A CATHOLIC REFLECTION ON PATRIOTISM & MEMORIAL DAY

This coming Monday, our nation celebrates Memorial Day, a national holiday where we remember all those members of our armed forces who have died in service to our country. In many

cities and towns throughout our nation, the holiday will be celebrated with festive events like parades, outdoor concerts, and town picnics. Some locales may also celebrate in more somber fashion, with prayer or remembrance ceremonies for the fallen. Across the country, both municipalities and individuals will proudly fly the American flag to mark the occasion.

The celebration of Memorial Day is just one of several patriotic holidays we will commemorate during the coming months, with Flag Day (June 14) and Independence Day (July 4) soon to follow.

In light of these celebrations, I think it's important to reflect upon what our faith teaches us about patriotism. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The love and service of one's country follow from the duty of gratitude and belong to the order of charity" (CCC, 2239). Pope Leo XIII wrote a beautiful encyclical called Sapientiae Christianae ("On Christians as Citizens") in which he exhorted believers to love both their earthly homeland and their heavenly one. He notes that natural law "enjoins us to love devotedly, and to defend the country in which we had birth and in which we were brought up," observing even that "every good citizen hesitates not to face death for his native land." And on Memorial Day, we remember in a very special way those who indeed did not hesitate to face death for the sake of our country and the freedoms we hold so dear.

St. Thomas Aquinas also speaks about patriotism, situating it as an aspect of the virtue of piety (and thus falling under the larger umbrella of the virtue of justice): "Man is a debtor chiefly to his parents and his country, after God. Wherefore just as it belongs to religion to give worship to God, so it belongs to piety, in the second place, to show reverence to one's parents and one's country" (Summa Theologica, II-II, 101).


Additionally, Aquinas, Pope Leo XIII, and the teachings of the Church all make clear that such "love of country" needs to be rational and reasoned; an overly exaggerated, unbalanced, or irrational devotion to country is not compatible with our Catholic faith. Often such exaggerated love of country goes by the name "nationalism," though different authors will mean very different things by that word. The main point is that all of us have a duty to love our country, and to do so in a way that is properly ordered within the wider framework of the demands of Christian charity and justice.

So this weekend, as you fly that flag or attend that parade, know you are doing a good and holy thing. And most of all, please take some time to pray for those men and women who have died for the sake of our country . . . praying that they be freed from any stain of sin and

ushered quickly into their final, heavenly homeland—for they made the ultimate sacrifice for their earthly one. God bless.

ASK A PRIEST—JESUS' ASCENSION AND OUR HEAVENLY DESTINY

Q: What's the importance of celebrating the Ascension of Jesus?

A: The Ascension of Jesus is so important that in places where it's not a holy day of

obligation (falling on Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter), the feast is automatically moved onto the Seventh Sunday of Easter. This is the case in Cincinnati and much of the United States. But why the fuss, one way or another?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that Jesus' priestly action on behalf of the world is completed in his return to the Father in heaven. The Church bases this teaching in Hebrews 9:24: "For Christ has entered not into a sanctuary made with hands . . . but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf." Jesus' mission is complete when he returns to his heavenly Father, this time as a human being. The Son of God not only saved us from self-inflicted eternal death but also raised us to such heights! The Catechism says: "[In heaven] Christ permanently exercises his priesthood, for he 'always lives to make intercession' for 'those who draw near to God through him."

Like a good father, God isn't content with his children just "staying out of trouble." He has much higher hopes for each one of us. Recall the puzzling encounter between the risen Jesus and St. Mary Magdalene on the first Easter Sunday:

Jesus: Woman, why are you weeping? Whom do you seek?

Mary: Sir, if you carried him [i.e. the body of Jesus] away, tell me where you have laid him.

Jesus: Mary. Mary: Rabboni!

Jesus: Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father; but go and tell my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.

Like a loving father, Jesus offers Mary consolation in her moment of great sorrow. This faithful woman was chosen as the first witness to the Resurrection. But human consolation was not enough. Jesus conveyed a challenge to Mary and, with it, an even greater hope: "Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father." Salvation is about more than defying separation from those we loved on earth; it is about the promise of a life with Jesus and his Father that is yet to be had.

Isn't Jesus' ascension back to his Father unnecessary and a bit cruel? Wouldn't it be better for him to have stayed on Earth forever? To these important questions, I offer a simple thought: Isn't the process of growing up "unnecessary and a bit cruel?" And yet, who of us having survived the trials of being a teenager would deny the importance of making the journey to become an adult.

The risen Jesus offers us a glimpse of what it is to be, so to speak, a full adult human being *and* member of the Church. God has more in store for us than mere survival: he wants us to live forever with him as his beloved children. No longer sad or fearful. No longer weak or even mortal. The Church prays a prayer of hope and wonder for each of us on the great solemnity of the Ascension:

Mediator between God and man, judge of the world and Lord of hosts, [Jesus] ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state but that we, his members, might be confident of following where He, our Head and Founder, has gone before.²


