TWO WEEKS FROM TODAY: A NEW ERA IN OUR PARISH CORPUS CHRISTI CELEBRATION

Two weeks from today, on June 11, the Church will celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, commonly known as *Corpus Christi* (Latin for "Body of

Christ"). Our parish has a long tradition of celebrating this day with reverence and solemnity, as well as the custom of doing a Eucharistic procession around the church property after one of the Masses.

This year, however, our Corpus Christi procession will look radically different. After the 10 a.m. Mass, we will be doing a full Eucharistic procession from the church all the way down Miami Avenue to the city municipal building at the corner of Miami Avenue and Euclid Avenue. The Madeira Police Department will have a police car leading the procession and officers blocking off Miami Avenue and the various cross streets along our path. At the municipal building, we will have shuttle buses waiting to bus everyone back to St. Gertrude, where we will then have a big ice cream party to celebrate the feast.

The procession will be led by our wonderful altar servers, some of them who will be ringing bells to alert people along the way that we are coming. Following them will be the young girls of the parish, scattering flower petals on the road before the Blessed Sacrament. We will have an honor guard of the 4th Degree Knights of Columbus. Then the thurifers, followed by the priest carrying the monstrance and the other clergy, with the congregation and choir following behind.

In next week's bulletin letter, I will share a lot more of the logistics that everyone will need to know. What I want to address with the rest of this letter is: Why? Why not just do what we have always done and process around the church property? Why process all the way right through downtown Madeira?

The answer is simple: public witness. Our procession in two weeks will be a collective, public witness of our faith. A witness to our belief in



the True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. A witness to the fact that there are believers . . . many believers . . . right here in this community. A witness to the fact that Catholicism is not (as many would argue) dying, but is very, very much alive right here in Madeira.

My hope is that, as we walk by the store fronts, restaurants, and cafes, people gawk at us. My hope is they wonder who we are and what we are doing. My hope is that, even if they don't understand, they will nonetheless perceive something very important is happening. My hope is that our public proclamation of our faith might rekindle a spark in fellow Catholics who have drifted away from the faith. My hope is that our procession is the instrument by which God's grace will pierce the hearts of nonbelievers and make them think, "I want to be a part of that."

What we will do in two weeks will be, perhaps, one of the most important things our parish has done in this community for the 99 years we have been here. I hope everyone joins me on Corpus Christi as we witness to the True Presence of Jesus Christ in our midst.

MEET OUR MINISTRIES: WALKING WITH PURPOSE

St. Gertrude Church has many ministries, programs, and groups for children, youth, and adults—some you may be familiar with and others you may not even know exist. To give you a deeper look into some of these offerings, the St. Gertrude bulletin will feature interviews with members of some of these ministries, programs, and groups throughout the year. This month, we're highlighting Walking with Purpose.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What, exactly, is Walking with Purpose? **Walking with Purpose:** Walking with Purpose is a Catholic Bible study program that aims to bring women to a deeper personal relationship with Jesus. The organization by the same name offers personal studies and small group discussions that link our everyday challenges and struggles with the solutions given to us through the teachings of Christ and the

SGB: The Walking with Purpose study for the 2022-2023 academic year just wrapped up, correct? Tell us more about it.

WWP: The Walking with Purpose group at St. Gertrude Parish just completed its first study, Opening Your Heart. This was a 22-lesson Bible study that took us on a journey closer to the heart of God, helped us form or deepen a personal relationship with Christ, and helped us find answers to some of life's biggest questions through the context of the Catholic faith. The study incorporated at-home Scripture study (with the aid of a workbook that used the Bible and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* to support answers), weekly small group discussions, and monthly talks on relevant topics. It was quite a successful first study with 45 women participating!

SGB: That's phenomenal! Is Walking with Purpose open to all women of the parish, or does one have to have children in the school to participate? **WWP:** Walking with Purpose is open to all adult women of the parish. This first group was very diverse and consisted of single women, married women, widows, moms, and grandmothers and encompassed a wide range of ages. There were women who have spent most of their lives at St. Gertrude Parish, women who had just moved to Cincinnati, and lots of women who fell somewhere in the middle.

SGB: Many moms are probably wondering, "Is there childcare for those who have young children?"

WWP: Yes! Walking with Purpose provides childcare as one of the benefits included with the registration fee.



SGB: Why is this ministry important and necessary at St. Gertrude Parish?

WWP: Walking with Purpose is unique because it is open to women of all ages and life stages. Walking with Purpose is also open to women regardless of where they are on their faith journey. This blend of people helps build community and grows each person's faith in a unique and beautiful way.

SGB: Will there be more Walking with Purpose studies at the parish? If so, what topics/studies are you considering?

WWP: Yes! We have expanded the leadership team for next year and are already meeting to

make it the best Bible study that it can be! Next year's topic is called Keeping in Balance. We will journey throughout Scripture as we discover the relevance of Old and New Testament wisdom to our daily challenges. In this 22-lesson study, we will explore Biblical ideas for managing life's pace and pressure while living with calm and steadiness! All women are welcome to join us as we strive to achieve a lifestyle of health and holiness.

SGB: Exciting! The next study sounds super helpful and insightful. How does a woman get involved in Walking with Purpose at St. Gertrude?

WWP: We will host an informational meeting in August where ladies can meet the leadership team and other interested ladies, ask questions, check out the new book, register, etc. Meeting information will be posted in the bulletin and the weekly parish email later this summer. 

ASK A PRIEST— REACHING COLLEGE STUDENTS WITH THE THOMISTIC INSTITUTE

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: What will you be doing in your next assignment? Where can I find the Thomistic Institute at work?

A: Starting next week, I'll be reconnecting with an old friend, St. Thomas Aquinas, and doing a considerable amount of traveling to introduce him to others! My second assignment as a Dominican priest will look a little different from my past three years spent at St. Gertrude Church, but I think you'll be happy to know that I will be bringing college students and professors around the country some of the spiritual realities we live and breathe in our parish. This includes engaging young people at an intellectual and spiritual level, fostering places where they feel comfortable asking life's biggest questions, and helping them respond to the promptings of grace by which God transforms entire lives.


The Thomistic (toe-mis-tick) Institute is named after the great Dominican theologian, St. Thomas Aquinas, who is nicknamed both "the Angelic Doctor" for his insights into the mystery of God, the realities of angelic creatures, and the incorporeal soul of human beings and "the Common Doctor" for his ability to bring together the divine and human sciences into a common conversation. This brilliant saint models the faithful, scientific, and humane process of probing and discovery that should be part of the life of every Catholic student. Christ said in the Gospel of John: "If you continue in my word, you

are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (8:31).

What kind of work will I be doing with the TI? A large part of my job will be to act as a priest-representative to connect the 80 plus college "chapters" to the Thomistic Institute headquarters in Washington, D.C. This means visiting affiliated student groups at campuses like Ohio State University, Hillsdale College, and the University of Louisville. (Actually, the majority of TI chapters are at secular schools.) I will help student leaders determine and promote talks given by Catholic scholars about important topics such as the nature of truth and of God, human dignity and identity, science and creation, and faith in politics. The second largest part of my new assignment will be to coordinate retreats for student groups who come together to reflect on and pray through the truths of the Catholic faith for a few days with the Dominicans in Washington, D.C., or elsewhere. I should be able to employ some of the "shepherding" skills acquired here at St. Gertrude!

I will be grateful for your prayers for us friars and the lay professors and staff who are working with the Thomistic Institute. With the help of St. Thomas Aquinas, I hope we can lead young people and professors on college campuses to contemplate Jesus Christ, the truth who sets men and women free.

With Father John Mark's departure, we are expanding our Our Holy Teaching page to incorporate Ask a Deacon, Ask a Sister, Ask an Expert, and Ask a Theologian. 
