





A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S . . . REFLECTION?

A few days ago (last Wednesday, at 10:57 a.m. to be exact) our planet experienced what we, in the Northern Hemisphere, call the "summer solstice," or more informally, "midsummer." It is the moment when Earth's north pole is at its maximum tilt toward the sun. It is the day of peak sunlight; after the solstice, the days start getting a little shorter and sunset comes a little more quickly. By all

astronomical accounts, the summer solstice is indeed the exact midpoint of the season of summer.

But it never *seems* like it is. I remember being quite confused about this as a child, when I first learned what the term "summer solstice" meant. After all, my mind was operating in "school mode," where in my hometown, school was still in session into at least early June. With June, July, and August free of school, it always seemed like mid-July represented midsummer, not June. From the standpoint of temperatures, the solstice seems "off" as well; in this part of Ohio, the average peak summer temperature occurs toward the end of July—certainly not during the third week in June! Now, most normal people would not necessarily lose any sleep over this, but the young, scientist-in-the-making Father John Paul was quite perplexed by this. But once I learned the reason why, it all made sense. And it teaches a lesson that is an important reminder for all of us.

You see, while it is true that the days right around the summer solstice are the days when the sun's rays are most directly hitting our planet, and while that would presumably dictate that those days would correspond to the hottest temperatures, the reality is that Earth is a big planet. There is a lot of air, a lot of water, and a lot of dirt. And so it takes a good long while—more than a month—for the energy from all of that peak sunlight beating down on our planet to really heat things up to their peak temperature. It's not a perfect analogy, but think about turning on an oven. If you put on the oven and set it to 400 degrees, it's sending max heat into that oven from the moment you turn it on. But it takes a while before the whole oven actually reaches the temperature of 400 degrees. There's a delay. The "effect" (having a 400 degree oven) is produced at some point after the cause (turning the oven on).

So why have I been rambling on about all this? Because in our spiritual lives, our faith lives, our human lives, the same reality is often true. We see the effects of our choices only after a period of delay, not immediately. Actions often take time to manifest their fruits. This is where the Christian virtue of perseverance is so necessary. If I'm not one who usually prays the rosary, and I pick up a rosary one day and pray it, it's unlikely my entire spiritual life is going to be transformed. But if I pray it every day, seven days a week, week after week after week . . . it will change me. It will transform my life. If I'm a parent and I encourage my children to seriously discern and ask God whether they might be called to a vocation as a priest or vowed religious, depending upon the child (their age, personality, and so forth), that invitation might not seem to have any effect in the moment. But perhaps years, even decades later, when the Lord is moving a certain way in their heart, they will remember that invitation, and it will finally bear its fruit. There are limitless examples we could consider, across every spectrum of human life. Putting extra effort into studying while in school, even going beyond what is "going to be on the exam," can pay off years down the line. Making the effort to invest your time getting to know someone from a different racial or ethnic background can give you a whole new perspective when, down the road, we see issues of racism and discrimination flare up in our community or our nation. Reaching out and saying a word of welcome the first time you see someone new show up at Sunday Mass (perhaps someone new to the area and "shopping around" for a parish) might not bring them back the next Sunday, but weeks later after they've looked at a half

dozen churches, maybe your friendly greeting is what brings them back to our parish for good.

While I'm not aware of the "rays of the summer solstice" appearing anywhere in the Bible, the lesson it teaches is very Biblical in theme. During the days and weeks ahead, I pray all of us can set aside the desire for instant gratification in our lives (spiritual or otherwise) and make the choices that will lead to true fruitfulness in the future.

VOTER REGISTRATION

St. Gertrude Church will be conducting a non-partisan voter registration drive after all Masses this weekend and next weekend (July 1-2). There will be tables outside (or in the Parish Center in case of rain) where you can register. If you are not registered to vote or have recently moved, we urge you to please take time to register and to vote in the upcoming Ohio special election on August 8.

Issue 1 is on the ballot for this special election. Because Issue 1 does not contain any moral content, the Ohio bishops do not take an official position on it. However, Archbishop Schnurr offers the following for your consideration:

"Issue 1 will increase the threshold required for any proposed amendment to the Constitution of Ohio from a simple majority vote to at least a 60 percent majority vote in order to pass. Therefore, a "yes" vote on Issue 1 will make it more difficult to pass any future amendment to the Constitution of Ohio, including this November's ballot initiative seeking an abortion rights constitutional amendment that expands and enshrines abortion at the expense of protections of preborn children and women. A "no" vote on Issue 1 will maintain the current threshold, making it easier to pass an amendment to Ohio's constitution, including the one coming this November on the abortion expansion amendment."

The chapel will reopen on Wednesday, July 5, at 7:30 a.m. If you are in town over Fourth of July weekend, we encourage you to make extra visits to the church for Mass and to pray, especially for the defeat of the proposed abortion amendment to the Ohio constitution.

ASK A DEACON— RESURRECTION OF THE BODY

Q: Every Sunday, we say in the Creed that we believe in "the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." What does this mean?

A: Just as Catholics believe that Jesus rose bodily from the dead, so we believe that we also will rise bodily from the dead at the Resurrection on the Last Day (1 Cor 15: 12-19). At present, we only know of two people—Jesus and Mary—whose bodies are in heaven. We celebrate their bodies going to heaven on the feasts of the Ascension and the Assumption respectively.

We know that the bodies we will have are our bodies, but what exactly does that mean? There is a bit of a mystery here because we can ask, "Well, if my body decomposes, will it really be the same matter?" Maybe, maybe not. Your body is already replacing cells all the time. The average age of all the cells in your body is only about 7 to 10 years. But it is still your body. So, it's not necessarily about the same matter; it's about it being your body.

Why is it important for us to have our bodies?

It is important for us to have our bodies because God has created humans to be composed of both body and soul, unlike the angels who are entirely incorporeal. Although our soul is not reducible to biological functions, the soul acts primarily through the body—they don't work separately, they work together. So although we can enjoy eternal happiness during the period after our death and before the Resurrection on the Last Day, we are not fully ourselves without our bodies.

What will our bodies be like at the Resurrection?

There is much that we don't know regarding what our resurrected bodies will be like, but Scripture tells us that those who go to heaven will have bodies like Jesus' resurrected body (1 John 3:2; Phil 3:21).

Most of what we can say about our resurrected bodies is based on what we know about Jesus' resurrected body. Think about his resurrected body—it still bears the marks of what he suffered in obedience to the Father. So our bodies will be perfected like his—without defect or sickness and not bound by physical limitations—but will still be ours and show the signs of the life we lived in those bodies out of love for God.

But what if a person's body is cremated and their ashes are scattered—will they have their body?

Cremation is allowed by the Church, but scattering or keeping cremains at home is prohibited. Why? Keeping them at home keeps them out of a cemetery, which is a place set aside for prayer for the dead. (Catholics are encouraged to visit cemeteries to pray for the dead, especially during the month of November.) As for scattering ashes, consciously or unconsciously, it signifies the dissolution of the person, it suggests that they have ceased to exist, that they are nothing more than a part of the natural cycle or "circle of life." Thus, implicitly or explicitly, it suggests a denial of the resurrection of the body. Whether someone is cremated or not, he or she should be reposed in a Catholic cemetery.

What about saints whose bodies have been divided into relics—will they have their bodies at the Resurrection?

In contrast to the scattering of ashes, relics of saints, though it is a division of the body, is precisely for the sake of treasuring the body of a holy person—a body through which God has worked powerfully, and a body which is not merely "matter," but is the body of *that person* who is already in heaven and who, by in God's plan, still works on earth. So yes, those saints will have their bodies. For further reading see CCC 988–1019.


