### NEXT WEEK'S CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION:

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

As I announced in last week's bulletin, we are beginning a new era in our parish next weekend with our Corpus Christi procession. After the 10 a.m. Mass on June 11, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament down Miami Avenue all the way to the city

municipal building at Euclid Avenue. We are so very, very excited about this public witness of our faith, bringing Christ's Real Presence to our city in a powerful way. In this extra long bulletin letter, I would like to share as many logistical details as possible so that, next weekend, the end of Mass and the beginning of the procession can proceed as smoothly as possible.

#### SOME GENERAL NOTES ON THE PROCESSION

The procession will be happening **no matter what the weather**, so please keep an eye on the forecast and dress accordingly. The procession route will be a little under one mile, so please wear comfortable walking shoes (even if they aren't your usual "Sunday best"). We will still be marching even if it is raining, so make appropriate plans for that as necessary. If the prediction is for sunny weather, please bring a hat or sunscreen as needed. Based on the pace that processions like this usually move, expect that you will probably be walking for approximately 30 minutes.

#### PARKING RESTRICTION

The circle drive will need to be kept entirely free of cars. There will be no parking allowed in the circle drive for the 10 a.m. Mass.

#### ORDER OF THE PROCESSION

Three groups of people will appear at the beginning of the procession, following the police car that will be leading us. First, will be the altar servers (cross, acolytes, torch bearers, and all of the other vested altar servers). Following them will be the young girls of the parish, dressed in white (or light-colored) dresses scattering flower petals on the road ahead of Our Lord. Following them will be an honor guard of 4th Degree Knights of Columbus. Then the canopy with the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the other clergy and all of the rest of the faithful.

#### FOR THIS YEAR'S FIRST COMMUNICANTS

Those boys and girls who received their First Holy Communion this year are invited to attend the procession dressed in their First Communion attire. Girls are invited to wear their white dresses and be a part of the group of girls scattering flower petals at the front of the procession. Boys are invited to process with their families, but proudly wearing their special clothing from their First Communion.

#### MINOR MEDICAL PROBLEMS ALONG THE WAY

At the tail end of the procession, we will have a van following those who are walking. If at any point along the way anyone feels as if they cannot continue walking, they can step out of the procession and await the van and ride the rest of the way. We hope to have someone with medical training on the van as well to provide minor assistance. (In the event there is a major medical emergency along the way, please contact one of the police officers who will be along the procession route, or call 911.)

### STAGING AREA FOR THOSE PROCESSING AHEAD OF THE CANOPY

Altar Servers: Those boys who are altar servers but not actually serving the Mass should proceed to the sacristy to vest *immediately after receiving Communion*. After vesting, they should proceed outside to the sidewalk area near the main entrance to the Parish Center lobby and wait for further instructions. All such servers are invited to *bring a bell from home* and ring that bell as the procession moves down the street to alert everyone that Jesus is coming. For those who do not have a bell to bring, we will try to have some extras in the sacristy.

Flower Girls: We invite all the young girls of the parish to join in scattering flower petals before Our Lord. Any girls interested in scattering flower petals should proceed to the sidewalk area between the church and the Parish Center immediately after receiving Communion. Every girl should bring her own basket from home for flower petals. (The flower petals will be provided by the church.) There will be moms (and dads) acting as chaperones and helping to fill/refill their baskets of flowers as we process. Please contact Michelle Dushensky, communications coordinator, at <a href="mailto:mdushensky@stgetrude.org">mdushensky@stgetrude.org</a> if your daughter plans on participating in the procession and/or if you have any questions.

**Knights of Columbus Honor Guard:** After receiving Communion, proceed to the blacktop area outside the entrance to the Perpetual Adoration Chapel.

### DIRECTIONS FOR THE CONGREGATION AS TO LEAVING THE CHURCH AND JOINING THE PROCESSION

At the conclusion of Mass, the liturgical procession will exit the sanctuary down the center aisle of the church. There will be a slight pause once the priest with the monstrance reaches the doors of the church as the beginning of the procession forms outside. Once the clergy have left the church, ushers will help direct the faithful to join the procession. We will dismiss pews of the faithful beginning with the front pews of the church and working backward. This will assure the most cohesive flow of people. Those in the main section of the church will exit down the center aisle through the back doors. Those in the Rosary Altar section of the church will exit through the side door near the relic chapel and join the procession from there.



### AT THE END OF THE PROCESSION: BUSSES AND ICE CREAM!

The procession will terminate in the parking lot of the city municipal building. We will have a table set up there with bottles of water for those who are thirsty. We will have shuttle buses to bring people back to the church so that no one needs to walk back up the big hill on Miami Avenue. There will be three shuttle buses, and they will continue to make trips for as long as there are people in the municipal building lot. If your child is walking with the altar servers or flower girls, please reunite with him or her before getting on a bus. Once you take a bus back to the St. Gertrude campus, please proceed to the gym for a festive ice cream social!

### WHAT IF I ATTEND THE MASS BUT CANNOT (OR DO NOT WISH) TO JOIN THE PROCESSION?

Those attending the 10 a.m. Mass who wish to leave for home after the Mass are requested to exit the church *only* using the "handicap door" near the front of the Rosary Altar. Please be aware that the Miami Avenue entrance/exit will be blocked off; the only way to exit the parking lot will be via Shawnee Run Road, and it will be impossible to turn left onto Miami Avenue. If you are not able to participate in the procession but would like to stay around for the ice cream social, you can make your way to the Parish Center and wait for everyone else to return from the walk (about 30 minutes).

### A SPECIAL WORD TO THOSE WHO USUALLY ATTEND THE SUNDAY 12 P.M. MASS

While we will still have a 12 p.m. Mass that day, we *strongly encourage* those who usually attend that Mass to select another Mass next weekend. Those participating in the procession after the 10 a.m. Mass will likely not be back before the 12 p.m. Mass begins, which means all of their cars will still be in the church parking lot and parking spaces will be at a premium. There will also be no music at the 12 p.m. Mass, as all of the musicians will be participating in the procession. Remember also that Miami Avenue will be entirely shut down between Shawnee Run and Euclid Avenue, and the only way into the parking lot will be the Shawnee Run entrance.

I can't wait for next weekend! Let us boldly and proudly proclaim our belief in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist to the world around us.


