## **'TIS THE SEASON...**

It is amazing how certain phrases become ingrained in our heads and can trigger an almost Pavlovian-reaction when we hear them. Who among us, when seeing the title of this column, didn't immediately have their brain start adding "to be jolly, fa-la-la-la-la . . ."? This week, I want to write about this topic—

but unless my calendar is off, you might be tempted to think I am rehashing a letter from five months ago.

It is not the Christmas season I wish to write about, but the "season" we have just been through in the last weeks here at St. Gertrude. It is not a season that appears on any secular or civil calendar, nor is it a strictly liturgical season in the Church. Rather, I would like to reflect on the present time as what I am calling the sacramental season.

We are just wrapping up a pretty amazing stretch right now. Earlier this spring at our celebrations of Easter and in the weeks after, our parish had six adults who received the sacrament of Confirmation, some of whom entered the Catholic Church from another Christian background and thus also received their first holy Communion. We had one of the eighth graders from our parish school receive Baptism, Confirmation, and first Communion at the Easter Vigil, to the great delight of her classmates and indeed our entire parish.

The weekend I arrived, less than a month ago, was the last of our string of first Communion Masses for the children of our parish, where around 70 of our second graders had the great gift of receiving Jesus in the most Blessed Sacrament for the first time. Barely a week after that, our parish welcomed the vicar general of our archdiocese here to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation for over 70 of our parish eighth graders. And of course, from the first day I have been here, I have witnessed long queues of people standing in line to go to confession every single time we offer that sacrament.

Just last weekend, several of the friars of our priory—along with all the novices—were present in Washington, D.C., for the ordination of 10 of our Dominicans to the priesthood. One of those 10 priests will be serving with us this summer and will have arrived by the time everyone is reading this bulletin.

We've had quite the steady stream of infant baptisms already this spring and have more coming up over the next few weeks. And the warmer weather finally arriving signals that the "wedding season" will soon be in full swing. As a priest, I cannot fail to mention the steady stream of requests that come in to administer the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, both to those facing series surgeries of various sorts, as well as for those who are in the final days of their earthly pilgrimage for whom the sacrament embodies the Last Rites of the Church to assist them as they leave this world for the next one.

Baptism. Reconciliation. Eucharist. Confirmation. Matrimony. Ordination. Anointing.



The full extent of the Church's sacramental life has been played out before our very eyes during these weeks. We are so incredibly blessed as Catholics to have the sacraments, these pre-eminent sources of grace in our lives that convey the very realities they signify and cause God's divine life to fill our souls. And, if we are docile and open to these graces, they overflow from us like a fountain to become streams of blessings to those around us.

I invite all of you to join me in praying very intensely for all of the members of our parish who recently have, or are about to, receive any of the sacraments. Let us pray that their hearts might be fully open to the graces the Lord wishes to shower upon them, so that we, as an entire parish family, might share in the holiness and joy of these special sacramental moments. ## **ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR - PART 1**

We ended this school year with grateful hearts for all that God had accomplished and blessed us with at St. Gertrude School. Over the next three weeks, we are going to share a list of SGS accomplishments for the 2021-2022 school year:

#### **School Accomplishments**

- We welcomed 34 new families.
- All St. Gertrude School English teachers (K-8) received certification in Institute for Excellence in Writing (IEW). SGS is officially recognized as an accredited IEW school.
- We offered four new junior high enrichment courses: Lego Robotics, Chess Club, Gregorian Chant, and Stock Market and Finance 101.
- We restructured Households into all-boy and all-girl groups, in which students were charged with determining the new Household saint and building their newly established Household culture.
- We introduced our "Writing Excellence" initiative, celebrating and showcasing student writing pieces each trimester.
- We held our 60th annual Christmas Pageant performance.
- We hired a full-time reading resource specialist.
- We increased our intervention specialist hours to full-time.
- We added four part-time classroom aides for our primary grades.
- Since 2020, we successfully renewed eight professional teaching licensure certifications, along with two professional principal licensure certifications.
- We had one acceptance into and completion of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's Aspiring Leadership program through the Catholic Schools Office.
- Two teachers completed master level course work and degree programs.
- We upgraded and streamlined our admission and enrollment process for greater efficiency.
- With support from the PTO and SAC, we coordinated and completed
  a successful school rebranding campaign, including a full St. Gertrude
  School website overhaul and new marketing materials.
- We obtained a \$2,500 safety grant through the Ohio Attorney General's Office for faculty and staff safety training and safety communications expenses.
- We updated our Emergency Operations Plan and obtained a score of full compliance from the Ohio Department of Public Safety and Homeland Security.
- We upgraded to a new security camera system and added 15 new security cameras throughout the building and grounds.
- We upgraded and overhauled our public address and bell schedule system.
- To better understand our students' abilities and achievement levels, we expanded Iowa Assessments to the 1st and 8th grades and extended CogAT testing to 3rd and 7th grades.
- We held the first annual Tournament of Books during March Madness.
- We met our \$20K fundraiser goal for the Day of Giving to Catholic Schools campaign.
- We provided five \$1,000 scholarships to families for the 2022-2023 school year from funds collected from the Day of Giving to Catholic Schools campaign.
- We selected Dimensions (Singapore) Math Curriculum with implementation beginning during the 2022-2023 school year.

- We successfully completed our second year with the Saxon-Phonics reading curriculum in the primary grades with overall positive growth.
- We finished outfitting all classrooms with interactive Dell Boards.
- We purchased a mobile chicken coop for our outdoor classroom and organized a school-wide spring cleanup of the classroom.
- The Catholic Telegraph magazine featured a story about our unique outdoor classroom space.
- We began an official partnership with Institute for Catholic Liberal Education (ICLE) and a three-year strategic planning and school renewal program, which will kick off during the start of the 2022-2023 school year.

# MEET OUR VOLUNTEERS: LARRY BALL

Every once in a while, the St. Gertrude Church bulletin features an interview with one of our dedicated volunteers. This month, we're highlighting Larry Ball, a parishioner of 24 years who is admired for his generosity, humility, and heart of service.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Would you tell us a

little bit about yourself and your family?

Larry Ball: I'm just a regular guy, really nobody special. I grew up in the Eastgate area—before it was the Eastgate area. I met my wife, Mary, in high school when I was a senior and she was a sophomore. We got married in July 1969, just six days after I got back from Vietnam. Prior to going to Vietnam, I was a corpsman in the Navy and ran an eye clinic in Seattle for two years. After I got hurt in the war, I was sent to the hospital and ended up doing opthamology surgery for the rest of my time in Vietnam.

Back in the states, I was a police detective for the Cincinnati Police Department for 26 years. My specialty was interviewing prisoners, suspects. I really enjoyed that. After retiring from the police department in 1995, I worked for three summers for the Forest Hills School District, driving the bus for their summer program. It was like being a grandpa for 120 kids, and I enjoyed it immensely. After that, I worked for a group of insurance companies for 14 years, retiring at 65—and that was 11 years ago now.

Mary and I have two adult sons, Dave and Jeff, and four grandchildren. We have been parishioners at St. Gertrude since 1998, when we moved from Anderson Township to the little community of Miamiville.

**SGB:** Wow! Sounds like you have quite a story! What inspired you to start volunteering at St. Gertrude, and in what ways do you give of your time to the parish?

Larry: Well, actually, my dad was involved with the Society of St. Vincent de Paul when he lived up here. When he moved to Florida, he got involved with Meals on Wheels. I thought that would be cool; that's something I'd like to do. Being a policeman all those years, I spent time in some pretty rough places and saw the more seedy side of life. And I thought, well, I want to see the other side. So I started trying to help people who really needed it.

At St. Gertrude, I've done some carpentry work for school. I've made tables, bookshelves, cabinets, and all kinds of rolling around shelves [for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd], and I fix things here and there. I put in posts and made a case for the Mary statue and the patron saint of farmers statue behind the school where the garden is. There are two atriums in the school—I made those. I made the platform, and the backdrop, and the little tables in there. I also made seven wood Christmas scenes for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd:

200 sheep, shepherds, a dog, a wolf, corrals, and all sorts of things. And I made eight wood sets of the Holy Land.

I also make various crosses of different sizes out of different kinds of wood. And I make Dominican crosses, each one taking about 10 hours. Some I sell, some I give away. I also make and send rosaries and crosses to Bishop Chris Cardone, O.P., in the Solomon Islands. Oh, I also made Way of the Cross over at the rosary garden. I didn't carve them, but I cleaned them, polyurethaned everything, built little houses for them, added a little cross to the top of each one, and put electricity to them so you could see them at night

Aside from all that, I was president of St. Vincent de Paul for about 17 years, and I enjoyed that tremendously. My son, Dave, and I are currently in the Knights of Columbus, and my wife and I run the rosary makers—we make rosaries and sell them at Mass on the first Sunday of the month. I've been a eucharistic minister at church for many years and hope to be a Mass captain again. My son, Dave, and I are ushers at the 12 p.m. Mass, and I take the Eucharist to the sick, too.

**SGB**: You're a jack of all trades! How did you get into woodworking? Have you been doing it all your life?

Larry: No, I picked it up when I was about 50. I was just kind of curious as to how some things were made. I'm self-taught. So I just got a scroll saw and a couple of other things I needed to make a few items, like bird houses and bat houses and things like that. And I started making cross when I saw a cross on the robe of one of the newly ordained priests. (You know, they carry a 15-decade rosary.) I thought it looked very nice. (It was from Rome.) He let me copy it, and I made it into three different sizes. From there I expanded and did the Dominican cross.

**SGB:** Aside from volunteering at St. Gertrude and woodworking, what other things do you like to do for fun?

Larry: We have about 1.5 acres of land—my little piece of heaven. I have a 60x60 garden, and I grow green beans, potatoes, tomatoes, zucchini, squash, cucumbers, radishes, carrots, kale—you name it. Every year, I have around 32 tomato plants of all different varieties. I have more tomatoes than I can eat, so I'll take a bowl full of grape tomatoes up to the nuns, and drop some off at the priory, and give them to the neighbors.

Other than that, I do things around the house (we're remodeling the basement, and I made a picnic table). My wife grows flowers around the house. I've been a fisherman most of my life, so I'll take my little fishing boat and go out fishing. And my brother-in-law and I go on a three-day fishing trip every spring.

**SGB:** Fascinating! Larry, it's been delightful to get to know you. Thank you for all that you have done—and are doing—for St. Gertrude, and thank you for your service to our country.

June 5, 2022 Pentecost Sunday

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the birth of our Lord's Church and the fulfillment of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The scene from the Acts of the Apostles is filled with drama, as "a noise like a strong driving wind" and "tongues as of fire" accompany the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. What was the effect of this outpouring? We read that the apostles went forth confidently, speaking in the many languages of the visitors to Jerusalem. In the words of St. Bede, "Now the Holy Spirit appeared in fire and in tongues because all those whom He fills He makes simultaneously to burn and to speak – to burn because of Him and to speak about Him."

From the beginning of time, the Holy Spirit has been at work with the Father and the Son on the divine plan for our salvation. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at our baptism, we are each called to be cooperators with that plan, not only for our own sanctification, but for the sanctification of the whole world. The Catholic Church is God's sacramental presence on earth, imbued with the Holy Spirit, given to us as a means for our salvation. All the resources of the Church – human, physical, financial – must be ordered to Jesus' great commission to proclaim the Good News of salvation and make disciples of all nations.

This is the purpose of Beacons of Light, to best enable the proclamation of the Gospel in our own archdiocese. On July 1, we will move on to the next major phase of Beacons of Light, implementation of the new Families of Parishes and the start of intentional pastoral planning within each of those Families. This planning will be rooted in sincere prayer and open collaboration as each Family together discerns the best and highest use of their shared resources to radiate the love of Christ and form a strong, vital community of evangelization and service centered on the Eucharist. There will undoubtedly be hard decisions involving sacrifice and loss, but which will bear great fruit in the future. This is the enduring Christian journey, one which needs to be offered up in prayer to God's providence.

In a 2006 homily, Pope Benedict XVI said, "in Pentecost the Spirit, with the gift of tongues, demonstrates that His presence unites and transforms *confusion* into *communion*." As we move forward into an unsure and sometimes confusing future, let us stay united as the Body of Christ, confident that the Holy Spirit is with us until the end of time. Please accept my heartfelt gratitude for your commitment to the flourishing of our local Church. May God bless and keep all of us as we journey together on the path of discipleship.


