THE BLESSINGS, JOYS, AND HEARTACHES OF THE MATERNAL VOCATION

On this Mother's Day weekend, I would like to extend my thanks, prayers, and blessings to all the women of our parish. Please note, I didn't say in that last sentence,

"... to all the *moms* of the parish," but, "... to all the *women* of the parish." That was intentional. As Pope St. John Paul II beautifully taught, *every* woman has a **fundamentally maternal vocation** and identity. At every moment of their lives, women are called to this maternal vocation in some form, though the way this maternal vocation is lived out varies greatly depending upon their states in life.

To all the mothers of our parish, I pray for you as you live out your motherhood in the course of family life, and I thank you for the beautiful witness you bring to us and to the whole world. While both fathers and mothers make great sacrifices in the course of their vocations and their responsibilities in family life, there is something inherently sacrificial about the vocation of motherhood that has no parallel. From the first moment of conception, a mother's body is already sacrificing for the sake of the child within. This sacrifice, lived initially as a purely physical phenomenon over the course of those first nine months of life, is then lived out in so many other ways over the course of the many years and decades to follow. Is there any vocation in the world other than being a mother that is so filled with joy while so linked to the cross? So whether you are a "new mom" celebrating Mother's Day for the first time, an "empty nester" whose children are long grown and out of the house, or anything in between, I wish you a very happy and blessed Mother's Day!

But today is not only about the "moms." I also pray today for women who are unmarried, or divorced, or widowed, or without children who share their maternal gifts with the rest of us in the Church through their compassion, service, and prayer. For those who are single and yet deeply desire the vocation of marriage and motherhood, I pray that the Lord might shower you with the gift of his peace as you await the further unveiling of his calling in your life.

And of course on this Mother's Day, I cannot forget the nuns and religious sisters of the Church—especially our dear Dominican sisters who serve in our parish school—who live a unique vocation to consecrated spiritual motherhood that greatly enriches all of us in the Church. You who most perfectly represent the Church as the bride of Christ witness to the joy that comes from drawing close to Jesus as the perfect Bridegroom and the greatest love the world has ever known.

Finally, I extend perhaps my most powerful promise of prayers to those who find today to be an especially difficult, trying, or even heartbreaking day. I pray for those moms who have lost babies from miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth, or early infant/child loss. I pray for

those married women longing to be mothers but who have not yet been given the gift of a pregnancy. I pray for those who have recently lost their own mother and are grieving that loss. I pray for those who grew up in difficult family situations, who never got to know their own mother, or whose memories of their mothers are anything but positive. For all those whose hearts are heavy this day for whatever reason, be assured we are aware of your heartache and are praying for you.

May our Blessed Mother Mary shower her special graces upon **all** her daughters, inspire them to further share their maternal gifts, and most of all, may she lead them all closer to her Divine Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.



ASK A PRIEST—PRAYING THE ROSARY WELL

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: How might I learn to pray the rosary more effectively? Sometimes the repetitiveness of the prayers serves more to distract than to aid my meditation on the Word.

A: Repetition: this is the dynamic of the rosary, perhaps the most popular Catholic

devotional prayer. Repetition can bore, but it can also soothe. It can distract, but it also can train our meditation on Christ. As with pedaling a bike, none of us wants to get caught up in the mechanics, but we hope to enjoy the ride and go somewhere. Learning how to finger the beads and pronounce the venerable prayers of the rosary is as important as learning to pedal a bicycle; memorizing and recounting the mysteries is like changing its gears. Once these skills are perfected, hopefully we're on our way—even if our spiritual "muscles" are aching from lack of use!

Why is the rosary so important? Why is it worth the effort to learn to do this prayer well? Shouldn't praising God together at Mass, reading Scripture, and praying in our hearts be enough? The rosary should *help us* to do each of these. It does this through making us students in the "school of Mary": the one who first learned to ponder

the mysteries of Christ in her heart from Nazareth to Jerusalem and remain faithful (see Luke 2:51 and Acts 1:14). Mary's meditation on the Incarnate Word of God was so deep and personal that she became the model and helper for all who would know and love Jesus Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls Mary the exemplary "prayer" and the one chosen by Jesus to support the entire Church in this way of adhering to God. The Rosary is an ideal "tool" for those who want to spend serious time learning from Mary. As a tool, the rosary ultimately should lead us to deeper union of mind and heart with Christ; meditation on Christ's life through the rosary should serve our contemplative, "inner prayer."

Here are some practical tips to praying the rosary more effectively:

- Frequency. Keep your rosary beads in your pocket or purse, close at hand. Hold them as you would hold Mother Mary's hands. Pray them frequently, even if only one decade at a time when you have a few moments.
- 2. **Use with Scripture.** The Bible gives us direct insights into the person of Jesus, the object of our meditation. A simple guide to the rosary, such as the scriptural rosary, can help ground our meditation in the sacred Word and give it a launching point to our prayers.
- 3. **Keep things fresh.** Here's a secret I received from other Dominicans: it's okay to make up your own mysteries. That is, even if the joyful, luminous, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries give us a beautiful array of meditations on the life of Christ, there remain many more facets of the Incarnate Word to contemplate. Use the rosary to meditate on any aspect of the mystery of Christ that moves you. Let Mary teach you to treasure these things in your heart.


