UNDER MARY'S MANTLE

This weekend, our parish has the privilege of welcoming the Our Lady of Fatima Pilgrimage statue. This statue is being carried throughout the Archdiocese of Cincinnati in commemoration of the Bicentennial Anniversary of the founding

of the Archdiocese. It is the longest Marian procession in the United States. The pilgrimage will end at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on the day of the bicentennial, Saturday, June 19, 2021. On that day, the Archbishop will re-consecrate the Archdiocese to Jesus through Mary during a special Mass commemorating the bicentennial.

Welcoming the statue this weekend is an occasion for the parish to entrust itself to the maternal love, intercession, and protection of Holy Mother Mary. I sense that we need her maternal guidance as we welcome back to Sunday Mass and other non-liturgical gatherings more of our brothers and sisters in Christ. She is our common Mother, who loves each of us as a gift of her Son. Her love seeks our greater friendship with Jesus and the unity in the Holy Spirit of all who are incorporated into His Body, the Church. The return to "normal" is a new occasion for engagement with those who rightfully belong to our parish family. The welcome we extend helps us to recognize and affirm the gifts and talents that God gives to each person for the building up of the Church.

Seeking Our Lady's intercession will also help our parish to engage with the Archdiocesan-wide pastoral planning process entitled "Beacons of Light." Here is a description: "Beacons of Light is a multi-year process of pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Groupings of parishes will come together as one faith community. These new "Families of Parishes" will be stronger, with the resources to focus more on mission than on maintenance. Through Beacons of Light, 50-60 parish groupings will become Families of Parishes throughout the cities and towns, suburbs and rural communities of the 19 counties in western and southwestern Ohio. Pastors and parish leaders will then plan for the future of their Family of Parishes." The parish pastoral team and administrative staff have been participating in this process for the last 2 years providing requested data and attending informational meetings and listening sessions. No specific information is available at this time regarding our parish. An initial draft of the Families of Parishes is expected in the Fall. All are welcome to stay informed

and to offer input through the free monthly *Beacons Update* at: CatholicAOC.org/Beacons.

As the Archdiocese crosses the threshold into the third century of its existence, the consecration of the Archdiocese to Jesus through Mary demonstrates her accompaniment with all of us to seek the grace and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Something new is on the horizon. As on the day of Pentecost, the grace of God will lead us in new directions, empower new efforts of evangelization, and unite us in the love of God. Holy Mother Mary was docile and receptive to the gift of the Holy Spirit in her life. Her "fiat" brought Jesus into the world. May her intercession enable us to welcome the same Holy Spirit into our lives. With this grace, we will be able to make Jesus known and loved in the world.

ASK A PRIEST WHY DO CATHOLICS HAVE TO GET MARRIED "IN THE CHURCH"?

Q: I have a family member who has never gotten into practicing the Faith,

but who received Baptism and the other Sacraments as a child. Can you help me understand why she should still be married in the Church?

A: Marriage has always been a complex topic, engaging very human and very divine matters in a way that hits close to home! When Jesus was asked a complicated question pertaining to marriage, He showed us how we might approach other similar situations (see Mt 19:3-12): look first to God's plan and remember that He can always work in hearts that give Him the space! You should be confident in what you know through the gift of faith, even if that generates friction with the *status quo*. The Church has been encouraging and supporting married couples for centuries and wants them to know the clarity and power Jesus wishes to bring to married couples and their families.

God created human beings with a definite plan and purpose. In the first place, marriage receives its "blueprint" from none other than God! Jesus confidently taught that marriage involves the union of a man and a woman in a permanent and faithful bond. He also seemed to suggest that the challenges we sinners have with marriage in our present time might only be resolved in view of the larger teaching about the Kingdom of Heaven (see Mt 19:12).

Marriage as a Christian Sacrament was gradually unveiled from the beginning of Jesus' public ministry: the wedding feast at Cana (Jn 2:1-11). Jesus was invited to a wedding where a couple made an embarrassing



oversight: there was not enough wine for the duration of the feast. At His mother's petition, Jesus was prevailed upon to work His first miracle, a miracle that launched Him into His public ministry and therefore towards His ultimate death on the Cross. He started the path to the Cross in choosing to help a couple who had committed a *faux pas* at their reception. He made plain water into wine.

The Catechism says the following about the wedding feast at

Cana: "The Church attaches great importance to Jesus' presence at the wedding at Cana. She sees in it the confirmation of the goodness of marriage and the proclamation that thenceforth marriage will be an efficacious sign of Christ's presence." By laying down of His life for His own Bride, the Church, Christ gave marriage sturdier legs to stand on and a much broader horizon (See Eph 5:22-33). The Sacrament of Marriage is part of the "something new" proclaimed by Jesus' apostles. This holy covenant is meant to help toward the healing of individuals and society based off God's grace-filled plan for humanity. All are to benefit from the Sacrament of Marriage.

Why must Catholics get married "according to ecclesiastical form"? Wouldn't any declaration of mutual love and commitment be enough? What if a Catholic no longer practices? To the first two questions, we should say that the bare minimum required by the Church for a valid marriage between a man and a woman (at least one of whom is Catholic) is rather simple: vows, two witnesses, and a lawful Catholic minister to receive the vows. A full nuptial Mass, however glorious, is not always required or even advisable. The ceremonial requirement, coupled with a sixmonth preparation phase is meant to grant the engaged couple the understanding and tools needed to contract and live marriage well. To the third question, I ask: why not have Jesus' and the Church's blessing for your marriage? The Church recognizes that people generally have a right to the Sacraments, as long as the request is reasonable and the recipients can be judged to be well-disposed. "Bad Catholics" need the Sacraments most of all; a designation which could apply to most of us to some degree! Since Baptism is irreversible; a Christian should strive throughout

his or her life never to act apart from this fundamental relationship with Jesus and the Church. Marriage, like the other Sacraments, is a grace-promising occasion to help men and women who without it would falter.

We cannot "do without" our Savior, especially when taking up one of life's most significant tasks: forming a permanent and faithful bond for the sake of new life and mutual support. Marriage reflects not only who we are now, but where God is helping us go all together. For all the

nerves and sweat it might cause, this is something that's worth discussing and promoting amidst our Catholic family members and friends. May God help us all understand and witness toward this beautiful mystery.
