#### LIFE LESSONS FROM TODDLERS

Earlier this week, our parish hosted our second Moms & Littles Holy Hour. It was such a joy to see so many small children and toddlers there in the presence of the Lord. It reminded me of a trip I took a few years ago when I went to Atlanta to celebrate a wedding and stayed with close friends of

mine who lived nearby. At the time, my friends had two little girls, one 3-year-old and one around 18 months.

Spending the better part of three days in a house with two little ones and experiencing my share of "toddler meltdowns," I came to a greater appreciation of the vocation to the married life. I also came away with an *ever greater* appreciation of the vocation of celibacy! (Haha.) Watching (and hearing . . . sometimes from across the room, down the stairs, through multiple closed doors) a toddler in full meltdown mode is an amazing thing indeed.

As my friends explained to me, a lot of their toddler's recent meltdowns have been the result of a dichotomy that is, apparently, a part of every toddler's maturation process. She wants to do everything "herself," but many of the things she wants to do she simply *can't* do herself. So she would cry and wail in objection if anyone tried to help her, but also cry and wail in frustration when her repeated attempts resulted in nothing but failure.

What is a mom or dad to do in such a situation?

I don't know the answer to that (sorry, parents!), but in musing upon this parenting dilemma, it got me thinking that, when it comes to our own attempts to live this thing called the integrated Catholic life, many (all?) of us are in the same boat as toddlers. We want to do everything ourselves, but there are a lot of things in the spiritual life we simply *cannot* do on our own. Yet like stubborn toddlers, there

is a part of each of us that refuses help . . . a part of us that is deadset on trying and trying and trying again. And no matter how many times our tries end in failure, we somehow live the delusion that if we could just try "a little bit harder" next time, *that* is what will make the difference, and success will finally be ours. This can be true no matter what the "success" is we are seeking, from overcoming a habitual sin to growing deeper in prayer to rearranging our life to put God in the center.

During the Easter season, we celebrate in a special way the victory Jesus Christ won over sin and death. We recall how Jesus did what none of us, on our own, would ever have any hope of doing: conquering the power of sin and death. We celebrate how Jesus not only won a victory none of us could ever have won on our own, but that he won that victory *for us*, freely offering us a share in his victory.

So, the next time you are really struggling to take the next step in your spiritual life, pause and ask yourself if you are unwittingly imitating a toddler and trying to do it all on your own. And if the answer is yes, or at least closer to yes than you would like to admit, take a deep breath and, with full confidence, humbly ask the Lord for his help.

## ASK A PRIEST—DECLINE TO SIGN THE PETITION

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P.

**Q:** Is there a new threat to women and unborn children in Ohio?

**A:** As noted in the information from the Ohio Catholic Conference on page 4 of this weekend's bulletin, pro-abortion extremists have proposed a radical

"reproductive rights" amendment to the Ohio Constitution that will appear on the ballot this November—if they gather the required number of signatures. The amendment is so radical that it has attracted national attention, including a column in the *Washington Post* on March 31. If it passes, the amendment will:

- legalize abortion on demand in Ohio for all nine months, for any reason;
- eliminate all restrictions on other procedures, including sex change operations;
- eliminate all parental notification and consent laws; and
- eliminate any distinction in the laws of adults and minors.\*

Right now, the amendment is at the signature gathering stage. If you are approached to sign the petition to get this amendment on the ballot in November, please decline to sign.
